





The arsons started on a cold November midnight and didn't stop for months. As part of the Union Avenue road project, the City has implemented a change to the traffic signal phasing at the Elm/Clinton/Union intersection.

With the traffic signal upgrades completed, Elm Street and Clinton Street are now on the *same* phase. When Elm Street has the green light, Clinton Street also has the green light. This means that left turning vehicles now need to yield to oncoming traffic.

This work is in conjunction with other upgrades to the signals, including a new video detection system, flashing yellow arrow signals, and restoring the emergency vehicle and railroad preemption. Scuba Diver and History Buff Hans Hug, Jr. will present "Wrecks of Winnipesaukee," Tuesday, Nov. 12 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building. The event is free and open to the public.

An avid diver for 31 years, Hans has traveled throughout New England enjoying scallop diving and searching for shipwrecks and artifacts, including bottles, guns, ceramics and more. Using sophisticated side scan sonar equipment, he has dived all over Lake Winnipesaukee, locating more than 80 boat and barge wrecks, including large pieces of the original steamer Mt. Washington. Hans has captured hundreds of images and videotaped all of them. The lecture will include a brief video of one of his dives, along with photographs and sonar images of wrecks. There will be plenty of time for questions from the audience following the presentation.

Main Street is at the top and Beacon Street, at the bottom, in this mid-1960s aerial photo of Downtown Laconia. A demolition contract on the Evening Citizen buildings (arrows), fronting on Beacon Street at the left of the block, was awarded, 50 years ago this week. The building to the right of the long, narrow Citizen plant (built in 1933) had been the Salvation Army Citadel since the mid-1920s, but was also the newspaper's first home, from late 1925 to 1933. That structure, once the 'Mansion House' of Daniel Tucker, early Meredith Bridge blacksmith, was demolished, Nov. 2, 1967. Site of a drive-up banking facility in open area at top of photo was replaced in 1970-1971 by a three-story brick addition to the by then-Peoples National Bank & Trust Co. Building, with official opening, Aug 11, 1971. (Laconia Public Library)

Socks may be dropped off Monday-Friday 9:00 am-5:00 pm and Saturdays 9:00 am-4:00 pm.




