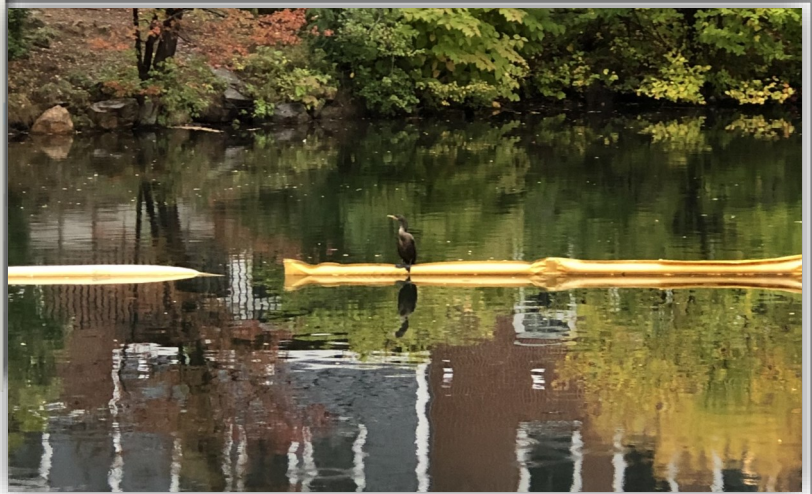

Lake Drawdowns

Lake Opechee & Winnisquam Lake drawdowns begin October 17



Lake drawdowns are conducted each fall to reduce winter ice damage to shoreline properties and to reduce spring flooding. Drawdowns also give property owners an opportunity to conduct any necessary repairs to their waterfront property, provided they first secure a permit from the DES Wetlands Bureau at (603) 271-2147.

Generally, lake levels are allowed to return to the normal full pond level in the spring. However, the drawdowns of Opechee and Winnisquam Lakes, which occur on a two-year interval, last only approximately two weeks. This year, the lowering of Opechee Lake will begin on October 17, and it will likely take two days to pass the water from Opechee Lake downstream through Winnisquam Lake. Therefore, the level of Winnisquam Lake is not expected to drop noticeably until October 19. On October 30, flows at Lakeport Dam will be increased to refill Opechee Lake, and the level of Winnisquam Lake should begin to rise late in the day on November 1. 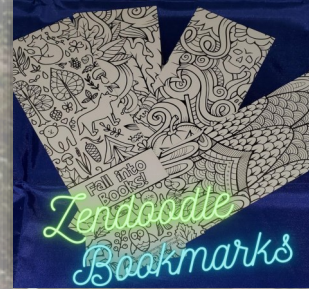

