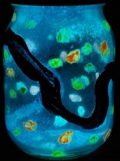

On Saturday Nov. 21,  
from 12:00 pm-4:00 pm,  
the Laconia/Gilford Lions  
Club, in association with

of Laconia, will hold a plastic bag recycling  
collection event - a 'Plastics Round-up' - at the  
parking lot of the UU meetinghouse at 172  
Pleasant Street in Laconia.

All types of plastic bags - grocery bags, produce  
bags, store bags, ice bags, bread bags,  
newspaper sleeves, Ziploc & other disposable  
bags, bubble wrap - will be accepted. All donat-  
ed items will then be transported via our  
'Collections Caravan' to disposal bins at area  
stores where they will be recycled properly.  
Plastics must be clean, dry and free of food &  
organic residue. There is no charge or fee  
involved.

Drop off your unwanted plastics and help raise  
awareness of how these items can be kept out  
of our ecosystem via easy, safe, responsible  
recycling. Help us wrangle those plastics, herd  
them together and hit the trail to take them on  
their last ride! Volunteers collecting bags will be

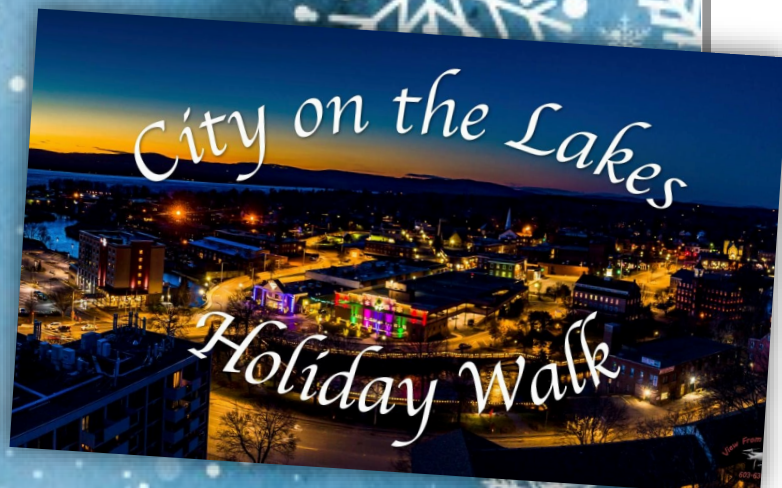

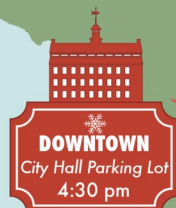

## SURVEY OF TRASH AND RECYCLING CONTAINERS

The City of Laconia, as part of its efforts to improve the quality of life in the City and to control the growth of costs associated with disposing of solid waste, is considering converting from a manual collection system to an automated collection system.

An automated collection system has a single operator in the truck and the operator uses a mechanical arm to empty the containers. This option can reduce the City's curbside collection costs and is safer for the workers who collect solid waste.

All solid waste containers must be compatible with the plan for this type of collection system. The plan includes the City providing City owned trash and recycling containers to residents and business that are on public highways and meet the criteria for curbside collection under City ordinances.

Approximately 7 years ago the City was selling recycling containers with "Laconia Recycles" stamped on the container as part of its effort to enhance curbside recycling in the City. The stamped imprint on the cans let the driver know that recycling was in those containers. These cans are compatible with automated collection systems.



Many residents and business may have bought trash containers that are also compatible with these systems. A picture of a compatible can is shown (left).



As part of the planning process Public Works is asking those residents and businesses in the City who still have these cans, or similar cans, to let the City know that they have them. Your reply will help the City determine how many cans it needs to buy allowing us to continue the planning process.

To make it easy for residents and business to reply, the City has created a page on its web site to collect your responses. The website will collect addresses but not names. Your reply will enable the City to determine the cost of conversion to an automated system. Your replies will also enable the

City to develop its plans for delivering cans in the City if the City Council decides to convert to an automated system.

## Digging/Excavation in the City's Right-of-Way Fees Are Increasing

Starting December 1st, the permit fee for Digging/Excavation in the City's right-of-way will be increased.

