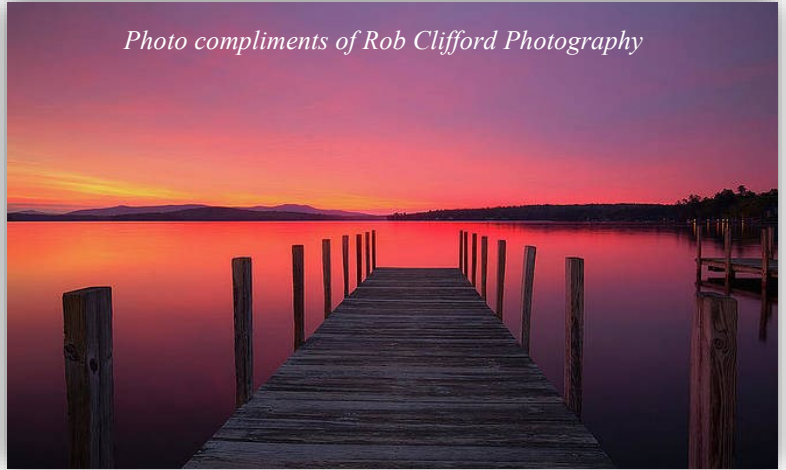

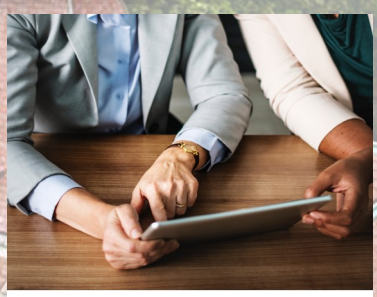

# Public Works Department



Free Dump Day for Laconia residents is scheduled for Saturday, June 20<sup>th</sup>. (Businesses cannot dispose of their solid waste for free on that day.) Public Works highly recommends businesses do not come to the Transfer Station on June 20<sup>th</sup> as it will be very busy.

Due to the social distancing requirements, City and Waste Management employees will not be able to assist residents in unloading their trash.

Residents needing assistance with unloading will need to bring help with them. We expect a large turnout for this popular event, so be prepared to be patient as there is likely to be a longer wait time than normal.

To help minimize wait times, the City recommends that residents use the following schedule when coming to the Transfer Station on June 20<sup>th</sup>.

<u>Time</u>	<u>First letter of last name</u>
7 to 9 am	A through and including G
9 to 11 am	H through and including N
11 am to 1 pm	O through and including Z

Public Works will turn away any resident who arrives later than 1 pm, so please be sure to be at the Transfer Station before that time.

Residents who do not have dump stickers must have some form of documentation that shows they are a Laconia resident.

Items we will accept are appliances, water heaters, furniture, beds, plumbing fixtures, bagged leaves, demolition lumber, auto tires (limit 6 tires per customer). Items we will not accept are auto tail pipes, mufflers, radiators, engines, batteries or hazardous waste, paints or solvents.

**Residents must still pay for disposing of electronics during free dump day.**

Disposal of leaves and recycling for Laconia residents is free all year. Residents do not need a dump sticker or day pass to dispose of leaves or recycling, but must have documentation that shows they are a Laconia resident.

Vacation is approaching .... we are reading Chapter 21 at just the perfect moment. Just before "Examination Day". The students are terrified, even though on the cusp of summer. We read poetry and feel Tom's discomfort as he attempts to read Patrick Henry's "Give me Liberty or Give me Death" speech. Mark Twain never lets us down in the *Adventures of Tom Sawyer*. What is more exciting than a trial – a real trial where our young Tom is asked to testify and is riveting on the stand. From poetry and prose to a murder trial in three short chapters.

