



October 19 - Laconia Wolves to Host Salute to First Responders Games

For the second year, the New England Wolves will host a pair of "Salute to First Responders" games at the Merrill Fay Arena. At these games money will be raised for the following charities: The Thin Blue Line Foundation (for Police Officers), Laconia Fire, The Wounded Warrior Project and local VFW's.

The games occur on October 19. Kicking things off will be an EHL match between the Wolves and the Worcester Railers at 3:30pm. Donations will be collected during the game for the Fire Department and the Thin Blue Line Foundation.

Wolves will have the Police and Firemen stand with our starting lineup during the anthem and player introductions. Additionally, there will be a vocal group from Laconia High School to sing the national anthem.

The EHL Game will be a Military Appreciation benefit. Donations will be collected for local VFWs and the Wounded Warrior Project. At 6:30pm the EHL puck will drop as the Wolves take on the Boston Jr. Rangers. Servicemen will make a flag presentation prior to the anthem, and stand with our players during introductions. The Marine Corps hymn will be played as the players take the ice, and a presentation by the Wolves ownership of an autographed jersey to the service members who are present at the game will occur during intermission.

Biodiversity of the Galapagos Islands, October 16



Located in the Pacific Ocean, the Galapagos Islands are famous for offering some of the best wildlife viewing in the world. Biology Professor Ken Thomas recently returned from a trip to the islands. He will share his experiences exploring the unique biodiversity of this area in a presentation Oct. 16 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building. This free event is open to the public.

Dr. Thomas will cover the geology of the islands, as well as background on the many birds, reptiles and mammals that make this area their home - including Galapagos penguins, sea lions and the highly endangered Galapagos tortoises.

The professor earned his AA in Liberal Arts from Northern Essex, a BS in Biology from UMass Lowell and an MS in Zoology and Ph.D. in Biological Sciences from the University of Rhode Island.

Colonial Theater Update with Justin Slattery

The Colonial Theater project is comprised of three distinct mixed-used developments: renovation of the historic theater, renovation of former apartment units into marketable residential use and four storefront commercial units. The entire property totals approximately 39,000 square feet.

The theater will be built with modern technology, accessibility upgrades, extensive historic rehabilitation and will have a 750-seat capacity. It will be used to host various cultural arts activities, including live stage performances and musical acts. The City of Laconia will be the master tenant of the theater and manage the operations.



This project is one of the largest historic preservation projects in state history. Join us Thursday, Oct. 17 at 6:30 pm in Taylor Community's Woodside Building for an update on the Colonial Theater Project, presented by Justin Slattery. This free event is open to the public.



Lecture with Author Jonathan Hively, Oct. 21

The first mountain-climbing cog railway in the world celebrates its 150th anniversary this year. The train makes a spectacular climb up a 3-mile long trestle to the 6,288-foot summit of Mount Washington. Jonathan Hively worked for the railway as firefighter, brakeman and engineer for 13 years.

Everyone is invited to join us Monday, Oct. 21 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building as Hively shares his many adventures and discusses the history of the Cog Railway. His book, "First Out: My Life on the Mt. Washington Cog Railway," will be available for purchase (\$24.95) and signing by the author.



Melnick's and Laconia Hardware Co. are seen in Bank Square, with the Moulton Opera House at extreme right, in the mid-1960s — before the city's Urban Renewal Program. According to The Citizen, 50 years ago this week, the hardware firm closed, Oct. 11, and would reopen in the former A&P supermarket, up the street — off-photo at right — Oct. 13, 1969. 


Bootlegger's, Rent-A-Center and MC Cycle now occupy a building erected in front of the three old buildings in the earlier view — and extending out into the former 'square' far enough to make that term no longer applicable. Melnick's held its grand opening in the Bootlegger's space, Aug. 19, 1970, and Lynch's opened in the remainder of the Stelaur Corp. building, Oct. 7, 1970.
