


Press Conference



SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY

- Graduates of Laconia High School, Gilford High School, or Belmont High School in New Hampshire
- Legal residents of Laconia, Gilford, or Belmont, New Hampshire
- Those qualified for a specific donor preference or requirement: [some local clubs and civic organizations offer awards to a wider range of students who are residents of Belknap County. Check out our website for more details.](#)
- The scholarship foundation donors often follow students through their years of college or trade school, so if you have applied when you graduated high school, you can apply again now that you are in college.

Hello, Laconia and Lakes Region Friends,

The current health crisis has been a lot to take in and I hope each of you is well and taking necessary precautions for your health and the health of others. Both personally and as the leader of New Hampshire Humane Society, I am taking the path of being as cautious as possible. My partner and I have self-quarantined after exhibiting some symptoms but we are stable and well, all things considered. The Board of Directors, with leadership from Tony Matos, is fully supportive of our difficult decision to temporarily close the facility to the public. Some animals have moved to foster care and others are still at the facility with a drastically reduced staff.

News from the Public Works Dept.

Our Public Works Department is currently closed to the public for the protection of our visitors and employees. Please use email, telephone and the City's [website](#) for questions about how to transact your City business. Please see below for some helpful information:

- Please note that plumbing, driveway, sidewalk and excavation permits still need to be completed at Public Works.
- Until the Coronavirus pandemic is under control, day passes to the Transfer Station may be purchased at the Transfer Station by check, cash or credit card. Proof of residency is required. Annual dump stickers may be obtained from the City Clerk or Tax Office by mailing a \$20 check made payable to the City of Laconia and a copy of your valid vehicle registration to: City of Laconia, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247. There is also a drop box located on the outside of City Hall on the Belknap Mill side of the building. Annual dump stickers are good for the calendar year and apply to the Transfer Station and the Brush Dump. Please call the City Clerk's Office at 527-1265 with questions.

Changes at Laconia Fire Department During COVID-19 Pandemic

Until further notice, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Laconia Fire Department has changed the way we are issuing outside burning permits and mechanical permitting.

For outside burn permits you can call 524-6881 and obtain a permit by phone. You must be the property owner, and still meet all applicable laws. We can answer specifics at that time.

For mechanical permits, contractors can go online to the City's web site at www.laconianh.gov. Go to the Fire Department tab, and under Fire Prevention you will find the permitting section. You can fill out the form adding a current email address, and fax to 524-0437. You will then be contacted for approval and to set up an inspection. You will be billed and an invoice will be sent to you.

If you have any questions, please feel free to call the number above and we will be glad to help you navigate the permitting process.

THEN . . .

At 10 a.m., Tuesday, March 24, 1970 — 50 years ago this week — the new O'Shea's Department Store opened on the Downtown Laconia Mall. Citizen reporter Aline Jacobs described 'the magnificent structure of steel and concrete foundation with masonry exterior walls' encompassing 20,000 square feet on the main floor, with an additional 5,000 ft. on the second floor housing the executive offices, lounge, bookkeeping department and the outstanding new 'Beauty Boutique.' It 'features 22 departments all richly decorated in beautifully blended colors running the gamut of the rainbow.' The photo was taken some years later, after completion in 1974 of the Municipal Parking Garage, glimpsed at left. (Laconia Public Library)



. . . AND NOW

O'Shea's closed for good, May 31, 1991. Thereafter, the former department store space was vacant for a while but since the mid-1990s has been home to various other businesses, currently the Family Dollar Store and, to the left, the Granite State Music Hall. ROADWORK AHEAD

Road Construction Updates!

Court Street from Keasor to Main Street is scheduled for final paving on the road and driveways this spring. Preparation for the paving will begin in April, which includes raising manhole covers and trimming driveways. The plan is to complete paving by the first week of May. Cleanup, loaming and seeding and punch list work will follow. Prep work will take two to three weeks, paving will be two to four days, depending on the method used, and clean-up will be two weeks.

Busby Construction is planning to complete repair work to a sewer manhole at the intersection of Court and Fair St. starting on **March 23**. Traffic will be detoured on Court St. and Fair St. as needed during the week of March 23 and during paving operations.

Business resources and help currently available in New Hampshire

Please see the information below, provided by Belknap Economic Development Council:

We know many of you are facing a very stressful situation during the Covid-19 pandemic and are trying to figure out the best way to get your company through these challenging times. Below, we have outlined several business resources that may be helpful during this evolving time. We will get through this challenge together.