## *Information for our residents regarding City services*

To keep our residents informed regarding City services and operations during this public health situation, please see the information below:

- City Hall is now open to the public during our regular hours, Monday-Friday, 8:30 am to 4:30 pm. However, residents are strongly encouraged to utilize our on-line services whenever possible. Please wear a facemask when visiting City Hall, or we can provide you with one if needed. Social distancing is required, and a staff member is located in the lobby to direct you to the appropriate department.
- Please see page 10 of this newsletter for a detailed update regarding Parks and Recreation facilities, beaches and playgrounds. The City's tennis courts at Leavitt park and Memorial Park are now open. Please call the Community Center at 524-5046 for more information.
- Although Library buildings remain closed to the public until further notice, they are operating a "take-out" service and offering lots of on-line activities. Please visit the Library's [website](#) or call 524-4775. Information about the Library's programs is also included on page two of this newsletter.
- The Water Department remains closed to the general public. Please visit their website [here](#) for information on how to pay your bill, or call 524-0901.
- The Public Works office is now open and will allow one person in the lobby at a time. We encourage customers to use our on-line services whenever possible. Services that can be completed on-line include plumbing, driveway, sidewalk and excavation permits. Daily dump passes can be purchased directly at the Transfer Station; please be sure to bring identification that shows you are a Laconia resident. Annual dump stickers may be obtained from the City Clerk or Tax Office in City Hall. They are good for the calendar year for the Transfer Station and the Brush Dump. Please call the Department of Public Works at 528-6379 for additional information. Spring Clean-Up Days have been postponed and will be rescheduled in the near future.

# Important News for City Residents!



Over the last month the City has begun a campaign to improve how its residents and businesses dispose of their solid waste as part of the City's Curbside Solid Waste Collection Program.

The City began this effort starting with businesses and condominium associations. Starting on July 20<sup>th</sup> Public Works will begin focusing on single family residential property, as well as multifamily residential rental property.

The City's solid waste rules as they apply to residences include the following:

- Solid waste can only be placed in the City right of way no earlier than 7 pm the day before the area's collection day. The cans must be removed before 7 pm the day of collection.
- All trash must be in plastic bags and be placed in a trash can. The trash can cannot be overflowing.
- All solid waste cans must have a lid.
- Single family residences can have two trash cans.
- A duplex can have four trash cans.
- A triplex can have six trash cans.
- Any apartment complex over 3 units can have only 7 trash cans.
- Recycling containers are unlimited; however, the contractor will only collect recycling containers that are not contaminated with trash.
- Solid waste containers can weigh no more than 50 lbs including its contents. The container shall have a height no greater than 36 inches.
- The City does not collect tires, freon containing appliances or electronics at the curb.
- Large items can be placed in the right of way for collection if the item is a 2 person lift. Each item must have a bulky item sticker.
- Metal bulky items with a bulky item sticker are only collected on the first Wednesday of the month and by appointment only.
- Large items placed in the right of way for another party to take for free are considered trash and can only be in the right of way from 7 pm the day before the area's collection day to 7 pm on collection day.

The curbside collection contractor as of July 20, 2020 will only pick up curbside solid waste that meets the City's regulations. Public Works employees will be inspecting collection routes and may assess fines depending on the nature of the violation of the City Solid Waste regulations. Questions? Call 528-6379.

With the recent updates to the State of New Hampshire's COVID-19 Reopening Guidelines we are now able to offer the concerts in Riverside Rotary Park. We ask that you follow the simple guidelines below in an effort to ensure that all attendees are able to safely enjoy the concerts.

The Belknap Mill is delighted that we are able to bring our 2020 'Arts in the Park' Summer Concert Series to the Laconia and Lakes Region community! Enjoy!

### **Arrival**

Enter the park from any direction while practicing social distancing. Patrons are welcome to bring lawn chairs or blankets.

### **Seating**

Socially distanced areas (6' apart) will be marked by a chalk outline for family groups to sit inside of. Please choose any area that is not already taken. If all areas are filled when you arrive, please consider sitting, with appropriate distance along the river walkway or sidewalk. Sitting in-between marked areas will not be allowed.

### **Food/Beverage**

Patrons are welcome to bring snacks to enjoy while listening to the concert. Please take all trash with you upon departure. Alcohol is not permitted.

### **Restrooms**

The Belknap Mill will be staffed and restroom facilities will be open and available. No more than two patrons will be allowed into the building to use the facilities at any one time. Restrooms will be disinfected by Belknap Mill staff after each use. When entering the building please wear a cloth mask. Add'l patrons waiting to access the facilities will be asked to wait outside practicing 6' of appropriate social distancing. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

### **Smoking**

Smoking is not permitted within any City of Laconia parks. Smoking is permitted 5 feet from the front of the Belknap Mill building, on the parking lot side.

### **Donations**

We hope that you enjoy the 'Arts in the Park' Summer concert series.

