Portable Basketball Hoops

Portable basketball hoops are prohibited from being in the City's right of way. Due to the impact of COVID-19 on the City's Parks and Recreation programs, Public Works has not been requiring property owners to remove their hoops from the City right of way during the pandemic.

However, winter is coming and property owners need to move their hoops such that they are no longer adjacent to public roads or sidewalks. This will ensure they are not a hazard to Public Works employees as they remove snow and ice from the City's streets.

The fine for obstructing a City sidewalk or City street is \$75 for a first offense and it increases to \$250 after multiple offenses. Beginning October 26, 2020 Public Works will begin fining property owners whose hoops are still in the right of way. Please remove the hoops before October 26th in the event of an early season snow or ice storm. Questions? Please call Public Works at 528-6379.



Trick or Treating in the City of Laconia

Please see the information below regarding Halloween and Trick-or-Treating in the City of Laconia this year.....

The CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) has released guidelines to be sure you and your family can stay safe and still enjoy Halloween this year.

Trick-or-Treating hours on Halloween (Saturday, October 31st) will be from 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm. The City will be providing opportunities for folks to enjoy traditional trick-or-treating, as well as a brand new City-sponsored event happening at Opechee Park!

We will have one-way trick-or-treating outside at Opechee Park on Saturday, October 31st from 5:00 to 7:00 pm, hosted by the City's Parks and Recreation Department. Participants will register upon arriving, and controls will be in place to keep both trick-or-treaters and those giving out candy socially distanced. Treats will be individually bagged and there will be costume judging. Masks are required for all participants and hand sanitizer will be available. Volunteers, people wishing to hand out candy, and trick-or-treaters are needed; more information is available [here](#). Please also check the next page of this newsletter for up-to-the-minute details. This is a free event! There will also be an opportunity available for those who prefer a more "traditional" Halloween. From 5:00 pm to 7:00 pm on October 31st households that wish to give out candy are asked to leave an outside light on during those hours. Trick-or-treaters should only stop at those houses where an outside light is on. The CDC recommends that those giving out candy set up a table outside, perhaps in their driveways, to place candy on rather than handing it out and greeting trick-or-treaters at the door as is typically done. Mask wearing is encouraged by all participants, whether giving or getting candy.

The General Election is Tuesday, November 3, 2020, See below for important information on voting in the City of Laconia!

How do I register to vote?

To register to vote in the City of Laconia, you will need to provide proof of identify (driver's license), proof of domicile (piece of mail showing name and physical address) and proof of citizenship (birth certificate, passport, or naturalization papers). If you do not have proof of domicile and/or citizenship, there is an affidavit you can sign when registering to vote.

City Hall is open from 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday-Friday. The last day to register to vote in the City Clerk's office is Wednesday, October 21st. The Supervisors of the Checklist will meet that day between 7 pm and 7:30 pm in the City Clerk's Office for the purpose of making corrections/changes to the checklist. Registrations and changes will be accepted at this session; no changes will be accepted after this session.

How do I request an absentee ballot?

Please request your absentee ballot as soon as possible by contacting the City Clerk's office (527-1265), by clicking [here](#) to fill out an application, or visiting City Hall to obtain an application. Completed applications can be dropped off at the City Clerk's Office (Laconia City Hall, 45 Beacon St. East), faxed to 524-1766, mailed to the City Clerk's Office, PO Box 489, Laconia, NH or emailed to cityclerk@laconianh.gov.

How do I complete the absentee ballot?

Your absentee ballot will come with a set of instructions and two envelopes; an affidavit envelope and a return envelope. Once you complete your ballot, place it in the affidavit envelope and seal it. Please sign one of the two affidavits on that envelope that best suits your situation. (For the purpose of COVID-19, please sign the Physically Disabled Affidavit section). Put the affidavit envelope into the return envelope, seal and mail or deliver it.

An absentee ballot can only be returned by mail, in person by the voter, or by a delivery agent*. You may return your completed ballot in person to the City Clerk's office or leave it with the greeter in the City Hall lobby. Please do not return your absentee ballot by placing it in the drop box slot on the side of City Hall.. Any ballots left in that location will not be counted.

Absentee ballots will be accepted by mail, in-person by the voter, or by a delivery agent through 5 pm the day before Election Day at the City Clerk's Office. On Election Day, absentee ballots will only be accepted in-person or by a delivery agent until 5 pm at the City Clerk's Office.

You may notice that the mailing envelope provided to mail your absentee ballot states "extra postage may be required". Please be sure to have two stamps affixed to this envelope before mailing.

**Delivery agent is defined as someone else delivering your ballot to the City Clerk's Office. Please contact the City Clerk's office for details if someone else will be delivering your ballot for you.*

How do I know my absentee ballot was received?

You can track the progress of your absentee ballot on the State of New Hampshire Secretary of State's website [here](#). You can verify receipt of your application, obtain the date when your absentee ballot was mailed to you, and the date the City Clerk's office receives your completed absentee ballot.



Be on the Lookout: Contact Tracing Scams



Contact tracing is key to slowing the spread of COVID-19 and helps protect you, your family, and your community by:

- Letting people know they may have been exposed to COVID-19 and should monitor their health for signs and symptoms of COVID-19,
- Helping people who may have been exposed to COVID-19 get tested, and
- Asking people to self-isolate or self-quarantine to reduce the risk of spreading COVID-19 infection to others.