New Hampshire is making immediate and broad expansions to its unemployment benefits program. This will enable more people to access resources quickly and is information you can pass along to businesses and employees. This information is evolving, so we are bringing you what we know now and encourage you to keep checking New Hampshire Employment Security's website for more details: [LINK](#)

Layoffs and business closures: If your business faces a potential layoff, the State of New Hampshire offers services through its [Rapid Response program](#). Rapid Response is a comprehensive, collaborative and immediate initiative to respond to and mitigate layoffs and closures. Rapid Response benefits both employers and employees through services to workers who are laid off, as well as layoff aversion information for businesses.

Employers facing potential layoffs or closures contact Joe Doiron, Joseph.Doiron@livefree.nh.gov, 603-271-0146, to activate a Rapid Response team. More information can be found at [NH Works](#).

The U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) is offering a direct federal loan program to aid in recovery. Small businesses, private non-profit organizations of any size, small agricultural cooperatives and small aquaculture enterprises that have been financially impacted as a direct result of the Coronavirus (COVID-19) since Jan. 31, 2020, may qualify for Economic Injury Disaster Loans of up to \$2 million to help meet financial obligations and operating expenses which could have been met had the disaster not occurred. Loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the disaster's impact. This is a direct program, meaning you will need to create an account and apply directly. More details: [LINK](#)

Public Health and Support: New Hampshire Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) provides services to ensure the health and well-being of citizens during a layoff. Dislocated workers can discuss healthcare options, apply for food stamps, cash assistance, medical assistance, childcare and medical savings. Individuals can apply online at [NHEasy](#) or by calling 603-271-9700. **Employees experiencing layoffs:** The State of New Hampshire offers a number of services for employees who have been laid off. [New Hampshire Employment Security](#) has a list of available services. Individuals will need to file for unemployment each week of temporary unemployment and this can and should be done [online](#) or by calling 603-271-7700.

Unemployment Benefits: Individuals who are unable to work or who have reduced hours due to the COVID-19 pandemic will have immediate access to unemployment benefits. Anyone in the following situations will now be eligible for state unemployment: If your employer temporarily closes due to COVID-19; Individuals that need to self-quarantine or are directed to quarantine at the instruction of a healthcare provider, employer or government official; Individuals that need to care for a family member that has COVID-19 or is under quarantine; Individuals that need to care for a dependent because of school closures, child care facility closures or other similar types of care programs; Self-employed individuals that are temporarily unable to operate their business because of any of the above listed situations will also be eligible. 
Assessing

Exemption and Credit Deadline to File

To assure exemptions and credits are applied to the current tax year, all new applications typically must be received by April 15th. In light of the current situation, taxpayers who wish to apply are encouraged to do so by July 15th so that enough time is available to return to normal operations and complete the approval process. Applications that are received after the statutory deadline but before the tax rate is set by the NH Department of Revenue Administration will be accepted and can be considered under the law. Incomplete applications will result in a request for information and may ultimately be cause for denial.

Can I Flush Medicine Down the Sink or Toilet?

Flushing medication is NOT recommended. Do not flush medicines down the sink or toilet unless the prescription drug labeling or patient information that accompanied the medicine **specifically instructs** you to do so. Research shows that certain medications are not thoroughly flushed out during water treatment, and can contaminate groundwater.





COVID-19 AVOIDING SCAMS

Scammers may take advantage of COVID-19 outbreak fears by selling bogus "treatments" and "prevention" products, establishing fake charities, and sending seemingly legitimate emails with malicious links or attachments.



BEWARE OF FALSE CLAIMS

Do not be tempted by claims and advice on social media or websites that a product or treatment can cure or prevent COVID-19.

Currently, there are no prescription or over-the-counter pills, vaccines, oils, lotions, or other products available to treat or cure COVID-19. Always check with your health care provider before buying such products.

BE CAREFUL WHEN MAKING DONATIONS

Before making donations to support those who are ill or suffering financially because of the COVID-19 outbreak, DO YOUR HOMEWORK:

- If the appeal claims to be from a charity, make sure that it is registered with the Attorney General's Charitable Trusts Unit. The list may be found here: www.doj.nh.gov/charitable-trusts/
- If the appeal is for an individual, think hard about donating unless you know the person needing help and that person's circumstances;
- Do not let anyone rush you into making a donation;
- Check that you are dealing with a legitimate charity or individual and not an "impostor" with a deceptively similar name;
- Do not assume that social media recommendations for donations are legitimate.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR PHONY CDC EMAILS

Be careful about opening emails claiming to be from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or from others claiming to have information about COVID-19. Clicking on links or attachments could cause a computer virus to infect your device.
