


We will update the public if there are any revisions to this schedule in the future.



“Tom Sawyer ...is a combination of the characteristics of three boys whom I knew, and therefore belongs to the composite order of the architecture.”

“Although my book is intended mainly for the entertainment of boys and girls, I hope it will not be shunned by men and women ...for part of my plan has been to try to pleasantly remind adults of what they once were themselves. ...”

These are Mark Twain’s words in the Preface to *The Adventures of Tom Sawyer*, published by the American Publishing Company, 1876.

The novel follows the adventures and antics of mischievous young Tom Sawyer, growing up along the Mississippi River in the 1840’s. While Twain describes the book as fictional it can read as memoir reflecting his own childhood memories and experiences growing up in the town of Hannibal, Missouri.

- Who is Tom Sawyer? Note his philosophy of life and how he thinks about work, school and friendships.
- Who is Aunt Polly?
- Tom describes being “rolling in wealth.” What were his treasures?

Our Public Works Department is currently closed to the public for the protection of our visitors and employees. Please use email, telephone and the City's [website](#) for questions about how to transact your City business. Please see below for helpful information:

- The solid waste pickup schedule for the year is on the City's website [here](#).
- The Public Works Department will mail recycling decals to City residents upon request. Just call us at 528-6379.
- Please note that plumbing, driveway, sidewalk and excavation permits can now be completed on the Public Works website.
- Until the Coronavirus pandemic is under control, day passes to the Transfer Station may be purchased at the Transfer Station by check, cash or credit card. Proof of residency is required. Annual dump stickers may be obtained from the City Clerk or Tax Office by mailing a \$20 check made payable to the City of Laconia and a copy of your valid vehicle registration to: City of Laconia, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247. There is also a drop box located on the outside of City Hall on the Belknap Mill side of the building. Annual dump stickers are good for the calendar year and apply to the Transfer Station and the Brush Dump. Please call the City Clerk's Office at 527-1265 with questions.

THEN ...

Stan Fish, owner of Lemay's Garage in Gilford for the past few years, had moved his operation to Belmont, April 1, 1995, The Citizen reported, 25 years ago this week, and opened Advanced Car Care Center on Route 106, just south of the New Hampshire Technical College (now Lakes Region Community College), just off-photo at right. Here, some years later, Extreme Auto Care is the name of the business. Earlier, the site was part of the Chester Randlett property and later had been known as Laconia Auto Wrecking, which moved there around 1963 from an earlier location at the intersection of Cotton Hill Road and Route 107 — today roughly just to the north of the Ice Arena. The South End location was the second for the Nick Family's junkyard, which had moved from Messer Street to a 'new location on Province road near the McIntyre piggery' in 1934. By late August 1963, concerning the impending construction of the Laconia Bypass, The Citizen reported that 'piers for the Route 107 bridge are already in. They are located at the old site of Danny Nick's auto yard,' which had begun removal operations from the Province Road location a couple of months earlier. (Google satellite photo)



... AND NOW

Recently, the Advanced Auto Care and other buildings were taken down. Current plans by Route 106 Realty Trust envisage the merger of lots located between the Center for Contemporary Dentistry and the Belmont/Laconia border for expansion of the self-storage facility further south on Route 106, along with a car wash, a commercial/professional building and an indoor RV/boat storage building. Business resources and help currently available in New Hampshire

We know many of you are facing a very stressful situation during the Covid-19 pandemic and are trying to figure out the best way to get your company through these challenging times. Below, we have outlined several business resources that may be helpful during this time. We will get through this challenge together.

SBA Paycheck Protection Program

The SBA Paycheck Protection Program is a loan designed to provide a direct incentive for small businesses to keep their workers on the payroll. SBA will forgive loans if all employees are kept on the payroll for eight weeks and the money is used for payroll, rent, mortgage interest, or utilities. The Paycheck Protection Program will be available on 4/3/20 through 6/30/20. For details of this program [CLICK HERE](#)

NH Working - WorkShare Program

As employers navigate new challenges created by COVID-19, one way to help maintain their trained workforce is the State's WorkShare program. Employers can temporarily reduce their workforce in a particular unit, shift or company 10%-50% and avert a layoff. They can then recall the employees when business increases. As employees are retained morale, productivity and flexibility in the workplace are maintained. Affected employees have a softer landing as their hours are reduced rather than eliminated, and they keep their health insurance and can collect wages for hours worked plus unemployment compensation benefits for the reduced hours. WorkShare plans may be submitted by any New Hampshire employer whose taxes are currently up to date and they are in good standing with the NH Department of Labor. SBA Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program

U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) low-interest federal disaster loans can provide working capital to New Hampshire small businesses and private, non-profit organizations suffering substantial economic injury as a result of COVID-19.

- SBA's Economic Injury Disaster Loans offer up to \$2 million in assistance to help overcome the temporary loss of revenue.
- These loans may be used to pay fixed debts, payroll, accounts payable and other bills that can't be paid because of the disaster's impact.
- The interest rate is 3.75% for small businesses and 2.75% for non-profits.
- SBA offers loans with long-term repayments in order to keep payments affordable, up to a maximum of 30 years.

Unemployment Benefit Relief

Per Emergency Executive Order #5, individuals who are unable to work or who have reduced hours due to the COVID-19 pandemic will have immediate access to unemployment benefits. Anyone in the following situations will now be eligible for state unemployment:

- If your employer temporarily closes due to COVID-19;
- Individuals that need to self-quarantine or are directed to quarantine at the instruction of a healthcare provider, employer or government official;
- Individuals that need to care for a family member that has COVID-19 or is under quarantine;
- Individuals that need to care for a dependent because of school closures, child care facility closures or other similar types of care programs;
- **Self-employed individuals that are temporarily unable to operate their business because of any of the above listed situations will also be eligible.**

Individuals will need to file for each week of temporary unemployment. People can do all of this online from your home internet connection or your phone without ever having to go into a state office. For more information and to file for unemployment benefits, visit the [NHES website](#)

Vehicle Registration

Helpful
Tips

Although City Hall is closed to the public at this time, there are still a lot of options available for conducting your City business on-line. Two of the most common questions people ask relate to vehicle registrations and dog licensing. Please see below for instructions on how to accomplish both on-line, and other useful information:

If you are looking to renew your vehicle registration on-line, click [here](#). This will bring you to the Vehicle Registration page of our website where you can follow instructions to get the process going to renew your registration.

If you have a new registration for a vehicle purchased from a NH dealership and you were issued a 20-day plate on or after February 26, 2020, that temporary plate is now valid until May 31, 2020. For vehicles purchased in a private sale, please call the New Hampshire Department of Motor Vehicles Office at (603) 227-4000 to inquire about purchasing a temporary plate.

Please note that we are only making in-person appointments for essential items. Call the City Clerk's Office at 527-1265 for more information. New motorcycles, trailers, and RVs that need new plates are not considered essential, so we are not processing these types of transactions at this time.

If you have a new boat that you would like registered, please email the City Clerk at cityclerk@laconianh.gov with the bill of sale, a copy of your driver's license, and the Boat RDMV 612 Form which can be found by clicking [here](#).

If you do not have the capability to process on-line transactions, please call our office to receive the amount due for your registration and either mail your payment or place your payment in our mail slot located next to the door on the right (Belknap Mill) side of our building.



To renew your dog license, click on the image (left). Enter your dog tag number as it is printed on your dog's license (including the dash followed by the last two digits of the year).

Click on "Sample License" on our dog license page to locate where on your dog's printed license you can find the license number.
