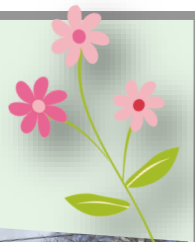

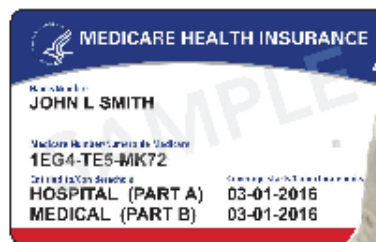

Eversource Offers Spring Tips as Part of Year-Round Commitment to Safety **Energy company reminds customers to call 8-1-1 for National Safe Digging Month**

Spring has finally bloomed, and the warmer weather may have people thinking about outdoor projects. But before planting a tree or building a deck, Eversource reminds customers to think about electrical safety and what's below before the shovel hits the ground.

"Far too many incidents involving accidental damage to underground utilities happen every year," said Eversource Vice President of Safety, Bob Coates. "April is National Safe Digging Month and we want our customers to know that accidents can be easily prevented by simply calling 8-1-1. If you don't call, you are putting yourself and others in danger, and violating the law."

Power equipment and hand tools such as spades, axes and picks can damage underground gas or electric lines, resulting in serious personal injury and disrupted utility service. Anyone planning an outdoor project such as planting a tree or shrub, hammering tent pegs or stakes into the ground, or installing a swing set, deck, mailbox or fence should always call 8-1-1 before digging. Homeowners and contractors will then be connected with Call Before You Dig, which notifies local utilities of their intent to dig. Professional locators will then visit the property to mark utility-owned underground lines with flags, spray paint or both, to indicate which areas to avoid.

For Eversource customers planning to work near overhead electric wires, it's important to call the company directly at 800-286-2000, five-to-seven business days before pruning branches, shingling the roof or painting the house trim. An Eversource line crew will cover the lines with a rubber protective covering to make the area safer at no charge, but customers should still remember to always remain at least 10 feet away from overhead wires.

The company also recommends these additional safety tips while working around the house:

- Check for overhead lines when using ladders to clean gutters or a long-handled pool vacuum that could reach within 10 feet of the lines.
- Don't let Mylar balloons become a party spoiler. Always keep them tethered and attached to weights because the metallic coating on these balloons can cause a power outage if they contact overhead electrical equipment.
- Never attempt to retrieve a balloon, kite or other debris that becomes entangled in an overhead power line. Instead, report it to Eversource so a lineworker can safely remove it. If using power tools to work outside, make sure extension cords are marked for outdoor use and rated for the power needs of tools being used. Also, check to be sure that cords aren't frayed or cracked. Damaged or overloaded cords may lead to electric shock and serious injury.