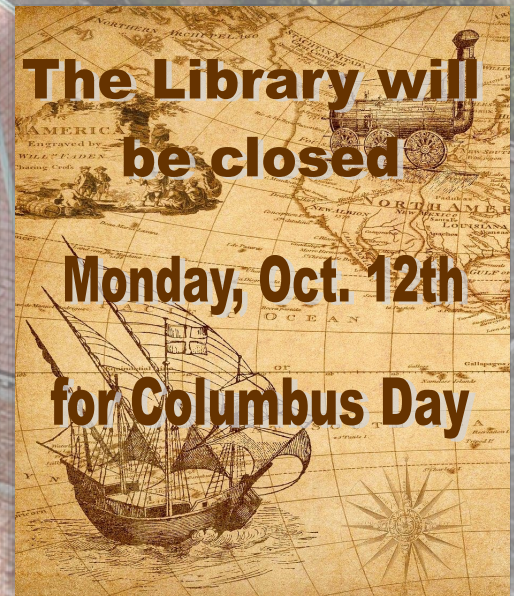

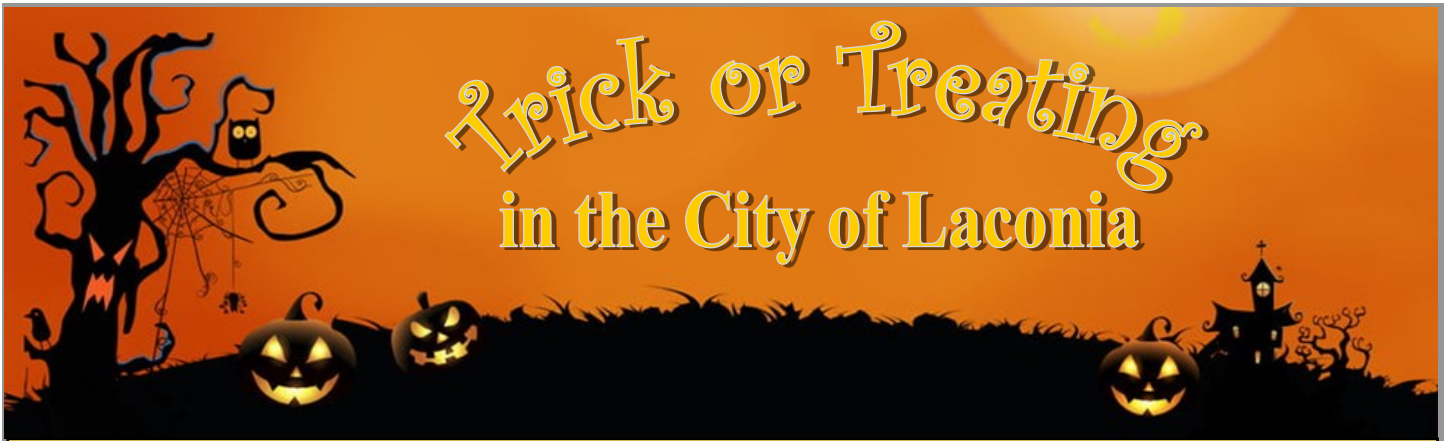

Please see the information below regarding Halloween and Trick-or-Treating in the City of Laconia this year.....

The CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) has released guidelines to be sure you and your family can stay safe and still enjoy Halloween this year.

Trick-or-Treating hours on Halloween (Saturday, October 31st) will be from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. The City will be providing opportunities for folks to enjoy traditional trick-or-treating, as well as a brand new event happening at Opechee Park!

We will have one-way trick-or-treating outside at Opechee Park on Saturday, October 31st from 5:00 to 7:00 pm, hosted by the City's Parks and Recreation Department. Participants will register upon arriving, and controls will be in place to keep both trick-or-treaters and those giving out candy socially distanced. Treats will be individually bagged and there will be costume judging. Masks are required for all participants and hand sanitizer will be available. Volunteers, people wishing to provide and hand out candy, and trick-or-treaters are needed; more information is available [here](#). This is a free event! For questions or additional information, please call the Parks and Recreation Department at 524-5046.

There will also be an opportunity available for those who prefer a more "traditional" Halloween. From 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm on October 31st households that wish to give out candy are asked to leave an outside light on during those hours. Trick-or-treaters should only stop at those houses where an outside light is on. The CDC recommends that those giving out candy set up a table outside, perhaps in their driveways, to place candy on rather than handing it out and greeting trick-or-treaters at the door as is typically done. Mask wearing is encouraged by all participants, whether giving or getting candy.

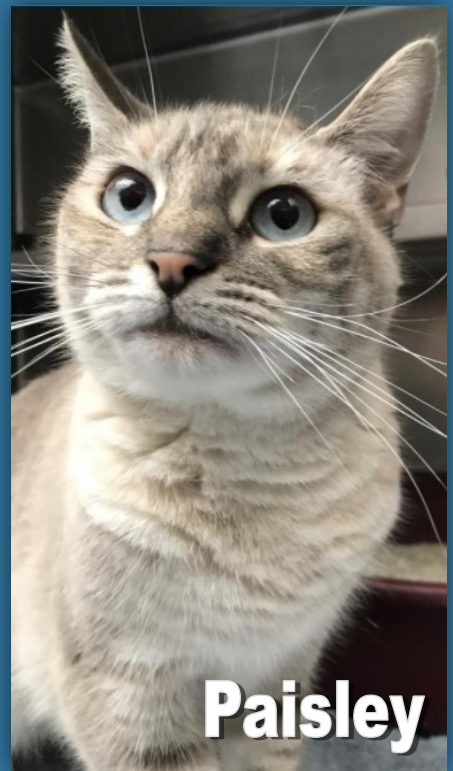

Coverage for any plan changes made during AEP begins on January 1, 2021.

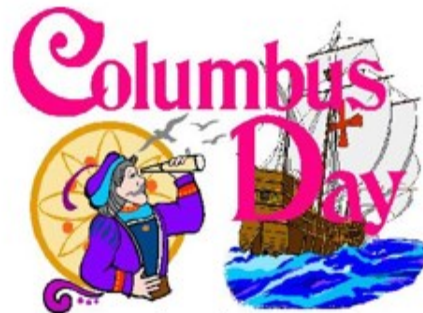

Be on the Lookout: Contact Tracing Scams



Contact tracing is key to slowing the spread of COVID-19 and helps protect you, your family, and your community by:

- Letting people know they may have been exposed to COVID-19 and should monitor their health for signs and symptoms of COVID-19,
- Helping people who may have been exposed to COVID-19 get tested, and
- Asking people to self-isolate or self-quarantine to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 infection to others.

Green flags

- Contact tracers will:
 - 📞 Be state or local Department of Health employees or their contractors,
 - 📞 Ask about your personal symptoms to gauge for possible COVID-19 infection,
 - 📞 Ask about others you may have come into contact with recently,
 - 📞 Be able to refer you to other medical and social resources, and
 - 📞 Ask whether you have insurance so they can connect those who are not insured with resources.

Red flags

- Be cautious of anyone who:
 - 📞 Asks for specifics about your health insurance, like your Medicare number,
 - 📞 Claims they need a credit card or cash to pay for a COVID-19 test, or
 - 📞 Wants your personal information to help you set up a COVID-19 test.

How Can Your Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) Help?

