



ZONING UPDATES

Zoning Updates Proposed - Public Hearings Scheduled

The City of Laconia is proposing some significant zoning changes as part of the Master Plan updates that were adopted last year. There will be two PUBLIC HEARINGS at the Planning Board on Tuesday, May 7, at 6:30 pm for those wishing to comment on the proposals. The meeting will be held in City Hall, in the Armand A. Bolduc Council Chamber, 45 Beacon St. East, Laconia.

The first proposal is to create a Consolidated Zone to include all of the traditional Downtown and adjacent areas and also the currently commercially zoned areas along Court Street, all of Union Avenue, and adjacent portions of Lakeport. Currently, these areas are divided into several distinct zoning districts, each with their own set of rules concerning setbacks, density, permitted uses, and even sign sizes. The goal of the new consolidated **Urban Commercial Zone** is to have one set of zoning rules equally applied to all properties and to alleviate restrictions to help drive rehab and expansion activity.

The second proposal is to institute a concept known as Performance Zoning in certain areas of the City. The idea behind Performance Zoning is to have property owners propose a use or uses for a property to the Planning Board, and if the Board believes it's a good proposal, the property would not be subject to many of the usual zoning restrictions; however, all environmental restrictions would remain in place. The goal of this proposal would be to help drive quality, innovative economic development in the City. Performance Zoning would apply in the new **Urban Commercial Zone** proposed above, and in the area including and immediately adjacent to the old **State School property** off Parade Road. 



The Kraft family and the New England Patriots Foundation are proud to be able to provide Patriots decal stickers for New Hampshire decal plates. In 2018, New Hampshire Governor Chris Sununu signed a bill (HB 1697-FN) allowing for the New England Patriots Foundation, an authorized 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, to officially create decal stickers that can be placed on New Hampshire license plates.

The Patriots decal stickers are now available for purchase. As you can see from the sample image, the decal celebrates the team's six Super Bowl championships. It also includes the Patriots Foundation logo as a reminder that all proceeds from this charitable endeavor will support charities in New Hampshire.



Please note that these decal stickers can only be placed on a decal plate in the state of New Hampshire. In order to use the decal sticker, you must first possess a decal plate, which resembles regular New Hampshire passenger license plates. However, they include a 3" by 3" blank square on the left side of the plate (see above image).

To order a New Hampshire decal plate, you may visit the New Hampshire Department of Motor Vehicles, your City or Town Clerk's office or you may fill out this "[Application for Replacement Plates and Decals](#)."

Please note that an \$8 plate fee, a \$15 new registration fee and other applicable fees will apply. Questions? Please call the City Clerk's Office at 527-1265.

Notice is hereby given that a public hearing will be conducted at Laconia City Hall located at 45 Beacon Street E, Laconia, New Hampshire from 5:30pm to 6:30pm on May 16, 2019, with respect to a proposal for financing by the New Hampshire Housing Finance Authority (the "Authority") for a project known as Compass House. The Authority intends to approve the use of \$1,080,256 in Affordable Housing Fund (AHF) monies as part of the financing for the acquisition and construction of a eight bed transitional house at 658 Union Avenue – Laconia, New Hampshire. The proposed \$1,080,256 project will provide affordable transitional housing to women leaving mental health and substance use disorder treatment facilities. The owner of the proposed Project will be Lakes Region Community Developers (LRCD), located in Laconia, New Hampshire.


The men and women who make up the band live and work throughout Central and Southern New Hampshire, coming from diverse professional and musical backgrounds and include talented local high school students.







Field of Flags to Honor and Remember the Sacrifice

The Laconia Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW), American Legion Post 1 (Legion) and Greater Laconia Ministerial Association (GLMA) are jointly sponsoring a **Field of Flags**.

The Field, located on the lawns of the Congregational Church and around the flag pole in Veterans Square, will be on display from May 25th thru May 27th, in time for Laconia's Memorial Day Parade.

3,936 flags will be placed by volunteers on Saturday, May 25th. The count for these 12"x18" flags was provided by the VFW, primarily derived from tallying names listed on Veterans Memorials in downtown Laconia. This includes people from Belknap County who fought in the Spanish American War, WWI, WWII and Korea.

There will be a **Flag Dedication Ceremony at the Field on Sunday, May 26th at 2:00PM**. The Parade will start at 10:00 AM on Monday, May 27th. Before the Memorial Day Ceremony at Veterans Park, there will be a brief reflection, prayer and time of silence at the Field of Flags. All flags will be removed Tuesday, May 28th and placed in storage for use again at future events.

To assist in commemorating those who have served since the Korean War, individuals or families are invited to participate in providing these flags. People wanting to honor or remember someone who has served or is serving in the military, are asked to make a donation of any amount in his or her name. That person's name will be included on a list posted at the Field, and published in local media prior to the Parade on Monday. **Deadline is Friday, May 17th to submit names in time to be included on the Field display and published lists.**

Local businesses and community groups are also invited to contribute to the funding of this project. Any organizations making a donation over \$150 will be noted as a supporting sponsor in local media as well, if they wish.

Once flag expenses are met, remaining proceeds from donations will be divided between the Laconia VFW and American Legion. 