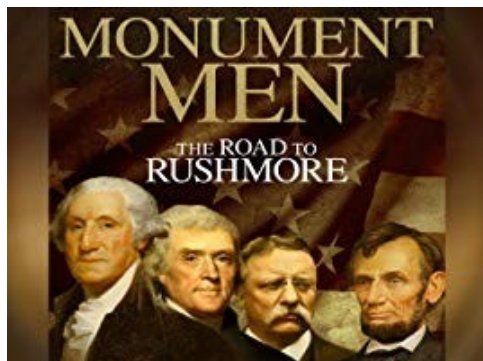

Monument Men, Part IV: Theodore Roosevelt



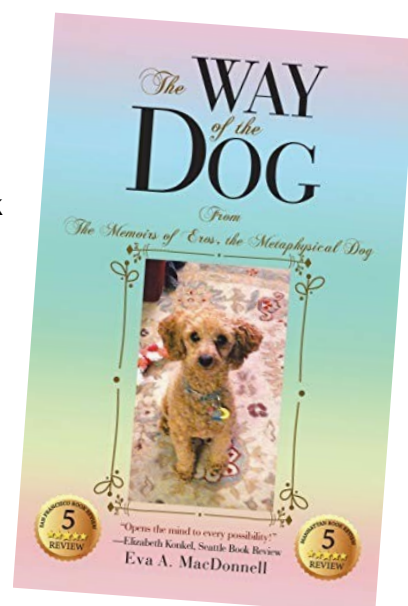

Author Lecture & Book Signing

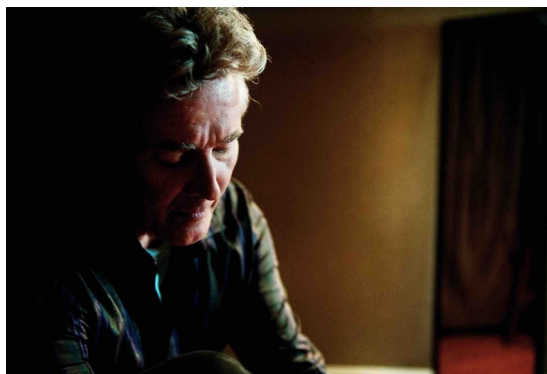

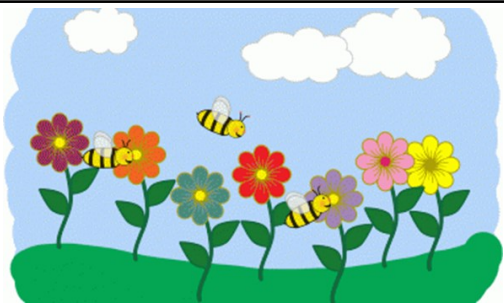

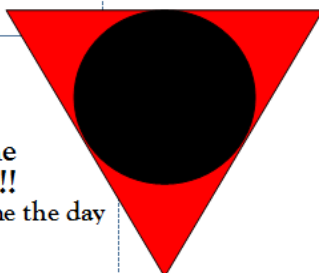

Lake Opechee Boat Ramp Closed Monday–Thursday through May 1

Eversource is improving the reliability of the electric system in the Laconia area. Work to modernize our Messer Street Substation, next to the Lake Opechee boat ramp, is on schedule and nearly complete.

To keep workers and the general public safe during the remainder of construction, **the boat ramp will remain closed Monday through Thursday, 7 a.m.–5 p.m., until May 1, 2019.** These temporary hours have been in place since November 2018 to maintain safe operations. The boat ramp will be open to the public during hours outside the posted closure times, as well as all day Friday through Sunday.

We'll communicate any updates to the Laconia Department of Public Works, and notices will be posted at the boat launch 24 hours in advance.

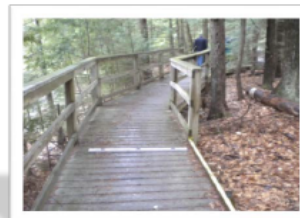

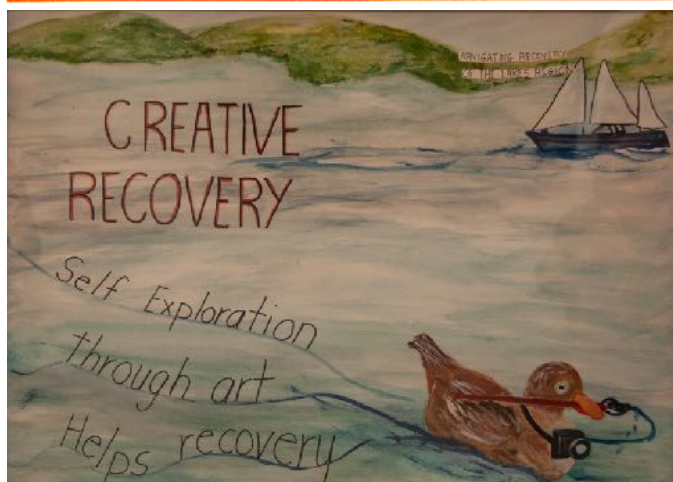

Description:

NH Periodic Motor Vehicle Inspection Seminar is a learning experience that combines online study of inspection rules with eight hours of hands-on practice performing the various tasks required to complete an official vehicle safety inspection and emission inspection.

Participants will complete an on-line course of study followed by two four-hour hands-on modules that start at 5:00 PM and end at 9:00 PM. Participants must be able to access the internet to open the Motor Vehicle Inspection course on CCSNH Canvas learning management system and complete the desk exercises before the hands-on exercises.

Outcomes: The successful learner will...

- demonstrate knowledge of NH State Inspection rules and requirements.
- demonstrate the ability to perform a NH State Inspection following a logical sequence.
- demonstrate the ability to check steering linkage and suspension component wear using a dial indicator to the nearest 0.001"
- demonstrate the ability to measure rotor thickness using an outside micrometer.
- demonstrate the ability to check headlamp aim using the CVA EZ headlamp aimer.
- demonstrate the ability to properly check tire condition and tread wear using the tread depth gauge to the nearest 1/32 inch.
- demonstrate the ability to inspect brake lining thickness using brake lining thickness gauges.
- demonstrate the ability to measure brake drum diameter using the Ammco brake drum micrometer to the nearest 0.005"
- demonstrate the ability to determine window tinting light admittance.

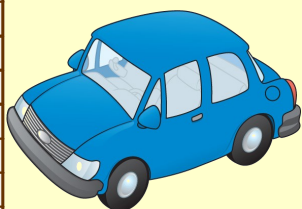
