



At The Change of Seasons, Where's Your Trailer?



With the end of the warmer weather and winter just around the corner, people are moving their grownup "toys" that require trailers. If you're looking to store your summer toys or getting your winter fun ready, the City's Zoning Enforcement Office would like to remind residents there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten during these busy times.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which includes any kind of trailers, including campers, boats, trailers with either jet skis or snow machines, any motorized recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property.

Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the [City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles](#).)

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards, including the driveway area in front of the house.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be. Failure to comply with the Zoning Ordinance can lead to fines or court action. Questions? Call the Planning Department at 527-1264.


Our yesterdays

Our thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN . . .

The Mitchell and Mallard Block on Main Street, Laconia, is seen around 1891. Between the Parker Block, at extreme left, and George H. Mitchell's stove and tinware emporium (under the first bay windows at left) was Meredith Court; and, at the extreme right, California Court. The Laconia Democrat reported, 100 years ago this week, that the Wallace Building Co. would take possession of the G.H. Mitchell & Co. hardware store on Main street, Nov. 3, 1919, 'and transfer their headquarters from their present office on Water street.' The Contigiani Catering Service, mentioned in this week's 'Our yesterdays' was located off California Court until forced to relocate during Urban Renewal, 50 years ago this week. . . . AND NOW

The wooden buildings on the site were replaced, following a fire in 1928, by the Keller-Bean Block, a two-story brick structure with four storefronts on the first floor and offices on the second. The site is now part of the Municipal Parking Garage, opened in July 1974. The Mitchell and Mallard Block would have been located approximately between the lamp post and the tree.
