

Free Tax Help - Federal Income Tax Assistance Available AARP Foundation Tax-Aide Program to be offered at Laconia Senior Center 17 Church Street

Again this year the AARP Tax-Aide program, which provides Free Tax Assistance in preparing and electronically filing your Federal Income Tax return, will be offered at the Laconia Senior Center at 17 Church Street. While the program gives special attention to all those 60 years of age and up, taxpayers with low and moderate income will also be accommodated by AARP personnel.

Assistance will be provided as follows:

Wednesdays and Thursdays, 8:30 am to 3:00 pm, from February 5 thru March 26

Thursdays only, 8:30 am to 3:00 pm from April 1 thru April 9

Please note that April 9th is the last day for AARP Free Tax Help at this location!

The service will be offered on an appointment basis. **Call the Laconia Senior Center at 524-7689 to make an appointment.**

Taxpayers are asked to bring the following: photo ID, copy of last year's income tax return, W-2 forms, any 1099 forms, dependent care provider info, proof of itemizing deductions, health insurance documents and Social Security cards or documentation for yourself and all dependents.

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

- Graduates of Laconia High School, Gilford High School, or Belmont High School in New Hampshire
- Legal residents of Laconia, Gilford, or Belmont, New Hampshire
- Those qualified for a specific donor preference or requirement; some local clubs and civic organizations offer awards to a wider range of students who are residents of Belknap County. Check out our website for more details.
- The scholarship foundation donors often follow students through their years of college or trade school, so if you have applied when you graduated high school, you can apply again now that you are in college.
- If you are returning to school as an adult, and are a resident of Laconia, Gilford or Belmont, you are eligible as well.

Only one application is necessary to apply for all the scholarship funds administered by the

Lakes Region Scholarship Foundation.

THEN . . .

The Folsom Opera House Block (in later years home to the Laconia Savings and Peoples National banks, and known as the 'Lower Bank') is seen, at left, from Main Street and, at right, from Sunrise Towers, then under construction during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s and early 1970s. Built in 1862-1863, the structure had a marble and granite facade added on the Main Street side in 1939. A public hearing had been set, 50 years ago this week, for Feb. 16, 1970, on the proposed acquisition by the city of the bank building for use as a city hall. ('The bank owns the present city hall, having exercised its option to purchase some months ago,' The Citizen reported. President John W. Archibald of Laconia Savings Bank said tentative plans were being made 'for construction of a new building at the city hall lot within a year.') Meanwhile, an ad hoc group had launched a protest against proposed use of the bank building — instead pushing for use of the Seeburg (Busiel) Mill which they said would cost less to renovate. Most of the members of the ad hoc group were also members of the group working to save the Belknap-Sulloway Mill as a cultural center. (Laconia Public Library)

Assessing

The abatement filing period is now open until March 1st. This is the process by which taxpayers can dispute their final 2019 value. Applications for abatement are available in our office or can be mailed upon request, by calling 527-1268.




