Public Works' downtown accessibility improvements begin on March 16th!

The City will improve the pedestrian crossing on Beacon Street West between the Beacon Street West condominiums and the City parking lot in front of Rent-A-Center and Bootleggers. The construction includes ADA compliant curb ramps, rapid flashing beacons, and restricting the travel lane to a single lane until after the crossing.

The City will also improve the intersection of Main St. and Church St. This work includes new ADA compliant curb ramps and pedestrian signals.

As part of the work at the Main and Church St. intersection, Liberty Utilities will replace approximately 40 ft. of old gas main and Comcast will install conduit for the new cable system in these areas. After the utility companies are done, Busby Construction Co. will do the road, sidewalk and signal work. During the intersection and paving work, there will be occasional detours. The contractors will use signs, flaggers and police details to direct traffic and make every effort to get drivers to their destinations.

The work on Beacon St. West and at the Church/Main St. intersection is scheduled to be completed by the second week of May.



World Water Day



Sunday, March 22, 2020

Today, **1 in 3 people** – around 2.2 billion – live without safe drinking water. (WHO/UNICEF 2019). The Laconia Conservation Commission would like to raise awareness of the global water crisis and climate change by encouraging the observance of World Water Day.

Hundreds of thousands of people are taking individual action on climate change as part of the UN's #ActNow campaign. Here are five changes we can all make **today**:

Take five minute showers: Water scarcity already affects four out of ten people. With 80% of wastewater never being treated, taking shorter showers is a great way to save this precious resource.



Eat more plant-based meals: Dietary changes, featuring plant-based foods and sustainable animal-sourced food, could reduce greenhouse gas emissions by up to 8.0 gigatonnes a year of carbon dioxide equivalent.



Don't throw away edible food: An estimated 1/3 of all food produced globally is lost or goes to waste. Reducing your food wastage reduces demand on agriculture which is one of the biggest water consumers.



Turn off tech: Currently 90% of power generation is water-intensive. By powering down our devices when we're not using them, the less energy needs to be produced.



Shop sustainably: A typical pair of jeans takes 10,000 litres of water to produce, equal to what a person drinks in 10 years. Sourcing our goods from responsible sources can have a big impact on the consumption of water and other essential resources.



Did You Know?

- Approximately 10,000 Laconia residents get their drinking water from Paugus Bay.
- Laconia Water Department posts its annual "Our Daily Water" Consumer Confidence Report elsewhere on this website. The report is also mailed to all property owners in the spring of each year.



THEN . . .

Purchase of the John T. Busiel House, at 49 Church St., Laconia, was approved by Most Rev. Matthew F. Brady, bishop of the Diocese of Manchester, 75 years ago this week, The Citizen reported, March 14, 1945, to be used by St. Joseph Parish 'for future school or convent needs as might develop.' The Busiel property 'lies directly across Church street from St. John's school.' Busiel's daughter, Helen, had died, Feb. 21, 1945, placing the mansion on the market. (Photo from The Illustrated Laconian, 1899)



. . . AND NOW

The Busiel House was rented to the Laconia Chapter of the American Red Cross until late August 1954 when St. John School found it necessary to use classroom space there briefly until an addition to the school was built during 1956-1957. The city bought the house in July 1957 for additional parking and exits from the newly completed Beacon Street parking lot, adjoining. The house was torn down in 1958 and the Winston Building erected on the site in 1960. Meanwhile, the garage from the Busiel House had been moved, March 26, 1958, to the rear of the St. John schoolyard, across Church Street, to become the Scout Shack for Troop 68. 
Think Twice Before Buying Easter Chicks

With Easter coming soon, you'll be seeing ads for Easter chicks. Aww...aren't they cute?

However, the City considers chickens, even the cute little chicks, to be livestock and NOT pets. In most areas of the City, livestock including chickens, are not allowed to be kept on the property.

Chickens, ducks, guinea hens, pigs, goats, and other agricultural animals are not permitted in most districts in the urban/suburban districts in Laconia. Agriculture and agricultural animals are permitted in the RR1 (Residential Rural), RR2 (Residential Rural Corridor) and AI (Airport Industrial) districts. In the CR (Commercial Resort) district, agriculture and the animals typically associated with agriculture are only allowed by Special Exception granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment. If you're not sure what zoning district you live in, check your tax card on the City website or call the Planning office at 524-1264 to find out.

A good idea is to keep your chick purchases to the pink marshmallow kind!


