Question: *“Where can I get information about the City’s beaches, and how do I get a beach pass for parking at some of the beaches?”*

Answer: *General information about the City’s many beaches can be found on the [Parks & Rec website page](#). Beaches open June 22nd! Bond Beach is a resident only beach, and passes must be acquired from the City Clerk’s Office to enter. The cost is \$15 for one pass, and \$25 for two if purchased at the same time. Please bring your vehicle registration with you when purchasing your beach pass! This pass will also allow you to park at Weirs Beach parking lot for free, provided there is space available. 




**PARKING

THEN ...

Opening day, Sept. 6, 1961, at Laconia's Memorial Junior High School is seen from McGrath Street. The first group of students 'were awed at the size of the educational plant,' The Citizen reported. 'Debarking from buses at the main entrance they saw it lengthen out and practically disappear in the heavy morning mist which hung over the scene.' Fast forward to 10 years ago this week, May 25, 2009, when heavy equipment operators began tearing down the gymnasium and cafeteria building (at left) to permit completion of a new Middle School — the academic wing of which had opened, Sept. 2, 2008. Superintendent Robert Champlin said, 10 years ago this week, that the project to finish the new Middle School was 'about three months ahead of schedule and should be almost complete when school begins following the summer vacation' in 2009. ... AND NOW

Following site work in late March 2007 and foundations poured in early August, the three-story academic wing of a new \$24-million Middle School opened, Sept. 2, 2008. Demolition of the main lobby area and middle portion of the old school had occurred in July 2008 and completion of the new structure — now known as Laconia Middle School — was achieved in time for opening of school, Aug. 31, 2009. different parts of the city was, we think, the largest ever seen here on Memorial Day." In the evening, at Moulton Opera House, the Rev. Lewis Malvern showed more than a hundred Stereopticon slides, beginning with Lincoln viewing the volunteer regiments as they passed the White House on their arrival at Washington in 1861, scenes of battle on land and sea, etc. "Rev. Mr. Malvern has already received invitations to deliver the lecture in other places."

At Lakeport, Darius A. Drake Post No. 36, Grand Army of the Republic, marched to the wharf of the Steamer Eagle, and were conveyed to Bayside Cemetery, where they conducted their ritual at the Soldiers Monument. In the afternoon, exercises at the Odd Fellows Opera House featured Dr. J. A. Greene's "reminiscences of his travels around the world the past year, contrasting the personalities of Grant and Alexander, both conquerors, and giving humorous and pathetic touches of his war experience."

125 YEARS AGO (1894)
from *The Laconia Democrat*

Memorial Day was celebrated "pretty much after the old Laconia fashion. Ward 6 carried out its program very much as it used to do when the 'City on the Lakes' was nothing but a pleasant dream." Some day, "it is to be presumed there will be ceremonies in which the whole city will participate but for the present perhaps it is well that the old order of things should be maintained." The Laconia parade, with marshal on horseback, included the Laconia Cadet Band, "a young but promising organization with full ranks and a fine leader," playing "cheerful airs along the march." Company K "turned out with full ranks and made a fine appearance." The public schools had been invited to join the procession "and about one hundred lads and misses responded." With the carriages "for the Relief Corps and feeble veterans, the procession was much longer than usual, while the attendance of spectators on the sidewalks and at the cemetery was as large as we have ever seen.
