The 96th Annual Laconia Motorcycle Week continues. Don't miss the last weekend of this year's event!



Question: *“Where do the City’s recyclables go? Who are they sold to, and what do they do with them?”*

Answer: Casella, the City’s collection contractor, takes the recyclables collected at the curbside to their transfer station in Belmont where they are mixed with recycling from other communities. The recyclables are then hauled by semi-truck to their material reuse facility (MRF) in Charleston, Massachusetts to be sorted. Any contaminants are sent to a landfill and the various recyclable products are then sold to buyers who reuse the material. Recyclable products are a commodity, and different buyers may purchase the material from Casella. Corrugated cardboard brought to the City’s compactor on Messer Street is taken to a salvage firm who then sells the product to buyers.







REVERSE ANGLE PARKING



There is a new way to park in certain areas of downtown Laconia!

With the new parking style called reverse angle parking or back-in parking, you will back into a space so that the front of your car is facing the street. This method has been used across the country. Reverse angle parking will be coming soon to Beacon Street East and Beacon Street West!

Benefits of Reverse Angle Parking

Improved Driver Visibility:

- When leaving a parking space, drivers are facing forward allowing a better view of traffic and cyclists.
- Drivers do not have to back into traffic blindly when leaving. This makes departures safer, quicker and easier.

Accessible Parking and Curb Ramps

- Accessible parking spaces are provided with direct access to the sidewalk.
- Wheelchair users can load/unload from the vehicle's side or rear, away from the traffic lane.

Easier Loading/Unloading:

- When vehicle doors are open, they block pedestrian access to the travel lane and guide them back to the sidewalk.
- The vehicle's trunk is accessed from the sidewalk, making it safer and more convenient to load/unload items.

Traffic Calming


- On-street parking visually narrows the roadway lane width, contributing to slower speeds and enhancing driver alertness.


- Signal a right turn to warn other drivers.

Caution! Change in Traffic Pattern



The DPW will be changing the travel lanes and parking spaces on Beacon St. East and West in late June. The changes are limited to the marked areas shown on the map. The travel lanes in this area will be reduced to a single lane and the parallel parking will be changed to reverse angle parking (see previous page). The single travel lane will create a “traffic calming effect” and result in slower speeds. The reverse angle parking increases the available parking spaces in this busy downtown area. Public Works will have signs in the area before and after the traffic pattern changes are made. Please be alert while drivers become accustomed to the change!



PARKING ENFORCEMENT IN WEIRS BEACH

Summer is almost upon us, and vehicles parking in the public parking spaces on Lakeside Avenue and in the Endicott Rock Parking Lot must now pay to use the parking spaces. Parking in this area is “pay by space”. Please ensure that you know your parking space number when you leave your car as the parking kiosks will ask for that information.







Changes over the past three and a half decades include a new 'station' (obscured by the crowd, in distance at right) for the Winnipesaukee Flagship Corp., built in 1987 to replace the 1940 art deco building erected by the railroad after the 1939 fire that also destroyed the Steamer Mount Washington. Nearly two years after floodwaters washed part of the boardwalk into Lake Winnipesaukee, Aug. 7, 2008, a new section was reopened in May 2010.