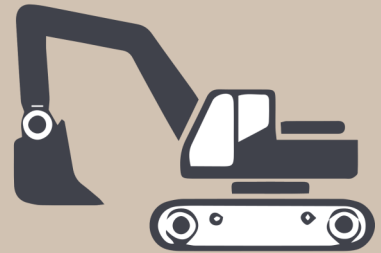
The Administrative/Inspection Fee is increasing from \$75 to \$125.

The City has instituted a street damage charge. This charge is assessed at \$5.00 per square foot of excavation occurring within the paved portions of the public right-of-way or on City property. An infrastructure damage charge of \$2.50 per square foot of excavation will be charged for excavation occurring within the unpaved sidewalk areas of the public right-of-way or on unpaved portions of City property.

Streets that have been paved within the last five years are considered under moratorium and work on these streets is permissible only under certain circumstances.

If an excavation occurs in a street where the pavement is less than 2 years old, the street damage charge is multiplied by three (3). If an excavation occurs in a street where the pavement is 2 years to 5 years old, the street damage charge is multiplied by two (2).

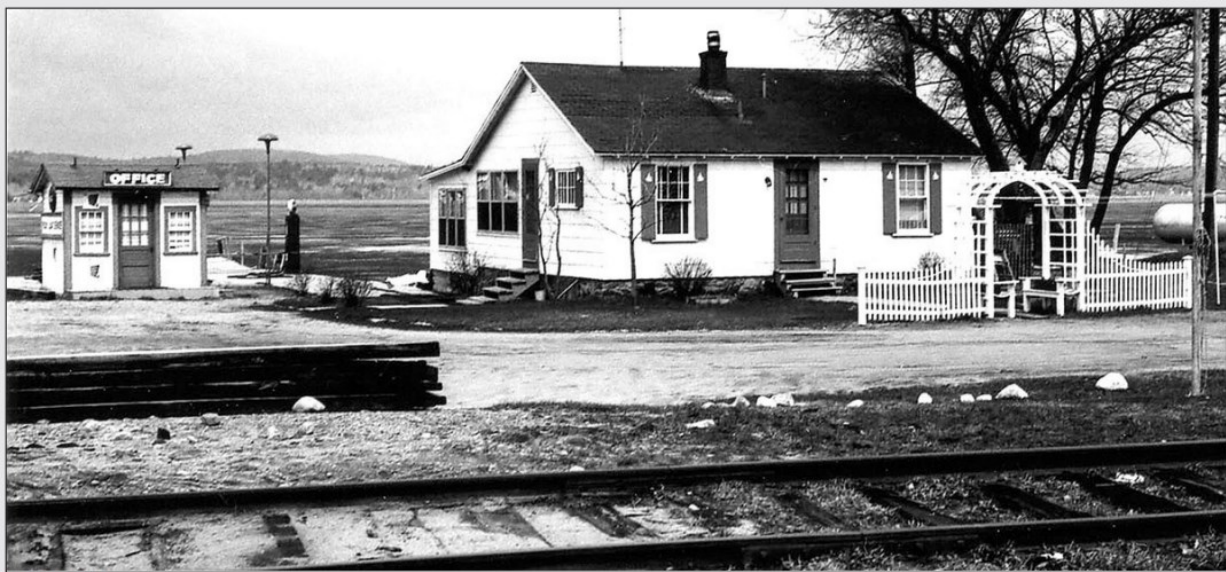

# Our yesterdays

## THEN . . .

in Lakeport, 75 years ago this week in 1945, Carl Wallace was building a cement foundation for his office building (left) at Black Brook for use in connection with his boat business. At night, the 'office' sign was lit up in neon. In this 1961 photo, the Wallace home (moved to this location in 1946) is seen at right, with the Black Brook railroad crossing off-photo at right and Union Avenue behind the photographer. The Wallaces operated the Foxy boats from this location until Carl's death in 1960. For many years, the Shore Diner was located off-photo at right. (From 'Black Brook,' by Claire Blanchette Clark, published last month.)



## . . . AND NOW

In the fall of 1967, the Wallace House was moved to Route 107 and later razed when the Merrill Fay Ice Arena was erected in 1997. The Union Avenue site became part of the parking lot for a Burger King, which opened, May 20, 1974 and closed, April 20, 2008. Later, Watermark Marine Construction remodeled the Burger King structure (at right) as a Marine Supply Store. The former site of the Wallaces' office and home is located now behind the new condominiums (at left), immediately south of Watermark. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)