### **State of NH Guidelines regarding Performing Arts:**

- Capacity is limited to the number of people where social distancing is able to be safely maintained with at least 6 feet of separation between individuals and between groups at all times. Close household contacts (e.g. a parent and child) are allowed closer than 6 feet to each other.
- Where possible, clearly mark physical distancing spaces/guidelines with floor/ground markings, seat markings, or signs
- When outdoors, performer group sizes are limited to 10 people total (excluding other support or media streaming staff), and performers should be seated or positioned more than 6 feet apart.

## PARKS & RECREATION

### Summer Plans for Laconia Parks & Recreation

Summer of 2020 in Laconia is going to look very different from past years at all of our City parks. All parks & beaches are open (and have been throughout the Governor's Stay at Home Order.)

Please feel free to visit our beaches and parks, and be conscious of appropriate social distancing for everyone's safety. We appreciate your willingness to follow these guidelines for everyone's health, and we hope you will continue to do so.

Below are some changes taking place at this time...

Endicott Rock Park (Weirs Beach) will have a limited capacity of 400 throughout the 2020 summer season. There will be beach caretakers to monitor this activity.

The 4<sup>th</sup> of July will consist only of Class B fireworks this year. Unfortunately, there will not be a parade or celebration in the park. The entire park will be shut down and everyone is encouraged to watch the show from their cars around the City. Please see more details on [page 20](#) of this newsletter.

Playgrounds will re-open within two weeks! There will be limited cleaning of our parks, so parents are encouraged to take additional steps for their children's safety.

## THEN ...

At Lakeport, 75 years ago this week, the Munsey & Weeks Funeral Home at 1061 Union Ave. changed hands, transferring the business to Melvin Allen Hicks of Dorchester, Mass., effective July 1, 1945. The concern had been founded in 1870 — 75 years earlier — as the E.D. Ward Co. George B. Munsey was with the firm for 60 years, and had become owner in 1918. 'Sixteen years ago his daughter's husband, Alton M., Weeks, who died last December (in 1944), became associated with him and the name was changed to Munsey & Weeks.' Although the 1945 newspaper account noted that Hicks planned to keep that name, by the time of this winter photo in the 1950s, it had become the Melvin Hicks Funeral Home. In later years, the business became the Robichaud and, ultimately, Dewhirst funeral homes, before closing in early 2013. ## Some Good News from Laconia for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Holiday

Laconia, like every city and town across the world, is having to make some difficult decisions due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This includes traditional celebrations that people attend every year being cancelled. Unfortunately, this means changes to the Laconia 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration.

The popular parade and celebration at Opechee Park have been cancelled.

The good news is that there is one classically important tradition of the 4<sup>th</sup> of July that we can uphold safely. The annual Independence Day FIREWORKS!! The City is excited to have the opportunity to host this event.

The show will be moved from the track to the middle of the main field at Opechee Park and the entire park will be closed. No entrance will be permitted. The show will consist of all Class B fireworks. Class B fireworks are the extremely high and large shells, which will be visible from all around the city. There will be no Class C fireworks, which are the lower shells. This way people will not need to be in the Opechee Park area in order to see the show. In fact, viewing this show from a distance will be the better show.

There will be multiple areas around the city where people can watch the show and still have a fantastic view. For instance, the Messer Street boat launch, the High School, Middle School or Pleasant Street School parking lots. There are also many roads where cars can simply pull over to watch. The City does suggest that people stay in their cars unless proper social distancing guidelines can be met.

The City is even working on logistics of live streaming the show for anyone not wanting or unable to leave their homes! More information will be forthcoming on this idea closer to the event.

At Weirs Beach, the traditional July 3<sup>rd</sup> midnight fireworks show has been cancelled, due to the inability to properly comply with social distancing. The show consists of only the lower, Class C shells, and crowds typically gather closely together on the boardwalk to watch.

## There's a Place for Everything: Even Your Trailers!



With the start of the summer season people are using their "toys" that require trailers while enjoying all of the opportunities that the Lakes Region has to offer. While everyone is enjoying this season, the City's Zoning Enforcement office would just like to remind people there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten in the summer heat.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which include trailers, campers, boats, any other recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property.

Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the [City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles.](#))

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front yard. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be. Don't forget that includes those items that are intended for the snow (like snowmobiles), even though it's too early to think about that!
