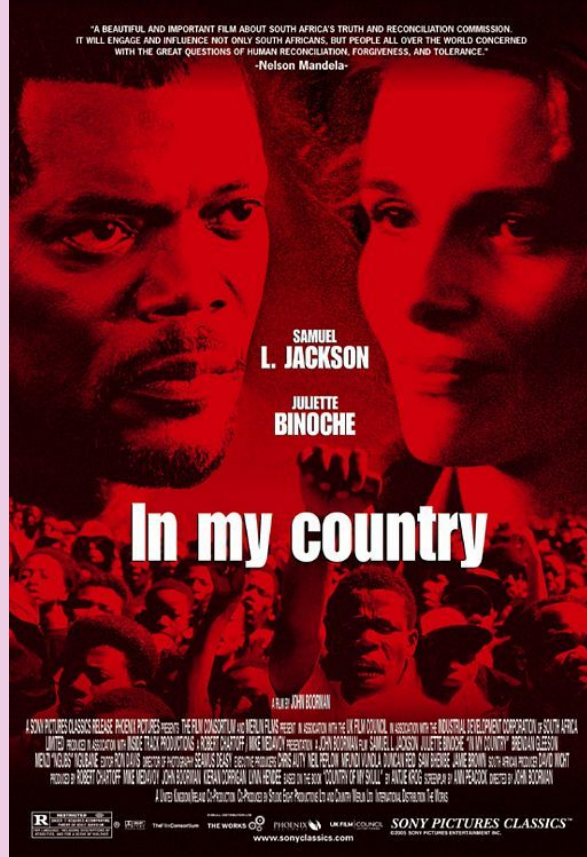

"Black Ice" by Lorene Cary

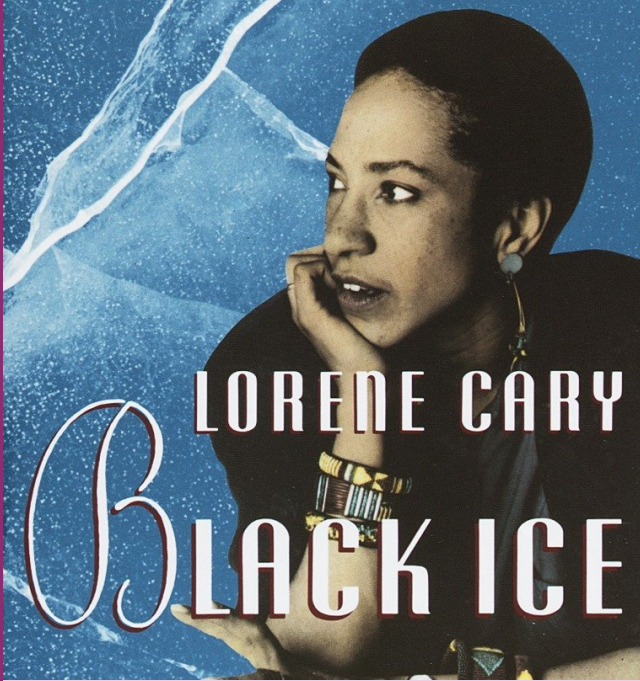
