

REVERSE ANGLE PARKING



There is a new way to park in certain areas of downtown Laconia!

With the new parking style called reverse angle parking or back-in parking, you will back into a space so that the front of your car is facing the street. This method has been used across the country. Reverse angle parking will be coming soon to Beacon Street East and Beacon Street West!

Benefits of Reverse Angle Parking

Improved Driver Visibility:

- When leaving a parking space, drivers are facing forward allowing a better view of traffic and cyclists.
- Drivers do not have to back into traffic blindly when leaving. This makes departures safer, quicker and easier.

Accessible Parking and Curb Ramps

- Accessible parking spaces are provided with direct access to the sidewalk.
- Wheelchair users can load/unload from the vehicle's side or rear, away from the traffic lane.

Easier Loading/Unloading:

- When vehicle doors are open, they block pedestrian access to the travel lane and guide them back to the sidewalk.
- The vehicle's trunk is accessed from the sidewalk, making it safer and more convenient to load/unload items.

Traffic Calming

- On-street parking visually narrows the roadway lane width, contributing to slower speeds and enhancing driver alertness.

1 2 3

How does it work?

Just like parallel parking:

- Signal a right turn to warn other drivers.
- Pull past the parking spot and stop.
- Reverse into the parking spot.



Caution! Change in Traffic Pattern


Work begins on July 1st!



The DPW will be changing the travel lanes and parking spaces on Beacon St. East and West! The changes are limited to the marked areas shown on the map. The travel lanes in this area will be reduced to a single lane and the parallel parking will be changed to reverse angle parking (see previous page). The single travel lane will create a "traffic calming effect" and result in slower speeds. The reverse angle parking increases the available parking spaces in this busy downtown area. Public Works will have signs in the area before and after the traffic pattern changes are made. Please be alert while drivers become accustomed to the change!



GOT LUNCH! LACONIA

GOT LUNCH! Laconia kicks off year 9 with support from Mayor Ed Engler and City Manager Scott Myers

It's hard to believe but GOT LUNCH! Laconia kicked off year **nine** of delivering healthy groceries to children's homes in Laconia this past Monday morning. Mayor Ed Engler and City Manager Scott Myers came to encourage the over 80 volunteers who worked on Monday morning.



Laconia continues to have around 60% of the children in our community living with food insecurity. Where will the next meal come from, is the question for too many children. GOT LUNCH! Laconia answers that question for children and families sending a clear message to them that this community cares.

Last year there were over 240 volunteers who purchased, transported, packed and delivered healthy groceries to the children's door. The Lakes Region Agricultural Collaborative partners with the program delivering farm fresh picked vegetables purchased at the lowest prices directly to the delivery site early Monday mornings. VISTA Foods helps out in more ways than can be described; discounted fruits and bread; storage of the items until GOT LUNCH! Laconia is ready to pick them up; the management of the Dairy Voucher part of the program that provides a Dairy Voucher valuing \$6 to families so they can purchase dairy products; eggs, milk, cheese and yogurt. The Laconia School District helps get the message out to the families that it's registration time and they support the program in other ways as well.

There is so much support for this program in the community it's amazing. Besides Mayor Ed Engler and Scott Myers, Bob Fitzpatrick from VISTA Foods, two members of the Muskrats Baseball Team, employees of Penny Pitou, and Westcott Law sent over volunteers as well. All of these folks helped to kick off year 9. If you have never seen this program in action come to the Congregational Church of Laconia – 18 Veteran's Square, any Monday morning through August 26th at 8:15 am and see the magic happen. Over 70 volunteers working together to bring nutritional food to the kids of Laconia. Thanks to all who make this program happen!

LAKES REGION SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION



The Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation has worked hard preparing for the annual awards ceremonies at each of the local high schools. Each spring the Board members review hundreds of applications received by the office. Then, at the end of May, the over 125 donor representatives come in and recommend the candidates to receive their scholarships. The next step is to have a couple of members of the LRSF Board attend the local high school award ceremonies held prior to graduation and awards are announced.

Donna Hennessey, LRSF Board President, commented "This idea, conceived by a small group of citizens and supported by just eight local civic groups and businesses back in 1956, blossomed into the remarkable organization we have today. From that small start in 1956, with awards totaling just \$2,650 to sixteen recipients from eight donors, we have grown so that this year we will be awarding over \$420,000 to 297 local students from 269 donor funds!" Donna continued that "all this help and money for our local students comes, thanks to the generosity of over 580 donors over the past 64 years. The Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation has given about \$6.7 million dollars to close to 5,000 recipients over the years. We are the conduit which facilitates the generous giving for all of these donors and monies."

Executive Director, Paulette Loughlin added "So many of our scholarship funds are memorials set up by families when a loved one passes or by individuals in advance of their death. Each memorial tells the story of a special person. Someone who is no longer with us, but is still helping those they have left behind. Other scholarship funds come from civic groups and area businesses, all investing in the youth of our local communities. In addition, there are the thousands who have contributed to specific memorial funds or special fundraisers. We are so grateful to all our donors who deserve the credit for this proud record of supporting college-bound students and we congratulate this year's recipients." Yet the safety standards set by federal regulatory agencies are outdated. New wireless devices such as smartphones, tablets and baby monitors to the latest "Internet of Things" continue to enter the market without any proper pre-market testing or post-market monitoring.

THEN . . .

The Clow Sisters 12-Room Gift House was a landmark at 678 Union Ave., Laconia, from the early 1930s to around 1965. Founded by Bessie L. Clow, Anne E. Clow (Mrs. Wayne M. Plummer) and Ines Clow Tyler in 1917, first located in the Moulton Opera House Block, then the McIntyre Block and later the Baldi Block in the Downtown section, the partnership was dissolved in 1919 but Mrs. Tyler continued the business — in Kennebunkport, Maine, for 12 years and later here at the old Rufus Dow house — retaining the sisters' trademark triangle sign, proclaiming 'gifts' — from 1935 to around 1950, when she sold the business. A serious fire damaged the building, Jan. 18, 1948, destroying a large barn and the Tyler Sign Shop in the rear. . . . AND NOW

The Gift House was repaired within a few months and a new section added at the rear. Mrs. Tyler reopened and continued operations for a couple of years but, beginning in the early 1950s, the owners were Carroll A. and Mrs. Kathie S. Lamprey, who were 'open from May to December 24th' with 'mail orders sent.' By 1962, the owners were Paul W. and Margarite C. Roberts. The site is now part of the Belknap Tire Co. parking lot. By the late 1960s, the gift shop business and building were gone. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)



DP-8 forms are now available in the Assessing Office, or on-line at www.revenue.nh.gov. The deadline for filing is June 30.

This form applies to the Low/Moderate income homeowner's property tax credit. This program is offered by the State and refunds the State education tax portion of the tax rate to qualifying owners. Call the Assessing Office at 527-1268 with questions or for additional information.