Your local SMP is ready to provide you with the information you need to **PROTECT** yourself from Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse; **DETECT** potential fraud, errors, and abuse; and **REPORT** your concerns. SMPs and their trained teams help educate and empower Medicare beneficiaries in the fight against health care fraud. Your SMP can help you with your questions, concerns, or complaints about potential fraud and abuse issues. It also can provide information and educational presentations.

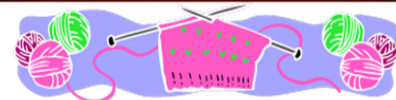

THEN ...

Maurice Gouin held a grand opening, Aug. 2, 1972, for Maurice's Bath and Kitchen Center, 570 Union Ave., in a 2,000-square-foot building originally built for T&E Cleaners in 1954-1955 and later occupied, in 1969, by Mr. Beef, 'a hamburger, etc., drive-in.' Gouin added a second story with gambrel roof in 1977 and, in 1979, expanded the structure as the Midtown Plaza, adding a wing to either side and, in front, a silo. Over the years, the structure was home to a number of businesses and offices, including the Belknap Chiropractic Life Center as well as Kenneth C. Rafferty, Chiropractor, and Mac-Durgin, in the early 2000s. (Courtesy photo from Facebook post)



... AND NOW

After Gouin Plumbing & Heating relocated to 6 Winnisquam Ave., the structure became known as the Mac-Durgin Building. Ten years ago this week, after the Sundial Shop closed, 'with it went the local franchise of the JCPenney Catalog Center.' But after a summer off, the catalog center had reopened, Sept. 16, 2010, having found a home at Mac-Durgin Business Systems, located on Union Avenue. 'It may seem like an odd pairing. After all, what does Mac-Durgin, which sells office equipment, furniture and supplies, have to do with JCPenney catalog sales?' asked The Laconia Daily Sun rhetorically. Mac-Durgin owner Diane LaBrie said her firm was customer-service oriented and the catalog operation was 'taking care of customers in the same way that Mac-Durgin has survived by taking good care of its clientele.' Mac-Durgin merged with Seacoast Business Machines in 2013 and thereafter the building's tenants included Capital City Pawnbrokers and a used clothing store, Prior Attire. As of today, the outdoor fire ban is still in effect per the State and the Governor. As a reminder of the restrictions, please see below. Please note the addition of the fireworks ban in the City of Laconia!

It shall be unlawful for any person in the State to:

- Kindle an open fire, including fires built for camping, the burning of debris, or warming, on all public trails or other public property, excluding public campgrounds.
- Smoke a pipe, cigar and/or cigarette outdoors in or near public woodlands or on public trails.
- Kindle a Category 3 fire; a fire greater than 4 ft. in diameter or a fire not contained within a ring of fire resistive material.

What this means is:

- All fires are prohibited on public lands, except in a campground.
- Category 3 fires are banned everywhere, public and private lands.
- Category 1 (small controlled fires no greater than 2 ft. in diameter) and Category 2 fires (controlled fires no greater than 4 ft. in diameter), both contained in a ring of fire resistant material or portable fireplace, are allowed on private property with a fire permit
- No smoking is allowed in or near public woodlands or on public trails.

Due to the extremely dry weather, and with a burning ban already in place, Laconia Fire Department is adding the shooting of fireworks to the burn ban. Shooting of fireworks in the City will not be allowed until fire conditions change.

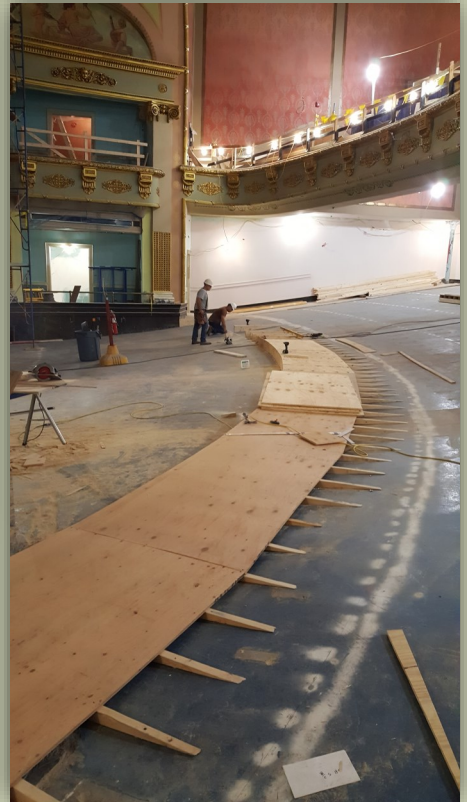

At The Change of Seasons, *A guide to storing boats, trailers Where's Your Trailer? and RVs on your property*

With the end of the warmer weather and winter just around the corner, people are moving their grownup "toys" that require trailers. If you're looking to store your summer toys or getting your winter fun ready, the City's Zoning Enforcement Office would like to remind residents there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten during these busy times.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which include any kind of trailers, including campers, boats, trailers with either jet skis or snow machines, any motorized recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 ft. of any lot line. (See the City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 (L) Storage of Recreational Vehicles.)

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards, including the driveway area in front of the house.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be. Failure to comply with the Zoning Ordinance can lead to fines or court action.
