However, the Fire Department still has to respond to emergency calls. The City of Laconia has over 600 hydrants to clear and we could really use your help!

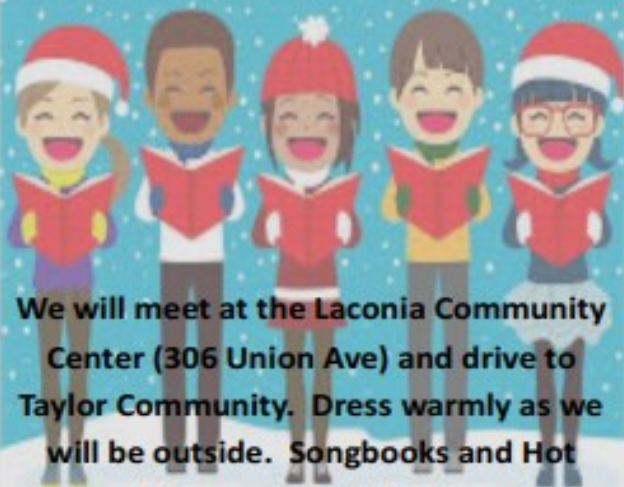

Laconia Origins and Rediscovery with Pat Tierney

Pat Tierney is a Laconia native who's lived in New Hampshire most of his life. Since assuming the reins as Executive Director of Laconia Historical and Museum Society in 2015, Pat has continued to present and oversee monthly Society programming and quarterly Library exhibits while maintaining the Laconia Archive.

As a transplant survivor since 2012, Pat's goal has been to continue to speak to New Hampshire's first and best story, which is Laconia and its origins. He also works to increase public awareness for the story while making a case as to why the Lakes Region and the original Province of Laconia should be New Hampshire's Official Home of the New England Charter (1620-1635).

Everyone is invited to join us Monday, Dec. 9 at 6:30 p.m. in Taylor Community's Woodside Building for Pat's presentation on Laconia Origins and Rediscovery. This free event is open to the public.

Pat is a NH Justice of the Peace as well as the Historian and Worshipful Master of Laconia's Mount Lebanon Lodge #32 which celebrated its 200th Charter anniversary in June. Pat also serves as the Noble Grand for the Belknap County IOOF Chocorua Lodge #51 also based in Laconia. A member of the Actors Equity Association and the Barnstormers Summer Theatre since 1982, he's had the distinct privilege to work and tour with professionals and friends worldwide.

THEN . . .

The Gilford Academy, which gave its name to Academy Square and Academy Street, Laconia, was an educational institution from 1850 to 1886, when it was moved to a new site, adjacent to the Harriman Block, at the corner of Court and Main streets. Before it was razed during the city's Urban Renewal Program, it was home to the Miss Sharon, and later, the Court House, diners. (Laconia Public Library)



. . . AND NOW

The old Academy was replaced, in 1886, by a new, brick Laconia High School, which served until today's Union Avenue LHS was built, in 1923. The old High School was vacant for a time before being recalled to service as an elementary school. Finally, in 1978, the first floor was remodeled for the Laconia District Court. In 2005, the city transferred the structure to the state and a \$4.7-million renovation made possible use of the entire building as well as providing additional space. THEN . . .

This was the lower end of the Laconia Main Street, in the mid-1960s, with the Normandin Block at left, adjacent to the Winnepesaukee River, and 'Baldi's Corner' (The Laconia Fruit Co.) at right, with Union Avenue just off-photo at right. Five of the old buildings at the Main Street-Union Avenue corner were demolished in mid-January 1968 and the Normandin Block was razed in mid-September of that year as part of the city's Urban Renewal Program. The space thus cleared was initially seen as a new location for the First Methodist Church and, perhaps, a hotel, with a parking garage on the other side of Main Street (to the left of the photographer), in the Rowe Court area. . . . AND NOW

As events turned out, plans changed and the proposed hotel was built on the site intended for the parking garage and the parking garage (seen here at extreme left) was built on the east side of Main Street in the Downtown Mall. (The old 'Baldi's Corner' is off-photo at right.) The Methodist Church was unable to reach agreement with the Laconia Housing and Redevelopment Authority on a site in the Downtown and ultimately relocated to Gilford Avenue in Gilford, where its new church was consecrated, Oct. 5, 1969. In November 1973, Stewart Park was dedicated, in memory of Paul N. Stewart, who was serving as chairman of the LHRA at the time of his death. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)

Prevention Better Than Reaction

As the Water Department is nearing its completion of our annual winter preparation/prevention program, this is a reminder for our customers to keep in mind the potential of water pipes freezing.

If the temperature inside a house gets below 32 degrees Fahrenheit (0 degree Celsius) it's likely that the water supply pipes and the drain traps will freeze. When water freezes it expands 9 percent, and if there is no room for expansion it's possible that the pipe will develop a crack and eventually leak once the ice thaws out. Fixing a ruptured pipe can be expensive, but the damage from uncontrolled water leakage can easily reach into the thousands of dollars.

The majority of the calls received for frozen water pipes and water meters are a result of inadequate heating and cold air drafts where piping is located in the home. It is recommended that property owners check their property for these conditions and identify the location of their water meter and shutoff valve before an emergency.

The property owner is ultimately responsible for repairs to the piping within the home or building. The Water Department will replace frozen or damaged meters. Customers will be charged for the cost of the replacement of the meter and service calls, as applicable.



If for any reason you cannot stop the flow of water from a broken pipe, call the Water Department's 24-hour emergency number at 524-0907.
