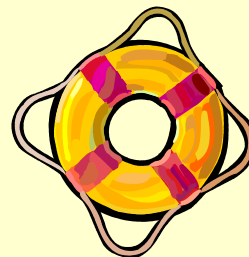
It's Not Too Early to Get Your 2020 Boat Registration!



Did you know you can process your boat registration at the same time as you conduct other business at City Hall?

It's easy and convenient! Just bring in your photo identification and prior year's registration (if you have it) and we can get the paperwork out of the way so you will be ready to put your boat in the water when the ice melts!

No waiting for your registration to be mailed back to you! Get it done early and conveniently at the City Clerk's Office. We are open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (We are also open late until 6 pm on the first and third Tuesdays of each month.)

THEN . . .

The house at 1 Winnisquam Ave., Laconia (at right), at the corner of Fair Street, next to the Fair Street Bridge, was heavily damaged by fire, Sept. 2, 2019, and declared unfit for occupancy. Two people were left homeless after the two-alarm blaze brought firefighters from seven departments to the scene. From the 1930s to the 1980s, residents of the house had included members of the Carpenter, Peavey and Merrill families. The long building at left (6 Winnisquam Ave.) was built by the Belknap County Farmers Exchange in the early 1920s but that enterprise relocated to New Salem Street a few years later. Other occupants were F.W. Webb and a storage facility for Salta Tire. The nearly-century-old structure is currently occupied by Gouin & Sons Plumbing and Heating. (Google satellite image)

Free Tax Help - Federal Income Tax Assistance Available **AARP Foundation Tax-Aide Program to be offered at Laconia Senior Center** **17 Church Street**

Again this year the AARP Tax-Aide program, which provides Free Tax Assistance in preparing and electronically filing your Federal Income Tax return, will be offered at the Laconia Senior Center at 17 Church Street. While the program gives special attention to all those 60 years of age and up, taxpayers with low and moderate income will also be accommodated by AARP personnel. Assistance will be provided as follows:

Wednesdays and Thursdays, 8:30 am to 3:00 pm, thru March 26

Thursdays only, 8:30 am to 3:00 pm from April 1 thru April 9

Please note that April 9th is the last day for AARP Free Tax Help at this location!

The service will be offered on an appointment basis. **Call the Laconia Senior Center at 524-7689 to make an appointment.** Taxpayers are asked to bring the following: photo ID, copy of last year's income tax return, W-2 forms, any 1099 forms, dependent care provider info, proof of itemizing deductions, health insurance documents and Social Security cards or documentation for yourself and all dependents.

E-cigarette Use: Prevalence, Interventions and Treatment Options for Teens

Symposium for the Winnepesaukee Public Health Region

E-cigarette use is surging among American teenagers, with millions of kids risking health complications and nicotine addiction by regularly vaping.

About 1 of every 10 middle school students (10.5%) reported in 2019 that they used electronic cigarettes in the past 30 days—an increase from 0.6% in 2011.

More than 1 of every 4 high school students (27.5%) reported in 2019 that they used electronic cigarettes in the past 30 days—an increase from 1.5% in 2011 (CDC).

Join local and statewide experts, including Susanne Tanski, MD, MPH, from Dartmouth-Hitchcock to learn more about the changing landscape of nicotine addiction.

**CITY OF LACONIA
NOTICE
SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT**

Effective March 6, 2020 at 6:00 am, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited the use of all streets in the City except for State roads, the City’s arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found on the [City’s website](#).

Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City’s Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations:

Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.

One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:

- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships
