Warren Clement's Family Connection to the Titanic




The RMS Titanic was a passenger liner that struck an iceberg in the North Atlantic on her maiden voyage from Southampton, England to New York City – one of the deadliest peacetime maritime disasters in history. At the time, the Titanic was the largest passenger steamship in the world. April 14, 1912 at 11:40 p.m. with 2,223 passengers on board and four days after setting sail, she hit an iceberg. The ship sank at 2:20 a.m. April 15 and 1,517 people were lost.





Free Program Launched to Help Students Develop Academic and Career Explorations

Lakes Region Community College has announced a new program (PACE, or Planning for Academic and Career Excellence), designed for students who wish to continue their education beyond high school, but are unsure of their career path or college major. Many students graduate high school and want to continue their education, but are not sure what they want to study or what career path makes sense for them. "The PACE program allows for those students to continue their education, get strong academic and career support, and be able to do so at a much more affordable rate than at a traditional four-year institution," says Patrick Cate, Associate Vice President of Academic and Student Affairs.

The co-curricular program will consist of strong academic advising, with a focus on a transferable curriculum. Career exploration and coaching, as well as tools to help participants discover their strengths and work personality, will also be explored. During the first year, students will take courses that meet general education requirements, as well as courses in which they may have a special interest.

"With the rising cost of education, many students and families are worried about attending college without clear educational or career objectives," Cate notes, "And, we want to offer this program to those families so they can use their time and money wisely." With the transferability of LRCC's curriculum and availability of technical programs, students will have multiple options for educational and career pathways.

The program, which begins with the start of the Fall 2019 semester, is offered to full time students free of charge. Students who complete the series of workshops, meetings and assessments will receive recognition for their work from LRCC. New England Wolves Once Again Awarded for Contributions to their Community

The Eastern Hockey League (EHL) and the Eastern Hockey League Premier (EHLP) are pleased to announce that the New England Wolves have won the 2018-19 Humanitarian Award. GOT LUNCH! Laconia, a summer healthy lunch program that delivers healthy groceries directly to the child's home every Monday morning, will begin deliveries June 24th. **June 17th is the deadline** to receive the first delivery on June 24th. You may begin participating at any time throughout the summer, but new registrations close one week before each delivery date to enable delivery routes to be developed each week. The program runs each Monday through August 26th.

All Laconia school age children are eligible. Although our target population is those families who qualify for 'free and reduced' lunches at the school, it is NOT a requirement for participation.
