This form applies to the Low/Moderate income homeowner's property tax credit.

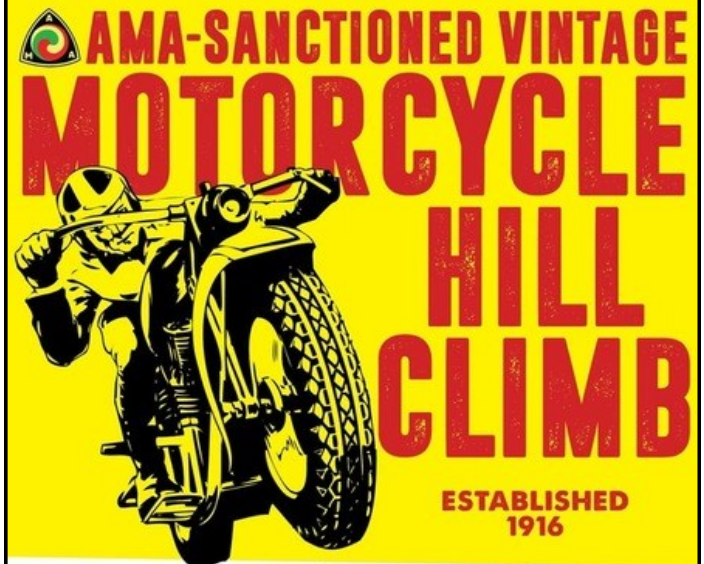
This program is offered by the State and refunds the State education tax portion of the tax rate to qualifying owners.

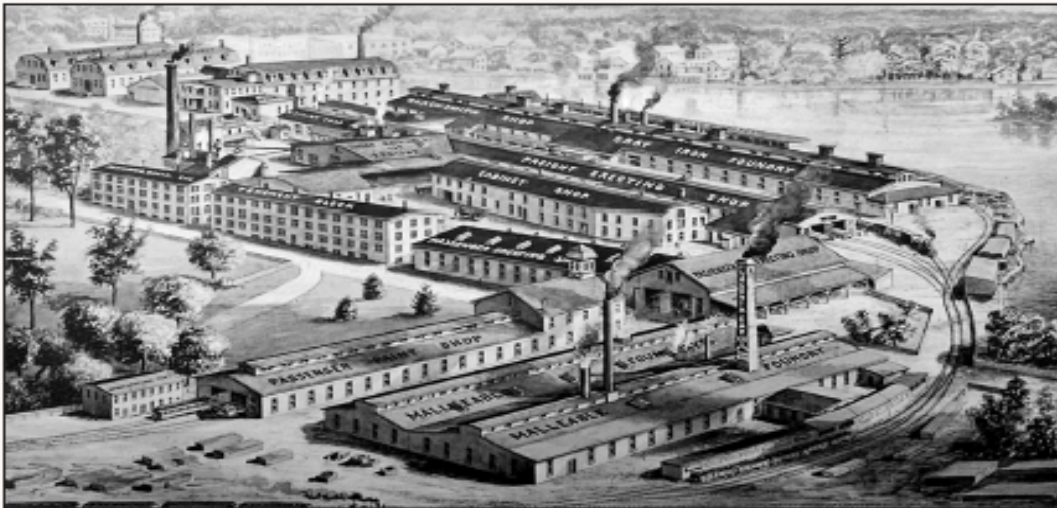

Our yesterdays

Our thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



Laconia Car Co. in the early 1890s

Prior to June 3, 1894, the Laconia Car Co. occupied both sides of Water Street, which runs diagonally from left to right in the middle of this drawing, with several of its buildings located between Water Street and the Winnepesaukee River. On that date, a Sunday, fire consumed the malleable iron foundry (foreground), the nearby passenger car shop buildings and several other structures. The blaze started in the passenger car paint shop, adjoining the foundry, and was discovered by a watchman at 3 a.m. Replacements for several of these buildings are located on Water Street today. (Town and City Atlas, D.H. Hurd & Co., 1892)

Fire, 125 years, ago destroys much of Car Shops

LACONIA — Fire had broken out in the Paint Shop of the Laconia Car Co., Sunday, June 3, 1894, *The Laconia Democrat* reported, 125 years ago this week.

Discovered by the night watchman just after 3 a.m., the flames had "already made such headway that the entire building was doomed."

Despite a prompt alarm and, within a very few minutes, the "entire fire department at this end of the city" on duty, "the flames spread very rapidly and jumped from the paint shop to the malleable iron foundry below and also across Water street to the setting-up shop."

Because of initially inadequate pressure at the hydrants, the firemen were "practically powerless to make appreciable progress in staying the headway of the flames."

As a result, the fire soon "enveloped all of the malleable iron foundry plant, both of the large buildings used in the construction of passenger cars, the Swift Beef Co.'s establishment, the Orville Atkinson tenement property and the two small cottage tenements and the stable owned by the Car Co."

The Lakeport firemen "could have been called to the fire much quicker if the new fire alarm

system had been extended to that part of the city as proposed by Chief Sanders," but once called upon, responded promptly.

Concord firemen "came up on a special train" and 30 men, together with a steam fire engine and hose carriage. "The run of 28 miles was made in just 33 minutes and the Concord firemen arrived here only a few minutes later than the department from Lakeport."

By this time, however, the hydrant service "had materially improved and the flames were under control, so that the Concord apparatus was not taken from the cars."

The flames got as far toward Main Street as the shoe shop building, by then being used as a tenement house, "crowded with humanity. The lower end of this building was damaged by the fire and the entire structure was drenched with water but the flames were checked at this point and a general conflagration on Main street averted."

Household goods of the tenants of the shoe shop building "were removed and scattered far and near; the police did efficient work in clearing the premises of furniture and carrying out the children."

At the other (western) end of Water Street, the fire was stopped

at the cottage house of Charles W. Stevens, which was damaged to quite an extent.

"The flames were checked at this point largely by the exertions of Geo.W. Riley, who brought up a line of hose from the Laconia Lumber Works and rendered excellent service by his personal efforts."

The fire "was a hot one while it lasted and attracted a large crowd."

The occasional "explosion of an oil barrel or something of that nature among the flames would send tongues of fire and showers of sparks far into the air"

But little wind prevailed at the time; that and recent heavy showers "probably saved Laconia from a much more serious calamity."

In addition to the buildings destroyed, there had been 10 railroad cars and 23 electric cars under assembly, all of which were lost.

While the ruins were still smoking, Manager Perley Putnam was "planning for the immediate rebuilding of the destroyed property."

Workmen "were engaged Sunday in clearing up the debris and a temporary roof was erected over the large ovens, which together with the tall chimney are left on the site of the malleable iron foundry."

Total damages were estimated at \$100,000.

PROPERTY TAX BILLS WERE MAILED MAY 31!

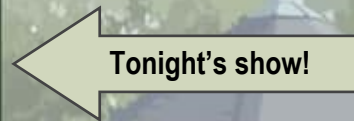
Tax bills were mailed on May 31st.
