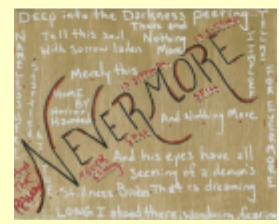

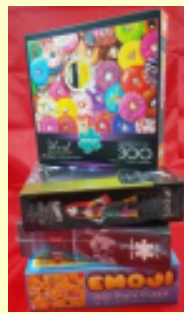

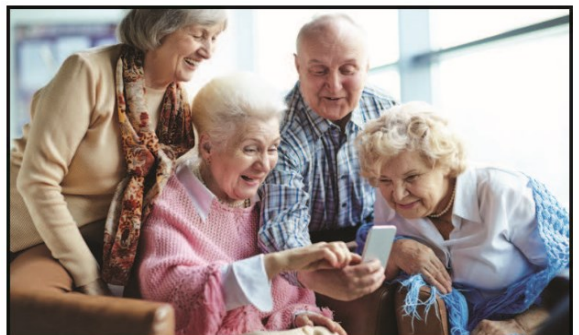

ATTENTION SNOWMOBILERS!

Snowmobiles in the Boardwalk area of Weirs Beach must be on the State Snowmobile Trail. Please do not ride on the sidewalks on Lakeside Avenue!

The City used to move the State snowmobile trail onto Lakeside Avenue to protect the Boardwalk. With the recent project to improve Lakeside Avenue, the snowmobile trail is back on the tracks. The City wants all snowmobilers to remain on the State trail through the Boardwalk area to protect the improvements that we have made to the area. The City of Laconia has not authorized snowmobiles to operate on any of its sidewalks or roads.

Please do not use the sidewalk to travel to Cumberland Farms from the trail. The City is clearing the sidewalks of snow so that the residents in the area have place to walk in the winter.

Under State law it is unlawful to:

- Operate on any road or within the right-of-way except where authorized and posted.
- Operate on town roads or sidewalks unless posted for OHRVs or snowmobiles.
- Operate on or across any highway bridge unless posted as open for OHRVs or snowmobiles.

The Laconia Historical and Museum Society will hold its annual meeting, followed by a program on the "Laconia High School Class of 1970," at the Taylor Community's Woodside Facility, Tuesday, Jan. 28, beginning at 6 p.m.

Both the annual meeting and program are free and open to the public, with a special invitation to members of the LHS class of 1970 and the other classes from that era.

Patrick Tierney, Executive Director of the Historical Society and a member of the LHS class of 1970, styles the program a "history rally and early 50th gathering," in advance of the class reunion to be held later in the year.

He adds that the class was "known for outstanding athletes, scholastic achievement, Up Up and Away, Civic Pride, Diversity and Overcrowdedness — which posed a problem." The latter is a reference to the overcrowding documented in mid-December 1967, when 899 students exceeded the 850 student capacity of the High School and eight teachers had no assigned rooms.

Our yesterdays

Our thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past....



THEN . . .

This was Depot Square, Laconia, in the early years of the 20th century. A new business, 100 years ago in January 1920, was the Granite State Needle Co., which was to open a factory in the O'Shea Building for the manufacture of knitting machine needles. Among the officers and directors were local businessmen Arthur D. O'Shea and George W. Mayo. The O'Shea Building is the 3 1/2 story building at left, erected by the O'Shea Brothers in 1896 for manufacture of hosiery, although that operation was relatively short-lived. From around 1905 to 1908, Albert E. Sanborn manufactured children's fine cashmere hosiery there and around 1912 the Belknap Stocking Co. occupied the premises. In the 1950s, the C.A. Lund Co. rented the building for storage of skis. In the background, houses on Harvard Street are seen and, at right, the brick John Y. Mugridge House and part of the wooden building of the B.G. Walker Plumbing & Heating Co. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Laconia Clinic purchased the O'Shea Building in 1957 and had it torn down for parking. A similar fate befell the other structures, over a period of years. The area had been renamed Veterans Square in November 1921. The Veterans Memorial Park had been laid out in 1892 in conjunction with construction of the railroad passenger station (off-photo at left). Major changes and additions to the memorials were made in 1990, when the cannons and cannonballs were repositioned and several tablets added, and 2017, when the World War I tablets were moved there from across the street. 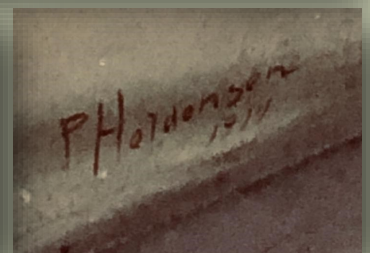
