**FLUSHABLE
WIPES
CAUSE CLOGS**

“Flushable”: We Don’t Think It Means What You Think It Means!

What’s flushable and what isn’t? Hint: It’s toilet paper and human waste because proper flushing is imperative for maintaining your septic system as well as municipal sewer systems and wastewater treatment plants. Among the many odd things people try to flush down the drain, the main, nasty culprit is the so-called “flushable wipe.”

And now it’s not just bathroom wipes we have to contend with; we are seeing more and more *cleaning* wipes claiming to be “flushable”, such as multi-surface wipes. Beware: If you believe the packaging, you may find a bigger mess than you started with. Those so-called “flushable” wipes, designed to clean with convenience, could wreak havoc right below your feet.

Although these products may disappear from your toilet bowl after you flush, they can still cause a problem for your septic system and/or sewer line. They can combine with other fats, oils and greases clogging pipes and pumps causing the sewer or septic system to back up into your home, creating a costly mess.

Some wipes that aren’t labeled as flushable still state that the product will break up after flushing, but none will break down enough. According to GreenAmerica.org, a study out of Canada (released in April 2019) tested 101 wipes on the market for flushability and not a single one passed. There are no restrictions on companies labeling their products as “flushable,” so consumers need to know what will happen if they do flush the wipes.

If using these wipes is necessary, please throw them in the trash. Better yet, look into more sustainable options for surface cleaning in your home. It may not be as quick and easy, but reusable cloths and non-toxic cleaners are an excellent alternative; you can even use old T-shirts and towels cut into squares. Keep a bucket under your sink to store used cloths until laundry day, then wash and repeat!

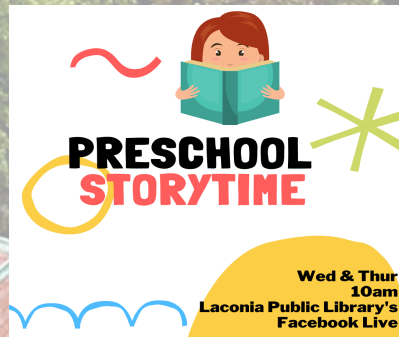

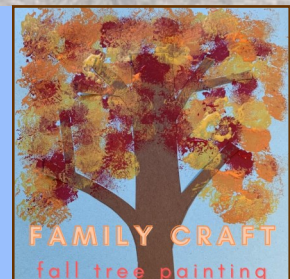


Children's 3-In-1 Halloween Food Craft: October 6, 2020, 4:00-4:45 pm

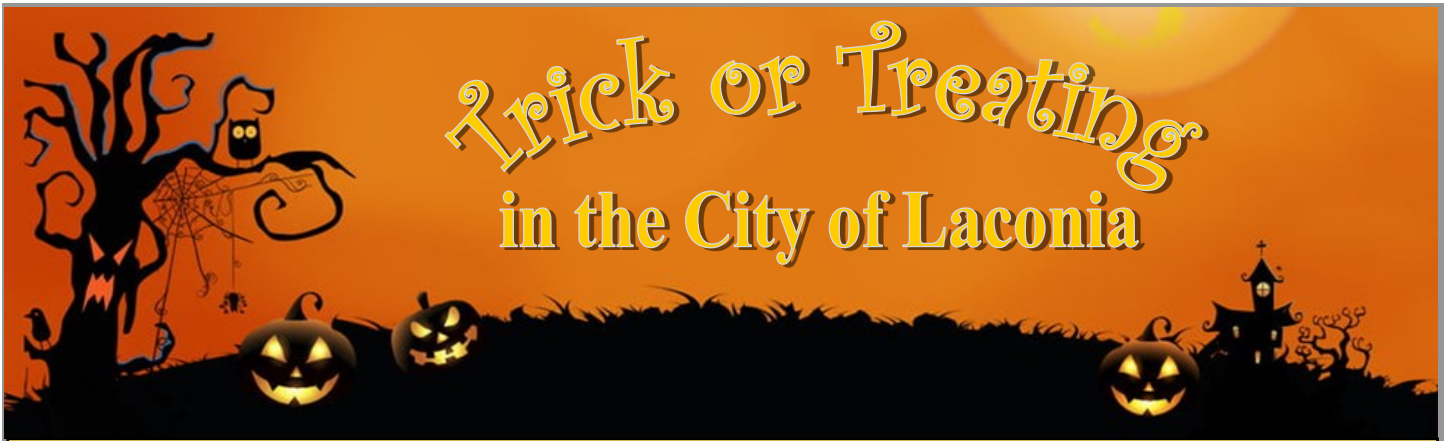

Please see the information below regarding Halloween and Trick-or-Treating in the City of Laconia this year.....

The CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) has released guidelines to be sure you and your family can stay safe and still enjoy Halloween this year.

Trick-or-Treating hours on Halloween (Saturday, October 31st) will be from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. The City will be providing opportunities for folks to enjoy traditional trick-or-treating, as well as a brand new event happening at Opechee Park!

We will have one-way trick-or-treating outside at Opechee Park on Saturday, October 31st from 5:00 to 7:00 pm, hosted by the City's Parks and Recreation Department. Participants will register upon arriving, and controls will be in place to keep both trick-or-treaters and those giving out candy socially distanced. Treats will be individually bagged and there will be costume judging. Masks are required for all participants and hand sanitizer will be available. Volunteers, people wishing to provide and hand out candy, and trick-or-treaters are needed; more information is available [here](#). This is a free event! For questions or additional information, please call the Parks and Recreation Department at 524-5046.

