Laconia's Municipal Buildings and Facilities

Beginning on Tuesday, May 26th Laconia residents will see changes happening at some of our municipal buildings and facilities. City Hall, which has been closed to the public due to the Corona Virus since March 23rd, will reopen to the public on Tuesday, May 26th for its regular hours, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday. At this time there will be no extended hours in City Hall on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of the month; however, we hope to resume those extended hours at some point in the future. **Although City Hall will be open to the public, we are strongly encouraging our residents to use our on-line services and contact our various departments by phone to the fullest extent possible.** Contact information is listed on the last page of this newsletter.

Things will look different in City Hall than they used to; one door will be specifically unlocked and available for people coming into the building, and another will be used to exit the building. There will be a staff member stationed in the lobby to help people get to the right department, and to be sure visitors have the documents they need to make the best use of their time while they are in City Hall.




MEMORIAL DAY Solid Waste Collection Delay NOTICE TO RESIDENTS ON CURBSIDE COLLECTION ROUTES

Our Public Works Department will re-open to the public on Tuesday, May 26th, with one person allowed in the lobby at a time. However, please continue to use our on-line services whenever possible, contact the Department by phone (528-6379) or email at publicworks@laconianh.gov for questions and information.

- The solid waste pickup schedule for the year is on the City's website [here](#).
- The Public Works Department will mail recycling decals to City residents upon request. Just call us at 528-6379.
- Please note that plumbing, driveway, sidewalk and excavation permits can continue to be completed on the Public Works website.
- You can continue to purchase day passes at the Transfer Station. Check, cash or credit card may be used for purchase, and proof of residency is required.
- Annual dump stickers may be obtained from the City Clerk or Tax Office in City Hall, or they can also be obtained by mail. Just send a \$20 check made payable to the City of Laconia, a stamped self-addressed envelope and a copy of your valid vehicle registration to: City of Laconia, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247. There is also a mail slot located on the outside of City Hall on the Belknap Mill side of the building. Annual dump stickers are good for the calendar year and apply to the Transfer Station and the Brush Dump. Please call the City Clerk's Office at 527-1265 with questions.

Field of Flags to Fly Again for Memorial Day

Last year almost 4,000 flags were lined up on the Congregational Church of Laconia UCC lawns and around the flagpole in Veterans Square, creating a Field of Flags set in place throughout Memorial Day weekend.

The Congregational Church and Greater Laconia Ministerial Association are joining to provide the display again this year. The purpose of this touching spectacle and dedication ceremony is to honor and remember the sacrifice of U.S. military personnel and their families in defense of our nation, "land of the free because of the brave." Following social distance protocols throughout the process, this is their way of providing a safe community tribute for Memorial Day. The flags will remain up from May 23rd - May 30th.

In lieu of a public ceremony, Rev. Dr. Judith Wright of the Laconia Unitarian Universalist Society has written this dedication for the flags: In the name of All That is Holy: This Memorial Day Weekend, we honor those men and women - our sons and daughters, husbands and wives, fathers, brothers, sisters, mothers - those who have laid down their life for our country. May we cherish their spirit, honor their commitment, send them our love, and never forget the service that they gave. As we remember those who sacrificed their lives for our nation's freedom, let us recall these famous words of President Abraham Lincoln, from his Gettysburg Address in 1863: *We can pray that those who fought and died for our country did not die in vain. We can ask that their sacrifice would live on to inspire others to live in freedom and to serve and love their fellow citizens: that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain; that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom; and that the government, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.*


Property Tax Credit Forms



THEN . . .

