Applications can be dropped off at the Clerk's Office (45 Beacon St. E.), faxed to 524-1766, emailed to cityclerk@laconianh.gov or mailed to the City Clerk's Office, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH 03247.

Hand delivered absentee ballots will be accepted at the City Clerk's Office in City Hall no later than Monday, September 7 by 5 pm. The Clerk's Office will be open on 9/7 for this purpose only between 3 pm and 5 pm. Mailed absentee ballots must be received no later than 5 pm on Tuesday, September 8th. Please note that absentee ballots cannot be placed in the drop off slot at City Hall in accordance with State law.

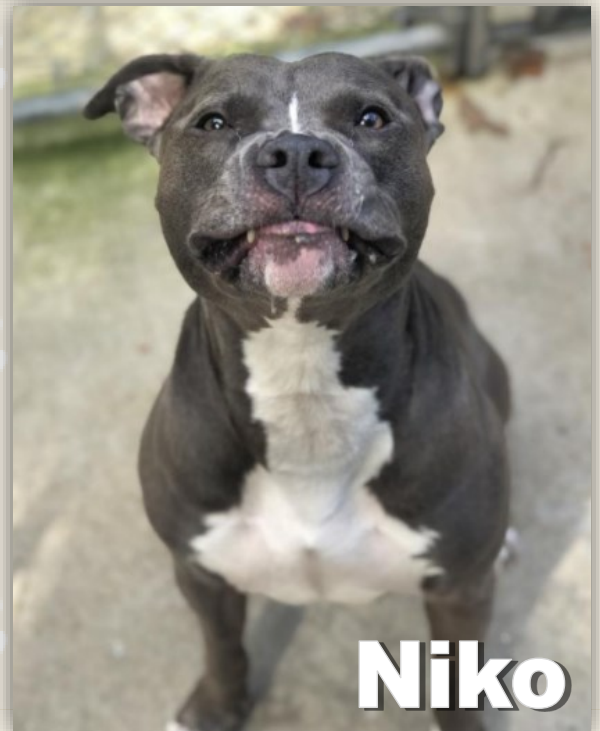

GOT LUNCH! Laconia has the Best Community Partners and Volunteers Ever!

GOT LUNCH! Laconia concludes Year 10 of the GOT LUNCH! Laconia program, delivering groceries to an average of 540 children for 11 weeks of the summer.

Vista Foods, here in downtown Laconia, a partner of Associated Grocers of New England, are real heroes in the hearts and minds of the GOT LUNCH! Laconia's Advisory Board. Robert Fitzpatrick, store manager, Jordan Swanson and Michelle Dion go above and beyond what would be expected of an employee to assure that the children of Laconia don't go hungry. VISTA Foods produces the dairy vouchers distributed each week, and they made sure we had all the bread, fruit and baby carrots we needed. When we had an urgent need they did all they could to meet our needs. During the spring when GOT LUNCH! Laconia partnered with Laconia Schools to deliver food to the children in the district – the food distribution system was way out of whack and getting the quantities of food we needed was a challenge, to say the least. VISTA Foods contributed greatly to make that part of our program a success. Thank you VISTA FOODS for all you do.

Irwin Marine, another great community partner for seven years, has donated a canoe, kayak, game pad and a \$250 gift certificate that we auctioned off. The money raised fed close to 15 children for the entire summer. Thank You Irwin Marine!

The partnership with the Laconia School District and the relationship that we have developed over the years are so important to the success of the program – THANK YOU Laconia School District!

And what would we do without our loyal and talented team of coordinators and volunteers. This year we had far fewer volunteers than we usually have due to COVID 19. Fewer volunteers meant a lot more work for each volunteer. We made several adjustments to the program due to COVID 19 but one of our favorites was to invite the "Cereal Heroes" of Pleasant Street School to come carry every bag packed with food from the Church Hall directly to the cars. Their energy and commitment to the work each and every Monday morning of the summer was greatly appreciated by all.

Here are some interesting statistics about the program:

- Ten years, ten Mondays = 100 delivery days. * 260,000 meals delivered (over a quarter million) * Over 240,000 pounds of product (that's 120,000 tons) (not including veggies) * No injuries that Bengay or Aleve couldn't cure. * No government financial assistance * Great support from Laconia School and City employees. * A million smiles from children, parents, and volunteers * Great support from City residents and businesses. THANK YOU ALL – this is a wonderful place to live!

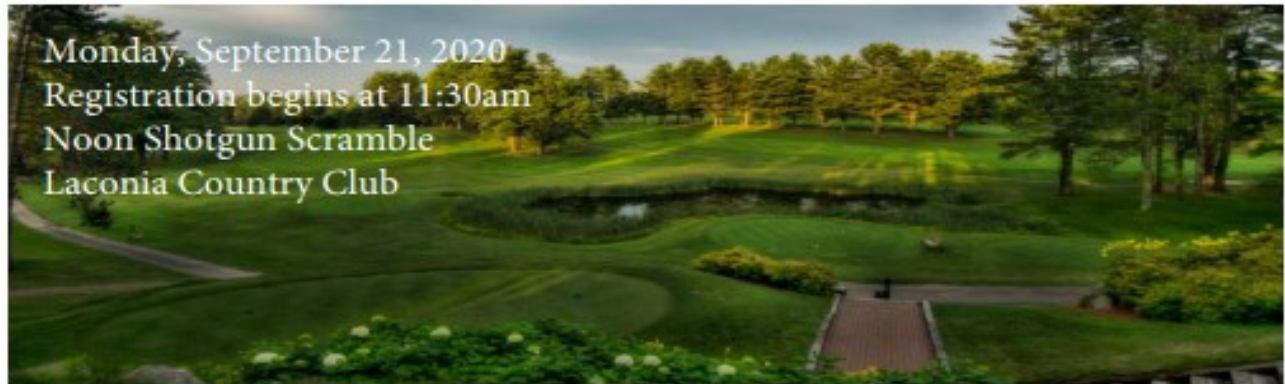

At The Change of Seasons, Where's Your Trailer?

