

## From the City Clerk's Office **Absentee Ballot Application Forms Are Now Available!**



The Presidential Primary date is set for February 11, 2020. Absentee ballots can be requested through the City Clerk's Office, or by clicking [here](#). Completed applications can be dropped off to the Clerk's Office, faxed to 524-1766, emailed to [cityclerk@laconianh.gov](mailto:cityclerk@laconianh.gov), or mailed to the City Clerk's Office, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247. Absentee ballots must be received no later than 5:00 pm on the day of the election in order for your vote to count.

You can verify receipt of your application, the date your absentee ballot was mailed to you, the date the Clerk receives your completed absentee ballot, and after the election learn if your absentee ballot was rejected/not counted and why. # Our yesterdays

**THEN...**

In 1929, Andrew L. Childs took a series of photos, recording construction of the new St. Joseph Catholic Church on Church Street. Then, in 1949, he compiled a photo album including this and four other shots, with the notation, 'Excavation and alterations for new St. Joseph's Church. I took these June 2, 1929,' handwritten on the album page. The excavation can be seen at left, beyond the vintage automobile. The St. John School Building is seen at right, with The Perley Putnam House and Messer Street off-photo beyond it. According to news articles in The Laconia Democrat, in mid-July 1924, W.M. Bisson was to begin work on a new school building for St. John School, at the time being conducted in a barn behind the Perley Putnam House. Almost a year later, The Democrat reported that the first class to graduate from the new building had received their diplomas, June 21, 1925, after the 10 a.m. High Mass. Thus, city records cited recently — purporting to identify the date of construction of St. John School as having occurred in 1972 — are far from accurate. (Laconia Public Library)



**...AND NOW**

St. Joseph Church and the former St. John School Building — from the early 1970s until this year, home to Holy Trinity School — are seen earlier this week. The ground was blessed and the first shovel of dirt turned for construction of the church, May 5, 1929, and excavation began, May 13. The stone masons completed their work in early November and the church building was completed by late March 1930. First Mass in the new church was celebrated on Easter Sunday, April 20, 1930.
