NEW! Due to the Covid-19 crisis and in accordance with Governor Sununu's Emergency Order #12 and Executive Order #2020-04, Laconia will be conducting its public meetings on line for the duration of the health crisis. The City will utilize the Zoom platform to allow the public to listen to and participate in meetings of the City Council, Planning Board and other public bodies. If you are interested in viewing, listening to, or participating in a meeting, you can do so using any of a number of platforms.

- Each meeting will be conducted as a webinar using the Zoom platform. To access the meeting using Zoom, simply download Zoom to your desktop computer, laptop, tablet or smartphone. Next, find the link and necessary password included on the agenda of the meeting you are interested in. Follow the link (or cut and paste it into your browser) and use the password to access the meeting. Using this platform, you will be able to both see and hear the meeting and have the opportunity to speak during any public portions of the meeting.
- If you don't have access to a computer or smartphone you can still access the meeting with Zoom using a traditional telephone by dialing the number provided on the meeting agenda and entering the Webinar ID number when prompted. With this platform, you will only be able to listen to the meeting.
- If you are an Atlantic Broadband customer, you will still be able to see and listen to the meeting live on Channel 26. If you regularly watch meetings on Channel 26 please be aware that things will look a little different than you are used to, as many participants will be contributing remotely instead of being physically present at the table.
- You may also watch the meeting live on YouTube. This is a new feature. YouTube videos were not previously available until the day after the meeting. Meetings are now streamed live to YouTube and you may watch them by going to the [City website](#) and following the link to the City's YouTube page.



Lakes Region Mental Health Center (LRMHC) remains fully-committed to serving patients during this unprecedented time. In an effort to limit the spread of COVID-19 in our communities and protect the health of our patients and staff, the majority of our services will be conducted remotely; either by telephone (audio-only) or by using audio-visual technology (i.e. computers with cameras, smart phones with cameras, video-conferencing equipment, etc.) so that the patient and provider can see each other. In-person services are available on a limited basis as we continue to comply with COVID-19 recommendations.

LRMHC will maintain hours of operation in Laconia and Plymouth:
Monday – Friday 8am – 5pm.

For Emergencies: Crisis support is always available and you can reach our Emergency Services staff by calling 528-0305.

If you are an existing patient, our staff will reach out to you about how we can continue to support you and how those services may best be delivered.

For individuals who are new to us and want to seek treatment, we ask that you please call us during normal business hours at 603-524-1100 to schedule an initial appointment by phone or by alternative telehealth options. We will conduct a brief mental health assessment and provide you with options for appropriate care.

If you are receiving in-person services such as medications, injections or have a primary care appointment, here is what to expect when you arrive at LRMHC:

Upon entering the office, you will be asked a number of questions that screen for illness, recent travel and ask you about the reason for your visit. We will also take your temperature. We will instruct you to maintain safe distancing from others and answer any questions you might have. Your provider will greet you in the lobby.

These are difficult and confusing times. Many are feeling overwhelmed and we are here to support you. LRMHC is only a phone call away.

Annual dump stickers may be obtained from the City Clerk or Tax Office by mailing a \$20 check made payable to the City of Laconia and a copy of your valid vehicle registration to: City of Laconia, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247. There is also a drop box located on the outside of City Hall on the Belknap Mill side of the building. Annual dump stickers are good for the calendar year and apply to the Transfer Station and the Brush Dump. Please call the City Clerk's Office at 527-1265 with questions.

THEN ...

Construction on this Rowe Court Parking Lot — replacing a number of old houses — began in April 1957, with the lot opening in Late August. That same month, Lougee's Department Store opened its 'Park 'N Shop' in a two-story addition to the Tilton Block (seen in distance) which had earlier been used for storage. The back end of Laflamme's Bakery is to the right of the Tilton Block, with the steeple of the First Methodist Church on Union Avenue glimpsed between them. The former 'Gen. Knight' House, at extreme right, had been moved from its original location at the corner of Main and Court streets in June 1948. The three-story brick Harriman Block, at the corner of South Main and Court streets, is seen in the distance at right, to the left of the Knight House. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

Most of the area was cleared during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s and early 1970s and today's Best Western Plus Landmark Inn (in distance at left) opened, as a Ramada Inn, in October 1974. Following further demolition of remaining structures, a Walgreens Pharmacy at 45 Court St. (the red-brick building right of center) opened, Oct. 9, 2009. The Mount Lebanon Lodge No. 32 Building, built by the Independent Order of Odd Fellows in 1952, is obscured by the cement-block structure, also now owned by the lodge, at right. 

Road Construction Updates!

Court Street from Keasor to Main Street is scheduled for final paving on the road and driveways this spring. Preparation for the paving will begin in April, which includes raising manhole covers and trimming driveways. The plan is to complete paving by the first week of May. Cleanup, loaming and seeding and punch list work will follow. Prep work will take two to three weeks, paving will be two to four days, depending on the method used, and clean-up will be two weeks.

Busby Construction will be completing repair work to a sewer manhole at the intersection of Court and Fair St.. Work was scheduled to begin on **March 23**. Traffic will be detoured on Court St. and Fair St. as needed during paving operations.