*A guide to storing boats,
trailers and RVs on
your property*

With the end of the warmer weather and winter just around the corner, people are moving their grownup "toys" that require trailers. If you're looking to store your summer toys or getting your winter fun ready, the City's Zoning Enforcement Office would like to remind residents there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten during these busy times.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which include any kind of trailers, including campers, boats, trailers with either jet skis or snow machines, any motorized recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 ft. of any lot line. (See the City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 (L) Storage of Recreational Vehicles.)

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards, including the driveway area in front of the house.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be. Failure to comply with the Zoning Ordinance can lead to fines or court action.

THEN ...

This was the Upper Messer Street Crossing, Laconia, in April 1927, looking down the tracks toward the gas house, with one of the gas holding tanks visible in distance at right. Various sheds and other outbuildings occupy the space at left, some 21 years before Bisson Avenue was constructed. This is the area of the city long known as 'Sin Hollow' and, at one time, the locale for encounters between certain Laconia and Lakeport youth. It was also the first location for Daniel Nick's Junkyard, which later moved to Province Road and, still later, to Prescott Hill. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The WOW Trail now parallels the railroad tracks between here and Lakeport Square in one direction and down Messer Street in the other. Bisson Avenue provides a shortcut between Messer Street and Union Avenue, via Strafford Street and the Irwin Automotive Group occupies space, at left, on Bisson Avenue as well as the site, at right, of the former gas plant for a display lot. 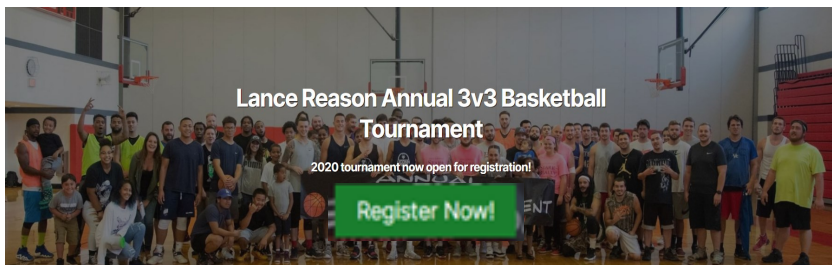

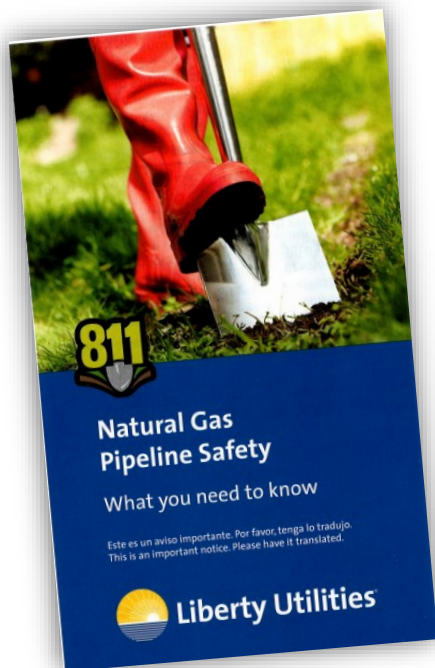

WORLD WATER MONITORING DAY

THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 18TH, 2020

“World Water Monitoring Day engages people of all ages in monitoring the condition of local rivers, streams, estuaries and other waterbodies. Conducting simple monitoring tests teaches participants about some of the most common indicators of water health and encourages further participation in more formal citizen monitoring efforts.” (See note 1 for source)

The City of Laconia frequently monitors and samples Paugus Bay and its tributaries, participating in the NH Department of Environmental Services (NHDES) [Volunteer River Assessment Program \(VRAP\)](#), and the Lakes Lay Monitoring Program through UNH Cooperative Extension. Winnisquam Lake and Lake Winnepesaukee are also monitored with the help of Winnisquam Watershed Network, Lake Winnepesaukee Association, UNH, and others.

Due to COVID-19 constraints, the City will only be conducting VRAP sampling this year of Paugus Bay tributaries. If you have an interest in volunteering to assist with sampling, please contact the Conservation/Planner Technician at 603-527-1264. Prior experience is helpful but not necessary. Typically samples are taken the first week of every month, April-October. Social distancing and other precautions will be taken.

With the outbreak of COVID-19 and continued risk of exposure, the Food Festival committee was challenged to salvage a 23-year tradition of being engaged in good works for the community. The dedicated and creative members of the TBI food festival committee came up with an online version of this popular annual event. The results were incredible and made this 23rd year of the Jewish Food Festival an outstanding success. Here are some of the mind-blowing statistics:

- 280 lbs of beef brisket purchased (used in both the brisket and gravy as well as the meat knishes)
- 26 gallons of matzo ball soup
- 560 meat knishes
- 74 lbs. of rugelach
- 830 blintzes
- 365 potato knishes
- 60 individual 8" square noodle kugels
- 40 challah breads

The members of Temple B'nai Israel want to thank the Lakes Region community and those who traveled from all around the state for their patronage and, in addition, the support of the local media including Adam Hirshan and the Laconia Daily Sun, Pat Kelly at 107.7 FM, Jeff Levitan of Northeast Communications and The Weirs Times for help in getting the word out about this virtual event.
