Information for our residents regarding City services

In order to keep our residents informed regarding City services and operations during this public health situation, we are providing current information below:

- Although City Hall remains open at this time, we are strongly encouraging residents to transact City business on-line. We have a large number of transactions that can be accomplished in this manner, including vehicle registration renewals, dog licensing renewals, water and sewer payments, property tax payments and vital record requests. Day passes can be purchased directly at the Transfer Station. Please call the City Clerk's office at 527-1265 if you have questions. The City's website is www.laconianh.gov. There is also a drop box slot available on the outside of City Hall.

All departments in City Hall remain staffed during our regular hours, and that contact information is located on the last page of this newsletter.


- The Community Center and all City park houses are closed to all programs through Friday, April 3rd. Please call the Community Center at 524-5046.


Upcoming Meetings...

World Water Day



Sunday, March 22, 2020

Today, **1 in 3 people** – around 2.2 billion – live without safe drinking water. (WHO/UNICEF 2019). The Laconia Conservation Commission would like to raise awareness of the global water crisis and climate change by encouraging the observance of World Water Day.

Hundreds of thousands of people are taking individual action on climate change as part of the UN's #ActNow campaign. Here are five changes we can all make **today**:

Take five minute showers: Water scarcity already affects four out of ten people. With 80% of wastewater never being treated, taking shorter showers is a great way to save this precious resource.



Eat more plant-based meals: Dietary changes, featuring plant-based foods and sustainable animal-sourced food, could reduce greenhouse gas emissions by up to 8.0 gigatonnes a year of carbon dioxide equivalent.



Don't throw away edible food: An estimated 1/3 of all food produced globally is lost or goes to waste. Reducing your food wastage reduces demand on agriculture which is one of the biggest water consumers.



Turn off tech: Currently 90% of power generation is water-intensive. By powering down our devices when we're not using them, the less energy needs to be produced.



Shop sustainably: A typical pair of jeans takes 10,000 litres of water to produce, equal to what a person drinks in 10 years. Sourcing our goods from responsible sources can have a big impact on the consumption of water and other essential resources.



Did You Know?

- Approximately 10,000 Laconia residents get their drinking water from Paugus Bay.
- Laconia Water Department posts its annual "Our Daily Water" Consumer Confidence Report elsewhere on this website. The report is also mailed to all property owners in the spring of each year.

Think Twice Before Buying Easter Chicks

With Easter coming soon, you'll be seeing ads for Easter chicks. Aww...aren't they cute?

However, the City considers chickens, even the cute little chicks, to be livestock and NOT pets. In most areas of the City, livestock including chickens, are not allowed to be kept on the property.

Chickens, ducks, guinea hens, pigs, goats, and other agricultural animals are not permitted in most districts in the urban/suburban districts in Laconia. Agriculture and agricultural animals are permitted in the RR1 (Residential Rural), RR2 (Residential Rural Corridor) and AI (Airport Industrial) districts. In the CR (Commercial Resort) district, agriculture and the animals typically associated with agriculture are only allowed by Special Exception granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment. If you're not sure what zoning district you live in, check your tax card on the City website or call the Planning office at 524-1264 to find out.

A good idea is to keep your chick purchases to the pink marshmallow kind!

THEN . . .

Joseph F. Smith's Smith Lumber Co. occupied the narrow, one-story building (behind the tree) at 93 New Salem Street for many years, beginning in the 1920s. In 1945 — 75 years ago this week — Philip Ames, manager for the past four years, purchased the buildings, stock and retail business from Smith, who had founded the firm, 20 years earlier, but who would continue to operate the sawmill end of the business. . . . AND NOW

By 1952, proprietor was Lawrence L. Luneau and, by 1960, it was the Fred Letendre Lumber Co. Later, John C. Marshall used the property for storage for a number of years. Other occupants included the Superior Oil Co. and, briefly Cliff Ernst's Bargain Hut. More recently, Don Morin Associates, plumbing and heating, has occupied the space. Structures glimpsed in the distance at right, in the earlier view, were destroyed in a spectacular fire, April 10, 1968, in which three buildings and part of a fourth burned and three liquid propane gas tanks exploded, but the cement-block warehouse of J.J. Morin (now part of the Salvation Army Thrift Store complex) was saved. (Adam Drapcho/Laconia Daily Sun)

Road Construction Updates!

Court Street from Keasor to Main Street is scheduled for final paving on the road and driveways this spring. Preparation for the paving will begin in April, which includes raising manhole covers and trimming driveways.

The plan is to complete paving by the first week of May. Cleanup, loaming and seeding and punch list work will follow.

Prep work will take two to three weeks, paving will be two to four days, depending on the method used, and clean-up will be two weeks.

Busby Construction is planning to complete repair work to a sewer manhole at the intersection of Court and Fair Street starting on **Monday, March 23**. Traffic will be detoured on Court Street and Fair Street as needed during the week of March 23 and during paving operations.

Business resources and help currently available in New Hampshire

We know many of you are facing a very stressful situation during the Covid-19 pandemic and are trying to figure out the best way to get your company through these challenging times. Below, we have outlined several business resources that may be helpful during this evolving time. We will get through this challenge together.

New Hampshire is making immediate and broad expansions to its unemployment benefits program. This will enable more people to access resources quickly and is information you can pass along to businesses and employees. Layoffs and business closures: If your business faces a potential layoff, the State of New Hampshire offers services through its [Rapid Response program](#). Rapid Response is a comprehensive, collaborative and immediate initiative to respond to and mitigate layoffs and closures. Rapid Response benefits both employers and employees through services to workers who are laid off, as well as layoff aversion information for businesses.

Employers facing potential layoffs or closures contact Joe Doiron, Joseph.Doiron@livefree.nh.gov, 603-271-0146, to activate a Rapid Response team. More information can be found at [NH Works](#).

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is offering a direct federal loan program to aid in recovery. Small businesses, private non-profit organizations of any size, small agricultural cooperatives and small aquaculture enterprises that have been financially impacted as a direct result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) since Jan. 31, 2020, may qualify for Economic Injury Disaster Loans of up to \$2 million to help meet financial obligations and operating expenses which could have been met had the disaster not occurred. Loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the disaster's impact. This is a direct program, meaning you will need to create an account and apply directly. More details: [LINK](#)

Public Health and Support: New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) provides services to ensure the health and well-being of citizens during a layoff. Dislocated workers can discuss healthcare options, apply for food stamps, cash assistance, medical assistance, childcare and medical savings. Individuals can apply online at [NHEasy](#) or by calling 603-271-9700. **Employees experiencing layoffs:** The State of New Hampshire offers a number of services for employees who have been laid off. [New Hampshire Employment Security](#) has a list of available services. Individuals will need to file for unemployment each week of temporary unemployment and this can and should be done [online](#) or by calling 603-271-7700.

Unemployment Benefits: Individuals who are unable to work or who have reduced hours due to the COVID-19 pandemic will have immediate access to unemployment benefits. Anyone in the following situations will now be eligible for state unemployment: If your employer temporarily closes due to COVID-19; Individuals that need to self-quarantine or are directed to quarantine at the instruction of a healthcare provider, employer or government official; Individuals that need to care for a family member that has COVID-19 or is under quarantine; Individuals that need to care for a dependent because of school closures, child care facility closures or other similar types of care programs; Self-employed individuals that are temporarily unable to operate their business because of any of the above listed situations will also be eligible.