Business resources and help currently available in New Hampshire

We know many of you are facing a very stressful situation during the Covid-19 pandemic and are trying to figure out the best way to get your company through these challenging times. Below, we have outlined several business resources that may be helpful during this time. We will get through this challenge together.

SBA Paycheck Protection Program

The SBA Paycheck Protection Program is a loan designed to provide a direct incentive for small businesses to keep their workers on the payroll. SBA will forgive loans if all employees are kept on the payroll for eight weeks and the money is used for payroll, rent, mortgage interest, or utilities. The Paycheck Protection Program will be available on 4/3/20 through 6/30/20. For details of this program [CLICK HERE](#)

NH Working - WorkShare Program

As employers navigate new challenges created by COVID-19, one way to help maintain their trained workforce is the State's WorkShare program. Employers can temporarily reduce their workforce in a particular unit, shift or company 10%-50% and avert a layoff. They can then recall the employees when business increases. As employees are retained morale, productivity and flexibility in the workplace are maintained. Affected employees have a softer landing as their hours are reduced rather than eliminated, and they keep their health insurance and can collect wages for hours worked plus unemployment compensation benefits for the reduced hours. WorkShare plans may be submitted by any New Hampshire employer whose taxes are currently up to date and they are in good standing with the NH Department of Labor. SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program

U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) low-interest federal disaster loans can provide working capital to New Hampshire small businesses and private, non-profit organizations suffering substantial economic injury as a result of COVID-19.

- SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loans offer up to \$2 million in assistance to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue.
- These loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the disaster's impact.
- The interest rate is 3.75% for small businesses and 2.75% for non-profits.
- SBA offers loans with long-term repayments in order to keep payments affordable, up to a maximum of 30 years.

Unemployment Benefit Relief

Per Emergency Executive Order #5, individuals who are unable to work or who have reduced hours due to the COVID-19 pandemic will have immediate access to unemployment benefits. Anyone in the following situations will now be eligible for state unemployment:

- If your employer temporarily closes due to COVID-19;
- Individuals that need to self-quarantine or are directed to quarantine at the instruction of a healthcare provider, employer or government official;
- Individuals that need to care for a family member that has COVID-19 or is under quarantine;
- Individuals that need to care for a dependent because of school closures, child care facility closures or other similar types of care programs;
- **Self-employed individuals that are temporarily unable to operate their business because of any of the above listed situations will also be eligible.**

Individuals will need to file for each week of temporary unemployment. People can do all of this online from your home internet connection or your phone without ever having to go into a state office. For more information and to file for unemployment benefits, visit the [NHES website](#)

Changes at Laconia Fire Department During COVID-19 Pandemic

Until further notice, in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Laconia Fire Department has changed the way we are issuing outside burning permits and mechanical permitting.

For outside burn permits you can call 524-6881 and obtain a permit by phone. You must be the property owner, and still meet all applicable laws. We can answer specifics at that time.

For mechanical permits, contractors can go online to the City's web site at www.laconianh.gov. Go to the Fire Department tab, and under Fire Prevention you will find the permitting section. You can fill out the form adding a current email address, and fax to 524-0437. You will then be contacted for approval and to set up an inspection. You will be billed and an invoice will be sent to you.

If you have any questions, please feel free to call the number above and we will be glad to help you navigate the permitting process.

Assessing

In the coming weeks the Assessing office will be conducting EXTERIOR reviews of properties recently constructed or currently under construction.



Exemption and Credit Deadline to File

To assure exemptions and credits are applied to the current tax year, all new applications typically must be received by April 15th. In light of the current situation, taxpayers who wish to apply are encouraged to do so by July 15th so that enough time is available to return to normal operations and complete the approval process. Applications that are received after the statutory deadline but before the tax rate is set by the NH Department of Revenue Administration will be accepted and can be considered under the law. Incomplete applications will result in a request for information and may ultimately be cause for denial.



COVID-19 AVOIDING SCAMS

Scammers may take advantage of COVID-19 outbreak fears by selling bogus "treatments" and "prevention" products, establishing fake charities, and sending seemingly legitimate emails with malicious links or attachments.



BEWARE OF FALSE CLAIMS

Do not be tempted by claims and advice on social media or websites that a product or treatment can cure or prevent COVID-19.

Currently, there are no prescription or over-the-counter pills, vaccines, oils, lotions, or other products available to treat or cure COVID-19. Always check with your health care provider before buying such products.

BE CAREFUL WHEN MAKING DONATIONS

Before making donations to support those who are ill or suffering financially because of the COVID-19 outbreak, DO YOUR HOMEWORK:

- If the appeal claims to be from a charity, make sure that it is registered with the Attorney General's Charitable Trusts Unit. The list may be found here: www.doj.nh.gov/charitable-trusts/
- If the appeal is for an individual, think hard about donating unless you know the person needing help and that person's circumstances;
- Do not let anyone rush you into making a donation;
- Check that you are dealing with a legitimate charity or individual and not an "impostor" with a deceptively similar name;
- Do not assume that social media recommendations for donations are legitimate.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR PHONY CDC EMAILS

Be careful about opening emails claiming to be from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or from others claiming to have information about COVID-19. Clicking on links or attachments could cause a computer virus to infect your device.
