Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

The City of Laconia is looking for four members of the public to serve on the Capital Improvement Committee. This Committee meets for three months of the year, September, October and November, for a total of five meetings, with each meeting lasting about one to two hours.

The responsibility of this Committee is to recommend and rank the City's capital improvements. The Board hears presentations by the various City Departments explaining their requests and then ranks each submission. Once the Board ranks all the submittals, they submit their rankings to the City Manager, who then provides input and forwards them on to the City Council for possible adoption into the City Budget. If you are interested in getting into City government and have an interest in what projects are being proposed in the City, this is a great Committee to provide input on how you would like to see specific things funded. 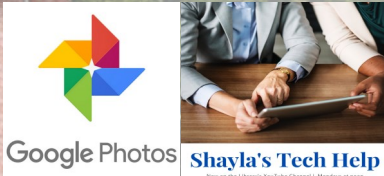

Important News for City Residents!

The City's [Solid Waste Ordinance](#) has been in effect for quite some time. However, a campaign is now underway to enforce our current regulations in order to improve the overall look of the City. Residents and businesses will now need to comply with the requirements of the Ordinance; this will cut down on the overflow of trash barrels and bags piled on top or left on the ground, encourage recycling and result in a more attractive community.

The City began this effort starting with businesses and condominium associations, and as of July 20 began focusing on single family residential properties, as well as multi-family residential rental properties.

Please note that the City provides unlimited single-stream recycling pickup every other week curbside. Dates of recycling weeks can be found on our [Recycling Calendar](#), posted on our website. Residents can also drop off flattened corrugated cardboard behind the Public Works garage on Messer Street 24/7 in the "caged area".



The City's solid waste rules as they apply to residences include the following:

- Solid waste can only be placed in the City right of way no earlier than 7 pm the day before the area's collection day. The cans must be removed before 7 pm the day of collection.
- All trash must be in plastic bags and be placed in a trash can. The trash can cannot be overflowing.
- All solid waste cans must have a lid.
- Single family residences can have two trash cans.
- A duplex can have four trash cans.
- A triplex can have six trash cans.
- Any apartment complex over 3 units can have only 7 trash cans.
- Recycling containers are unlimited; however, the contractor will only collect recycling containers that are not contaminated with trash.
- Solid waste containers can weigh no more than 50 lbs including its contents. The container shall have a height no greater than 36 inches.
- The City does not collect tires, freon containing appliances or electronics at the curb.
- Large items can be placed in the right of way for collection if the item is a 2 person lift. Each Item must have a bulky item sticker.
- Metal bulky items with a bulky item sticker are only collected on the first Wednesday of the month and by appointment only.
- Large Items placed in the right of way for another party to take for free are considered trash and can only be in the right of way from 7 pm the day before the area's collection day to 7 pm on collection day.

The curbside collection contractor will only pick up curbside solid waste that meets the City's regulations. Public Works employees will be inspecting collection routes and may assess fines depending on the nature of the violation of the City Solid Waste regulations.

We have worked closely with the Laconia Police and Fire Departments and the City of Laconia to find the safest option for hosting this year's 'Arts in the Park' Summer Concert Series. With the recent updates to the State of New Hampshire's COVID-19 Reopening Guidelines we are now able to offer the concerts in Riverside Rotary Park. We ask that you follow the simple guidelines below in an effort to ensure that all attendees are able to safely enjoy the concerts.

The Belknap Mill is delighted that we are able to bring our 2020 'Arts in the Park' Summer Concert Series to the Laconia and Lakes Region community! Enjoy!

Arrival

Enter the park from any direction while practicing social distancing. Patrons are welcome to bring lawn chairs or blankets.

Seating

Socially distanced areas (6' apart) will be marked by a chalk outline for family groups to sit inside of. Please choose any area that is not already taken. If all areas are filled when you arrive, please consider sitting, with appropriate distance along the river walkway or sidewalk. Sitting in-between marked areas will not be allowed.

Food/Beverage

Patrons are welcome to bring snacks to enjoy while listening to the concert. Please take all trash with you upon departure. Alcohol is not permitted.

Restrooms

The Belknap Mill will be staffed and restroom facilities will be open and available. No more than two patrons will be allowed into the building to use the facilities at any one time. Restrooms will be disinfected by Belknap Mill staff after each use. When entering the building please wear a cloth mask. Add'l patrons waiting to access the facilities will be asked to wait outside practicing 6' of appropriate social distancing. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Smoking

Smoking is not permitted within any City of Laconia parks. Smoking is permitted 5 feet from the front of the Belknap Mill building, on the parking lot side.

State of NH Guidelines regarding Performing Arts:

- Capacity is limited to the number of people where social distancing is able to be safely maintained with at least 6 feet of separation between individuals and between groups at all times. Close household contacts (e.g. a parent and child) are allowed closer than 6 feet to each other.
- Where possible, clearly mark physical distancing spaces/guidelines with floor/ground markings, seat markings, or signs
- When outdoors, performer group sizes are limited to 10 people total (excluding other support or media streaming staff), and performers should be seated or positioned more than 6 feet apart.

THEN ...

The four-story, 'former Isaac Sakansky wooden structure' (at left) on Mill Street, 'recently known as the Rene Gilbert building,' was being razed, 50 years ago this week, with demolition about half-way and expected to continue into the next week. 'Removal of the mill,' The Citizen reported in 1970, 'will open up the view along the banks of the Winnepesaukee River.' The Belknap Mill is at right and part of the Busiel Mill is glimpsed at left. Site of the wooden mill, built by William Esty on the site of an earlier mill erected by Lewis Busiel, a brother of John W. Summer of 2020 in Laconia certainly looks very different from past years at all of our City parks. All parks & beaches are open (and have been throughout the Governor's Stay at Home Order.) Vehicle Registration

Helpful
Tips

Is your vehicle registration renewal due at the end of July? It's quick and easy to renew your vehicle registration on-line. Just follow the steps below:

1. Have your Vehicle Registration available; it contains your Plate No. and VIN (Vehicle Identification Number).
2. Log onto the City's website at www.laconianh.gov
3. Click "[Online Bill Pay](#)"
4. Choose "[Motor Vehicle Registration Renewals](#)"
5. In the box labeled Renew Type, hit the down arrow and choose either:
 - "By Plate No./Vin where you will enter your license plate number and VIN (Vehicle Identification Number); or
 - By Pin - This can be found on the email you received from the City Clerk's Office
6. Click "Continue"
7. Click "Add to Cart"
8. You can now select to either pay by Credit Card or ACH (Automated Clearing House - this will require your checking account numbers). If you pay by credit card you will be charged an additional 2.95% fee; if you pay by ACH you will be charged 40 cents.
