



The Bear Brook Murders: Stories from Behind the Scenes Tuesday, October 8, 6:30 pm, Laconia Rotary Hall



In 1985, a hunter discovered a barrel containing two unidentified bodies near Bear Brook State Park in Allenstown, NH. In 2000, the discovery of a second barrel with two more unidentified bodies opened up more questions and renewed interest in the investigation. Years passed before the killer was finally revealed through a powerful investigative technique based on genetic genealogy.

Join NH Public Radio's Jason Moon—host and reporter for the Bear Brook podcast—for this special presentation offering behind the scenes perspectives on the long-running investigation, and the role of forensic technology in solving the crimes. The evening will also include developments from the startling breaks in the case this past June and reflections on key players affiliated with the investigation.





Holiday Season Success

- Remember that these holidays are about more than just food.
- It's not about an all-or-nothing attitude; enjoy a few pieces of candy on Halloween or a dessert on Thanksgiving, but it doesn't have to be ALL the foods ALL the time.
- It's okay to indulge occasionally, but have a dessert if you **REALLY** want it, not because it's there.
- Try bringing a healthier entrée or dessert to a holiday party to share.
- Focus on the bounty of delicious (and nutritious) seasonal fruits and vegetables: butternut squash, pumpkin, sweet potatoes, kale, pomegranate, grapefruit, apples, Swiss chard, Brussels sprouts, cauliflower, etc.
- Be mindful of how hungry/full you are - it's not a requirement to eat until you're stuffed or eat something if you're not truly hungry.
- Enjoy good food slowly by truly tasting and savoring the flavors, you may find you're satisfied with less.
- Include exercise, not as a punishment or because it burns off calories, but because it helps your metabolism, increases energy, and keep your mood up while keeping stress down!
- Focus on your goals and ask yourself if certain foods or behaviors will either help or hinder your success.

GARLIC PARMESAN ROASTED PUMPKIN SEEDS

Ingredients:

- 2 CUPS PUMPKIN SEEDS
- 1/2 TEASPOON SALT
- 1/3 CUP GRATED PARMESAN CHEESE
- 1 EGG WHITE, BEATEN UNTIL FROTHY
- 1 TEASPOON GARLIC POWDER

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Preheat oven to 300 degrees F.
- Spread pumpkin seeds in one layer on a large rimmed baking sheet. Toast, stirring once, for 40 minutes.
- Meanwhile, combine parmesan, garlic powder and salt in a small bowl. Remove the pumpkin seeds from the oven and carefully transfer to a medium bowl. Pour egg white over the pumpkin seeds and stir to coat. Sprinkle parmesan mixture over the pumpkin seeds and stir to coat. Return the pumpkin seeds to the baking sheet; spread in an even layer. Bake until lightly browned, 10-15 minutes more. Cool completely before serving.

Our yesterdays

Our thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN...

Sanders Brick Block, long a landmark on the west side of Main Street, Laconia, was built by Samuel W. Sanders (1819-1892), a merchant dealing in stoves and tinware, after the Great Fire of 1860 had burned out his previous shop and store. The building was later home to the Smith Variety Store, which James S. Smith sold to the Albee Philbrook Syndicate, 100 years ago this week — and shown here when styled the L.L. Philbrook Ten Cent Co., in the early 1920s. (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

After Philbrook, the space on Main Street was occupied by J.J. Newberry for many years until that company moved, March 24, 1960, to the building now occupied by the Laconia Antique Center. The Sanders Brick Block was torn down in 1963 to make way for a drive-up bank facility and parking lot, which opened, June 30, 1964, but was, in turn displaced during Urban Renewal by the new O'Shea's Department Store. Today, the Sanders site is roughly where the Granite State Music Hall (formerly the Whiskey Barrel) and the Empire Beauty School are now located. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)