There will also be an opportunity available for those who prefer a more "traditional" Halloween. From 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm on October 31st households that wish to give out candy are asked to leave an outside light on during those hours. Trick-or-treaters should only stop at those houses where an outside light is on. The CDC recommends that those giving out candy set up a table outside, perhaps in their driveways, to place candy on rather than handing it out and greeting trick-or-treaters at the door as is typically done. Mask wearing is encouraged by all participants, whether giving or getting candy.

How would you like to help your fellow Laconia citizens? With just a few hours of your time each month you can make a difference and fill an important service. The City currently has an urgent need for people to serve on the Zoning Board of Adjustment. We need both a regular member and four alternates for the Board. There is one meeting a month, scheduled in the early evening.

Alternate members fill in at meetings for regular members that can't make that meeting or, for some other reason, can't sit on a particular application. Being an alternate member is a great way to learn how the Board functions and many times leads to becoming a regular member, if desired. No experience is needed as we will train you. All you need is a willingness to learn and be fair and open minded.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment is responsible for granting relief to zoning regulations and granting special exceptions. The Zoning Board meets the third Monday of each month. Any questions about serving on this Board can be directed to the Planning and Zoning Department at 527-1264. Ask for Director Dean Trefethen or Assistant Director Rob Mora.

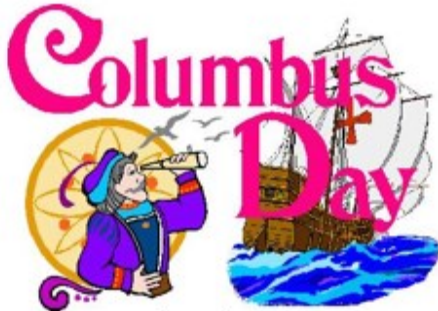

THEN ...

Urban Renewal reached the Keller-Bean Block (at left), 531-539 Main Street, Laconia, 50 years ago this week with award of a demolition contract (involving seven buildings and sections of two others in the Main Street area and on Union Avenue). After an Oct. 30, 1928, fire, the brick building had replaced earlier wooden structures dating from the early 1860s. Long home to the Baker Remnant Store and Keller Confectionery, the building was also home to the Reliable Clothing Co., which had relocated from an earlier site down the street near 'Baldi's Corner' to space long occupied by the John M. Guay Hardware Co. The Endicott Johnson Shoe Store had been another occupant of the building, which was razed in early December 1970. Two wooden buildings at right (the former Crystal Cafe, later Matheson's; and Pitman Hardware, later the Sears Catalog Store) had been demolished in late April 1969. ... AND NOW

The entire east side of Main Street, from Mill Street to the Winnepesaukee River, is now occupied by the Municipal Parking Garage, opened in June 1974. After 24 years as a pedestrian mall (1970-1994), this section of Main Street from Bank Square to the river was reopened to one-way traffic and limited parking in July 1994. 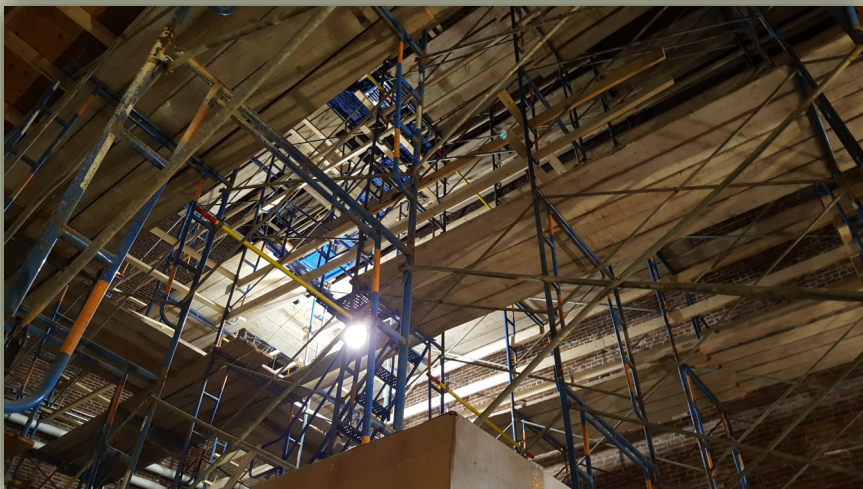
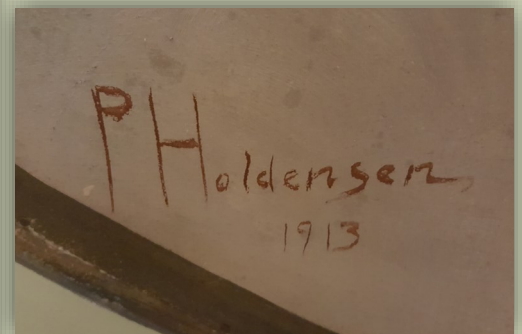
- Drive slowly and stay alert.

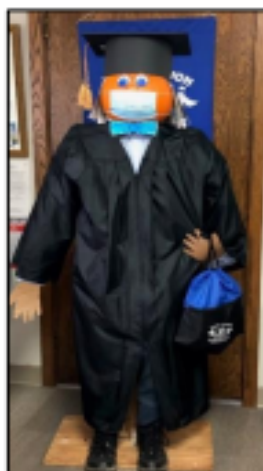
1st Annual Pumpkin Figure Contest Is Up and Running