Ribbons were cut for four new stores on the west side of the Downtown Laconia Mall, May 21, 1970 — 50 years ago this week. They were Rosen's, the Varsity Shop, Junior Deb and Story Drug, which opened in the one-story building (arrow), seen here across Main Street from the Folsom Opera House ('Lower Bank') Block. The new building, erected by the Laconia Community Development Corp., adjoined O'Shea's Department Store, and Melnick's and Lynch's, in the SteLaur Block adjoined O'Shea's at the top. On the east side (at right) of Main Street, still open to one-way vehicular traffic, the former G.A.R. Building (Crystal Cafe, Matheson's), in the open space next to the Opera House Block, had been demolished in April 1969. The adjoining Keller-Bean Block, to the north, would be razed in December 1970 and, further north, the Parker Block (Lee's Cut-Rate, Emanuel's Quality Market) would come down in late April 1971. At extreme left, the Tilton Block would be razed in October 1970. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



. . . AND NOW

The Stafford Family completed the two-story building, now occupied by Sawyers Jewelry, in early 1973. The Downtown Mall had become a pedestrian zone, Nov. 3, 1970, and remained so for the next quarter century, until July 8, 1994, when Main Street was reopened to one-way vehicular traffic. The Opera House/Lower Bank was not razed until late November 1972, and the Municipal Parking Garage, for which construction had started in summer 1972, opened June 21, 1974, with a ceremony on the top deck. NH HOUSING

To help address the additional and urgent need for housing during the COVID-19 crisis, the NHHFA Board of Directors at its March meeting committed \$1 million in emergency financial support to our affordable housing partners, including organizations providing for the state's homeless residents. The funds will assist those organizations facing a variety of financial impacts due to the COVID-19 emergency.

Child Care Programs

Emergency Child Care Programs have been established to provide childcare services for children and youth whose parents have been deemed as essential workers under Governor Sununu's Exhibit A to Emergency Order # 17 pursuant to Executive Order 2020-04. Programs approved, may be eligible for incentive payments to support staff salaries, operations and supplies through federal, state and philanthropic funding

Although City Hall will re-open to the public as of Tuesday, May 26th, there are still many types of City business that can be accomplished on-line, and we encourage you to take advantage of those services.

Two of the most common questions people ask relate to completing vehicle registrations and dog licensing on-line. Please see below for instructions on how to accomplish both:

If you are looking to renew your vehicle registration on-line, click [here](#). This will bring you to the Vehicle Registration page of our website where you can follow instructions to get the process going to renew your registration. If you do not have the capability to process on-line transactions, please call our office at 527-1265 to receive the amount due for your registration and either mail your payment or place your payment in our mail slot located next to the door on the right (Belknap Mill) side of our building.



To renew your dog license on-line, click the image (left). Enter your dog tag number as it is printed on your dog's license (including the dash followed by the last two digits of the year).

Click on "Sample License" on our dog license page to locate where on your dog's printed license you can find the license number.

Please note that a late fee \$1/month for your dog registration will be in effect as of June 1st.



COVID-19 AVOIDING SCAMS

Scammers may take advantage of COVID-19 outbreak fears by selling bogus "treatments" and "prevention" products, establishing fake charities, and sending seemingly legitimate emails with malicious links or attachments.



BEWARE OF FALSE CLAIMS

Do not be tempted by claims and advice on social media or websites that a product or treatment can cure or prevent COVID-19.

Currently, there are no prescription or over-the-counter pills, vaccines, oils, lotions, or other products available to treat or cure COVID-19. Always check with your health care provider before buying such products.

BE CAREFUL WHEN MAKING DONATIONS

Before making donations to support those who are ill or suffering financially because of the COVID-19 outbreak,
DO YOUR HOMEWORK:

- If the appeal claims to be from a charity, make sure that it is registered with the Attorney General's Charitable Trusts Unit. The list may be found here: www.doj.nh.gov/charitable-trusts/
- If the appeal is for an individual, think hard about donating unless you know the person needing help and that person's circumstances;
- Do not let anyone rush you into making a donation;
- Check that you are dealing with a legitimate charity or individual and not an "impostor" with a deceptively similar name;
- Do not assume that social media recommendations for donations are legitimate.

BE ON THE LOOKOUT FOR PHONY CDC EMAILS

Be careful about opening emails claiming to be from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or from others claiming to have information about COVID-19. Clicking on links or attachments could cause a computer virus to infect your device.