Green flags

- Contact tracers will:
 - Be state or local Department of Health employees or their contractors,
 - Ask about your personal symptoms to gauge for possible COVID-19 infection,
 - Ask about others you may have come into contact with recently,
 - Be able to refer you to other medical and social resources, and
 - Ask whether you have insurance so they can connect those who are not insured with resources.

Red flags

- Be cautious of anyone who:
 - Asks for specifics about your health insurance, like your Medicare number,
 - Claims they need a credit card or cash to pay for a COVID-19 test, or
 - Wants your personal information to help you set up a COVID-19 test.

How Can Your Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) Help?

Your local SMP is ready to provide you with the information you need to **PROTECT** yourself from Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse; **DETECT** potential fraud, errors, and abuse; and **REPORT** your concerns. SMPs and their trained teams help educate and empower Medicare beneficiaries in the fight against health care fraud. Your SMP can help you with your questions, concerns, or complaints about potential fraud and abuse issues. It also can provide information and educational presentations.

As of today, the outdoor fire ban is still in effect per the State and the Governor. As a reminder of the restrictions, please see below. Please note the addition of the fireworks ban in the City of Laconia!

It shall be unlawful for any person in the State to:

- Kindle an open fire, including fires built for camping, the burning of debris, or warming, on all public trails or other public property, excluding public campgrounds.
- Smoke a pipe, cigar and/or cigarette outdoors in or near public woodlands or on public trails.
- Kindle a Category 3 fire; a fire greater than 4 ft. in diameter or a fire not contained within a ring of fire resistive material.

What this means is:

- All fires are prohibited on public lands, except in a campground.
- Category 3 fires are banned everywhere, public and private lands.
- Category 1 (small controlled fires no greater than 2 ft. in diameter) and Category 2 fires (controlled fires no greater than 4 ft. in diameter), both contained in a ring of fire resistant material or portable fireplace, are allowed on private property with a fire permit
- No smoking is allowed in or near public woodlands or on public trails.

Due to the extremely dry weather, and with a burning ban already in place, Laconia Fire Department is adding the shooting of fireworks to the burn ban. Shooting of fireworks in the City will not be allowed until fire conditions change.

THEN . . .

A deed search indicates that the house at 243 Court St. (far left) was probably built between 1889 and 1890 by George E. Davis, a soap manufacturer. An atlas published in 1892 indicates Davis as the owner. In the 1930s, the owner was Benjamin T. Daley and Mrs. Eunice Daley was listed as proprietor of 'The Gateway Inn, rooms.' From the 1960s to mid-1980s, Zephirin Belleau was the owner and proprietor of Zip's Used Cars, with a cement block garage at the rear of the property and Bertha E. Drouin rented out rooms and ran a used furniture business in the house. Zip died in 2009 at age 94. Part of the Stafford Oil Co. offices is glimpsed at right. (Courtesy photo from Facebook)

Lake Drawdowns

Lake Opechee & Winnisquam Lake drawdowns begin October 17



Lake drawdowns are conducted each fall to reduce winter ice damage to shoreline properties and to reduce spring flooding. Drawdowns also give property owners an opportunity to conduct any necessary repairs to their waterfront property, provided they first secure a permit from the DES Wetlands Bureau at (603) 271-2147.

Generally, lake levels are allowed to return to the normal full pond level in the spring. However, the drawdowns of Opechee and Winnisquam Lakes, which occur on a two-year interval, last only approximately two weeks. This year, the lowering of Opechee Lake will begin on October 17, and it will likely take two days to pass the water from Opechee Lake downstream through Winnisquam Lake. Therefore, the level of Winnisquam Lake is not expected to drop noticeably until October 19. On October 30, flows at Lakeport Dam will be increased to refill Opechee Lake, and the level of Winnisquam Lake should begin to rise late in the day on November 1.



10 Ways to Enjoy Winter Squash

Winter squash (i.e. pumpkin, butternut, acorn, delicata, spaghetti, etc.) is in season and packed with wonderful nutrients and flavor! It is a good source of vitamin A, vitamin C, vitamin B6, and fiber, which are great for our skin, immune systems, brains, and digestive tracts. All those deep yellow and orange colors are also loaded with antioxidants! Here are some healthy ways to enjoy it:

- Roast it and use it on salads.

Nothing is Scarier than Spreading COVID-19 this Halloween

- Stay home if you are not feeling well.
- Consider wearing a mask over your nose and mouth when trick-or-treating and handing out treats.
- Avoid large gatherings or parties and find ways to trick-or-treat while staying at least 6 feet away from others, including when handing out and accepting treats
- Practice frequent hand cleaning – bring a bottle of alcohol-based hand sanitizer with you while trick-or-treating, and use it often.

For Motorists

Pursuant to a recent change in New Hampshire law, absentee ballots received in the Laconia City Hall before Thursday, October 29th, 2020 will be partially processed on October 29th, 2020 at the Laconia Community Center, 306 Union Avenue, Laconia NH 03246. This process will be open to the public as required by law. Wards 1, 2, and 3 will begin partial processing at 9:00 am and Wards 4, 5, and 6 will begin at 1:00 pm.

All observers must be six feet from the absentee ballot envelopes. Partial processing means that the Moderator and election officials will open the outer envelope, remove and examine the inner affidavit envelope, without opening it, determine whether the affidavit envelope has been properly executed (RSA 659:50, I (b)). We will publicly announce the name of the voter and make a notation on the check list. After the partial processing, the ballots will be kept in a secure location until the day of the election. This is the only session that will be held prior to the election on November 3rd, 2020. Also, the partial processing will be completed in accordance with the procedure outlined in law.
