



Intro to Rug Hooking

Beginner Rug Hooking Virtual Workshops Hosted by the Belknap Mill

The Belknap Mill is pleased to offer its second textile workshop as part of its year-long series in 2021. This 5-week virtual workshop will take place on Thursday evenings from 6 pm - 8 pm, April 1st - April 29th. Instructor Pam Bartlett, will teach the art and craft of rug hooking, a traditional New England fiber art that beautifully combines artistic expression and function.

Students will learn the core skills of rug hooking, the history of the craft and complete a 16" x 16" piece. Designs will utilize a "hit and miss" approach to color. Skills learned in this course will allow students to progress to pieces involving more complex designs and color shading in the future. Finished pieces can be designed into a wall hanging, pillow, or a chair pad!

With funding from a grant from the NH State Council on the Arts and program sponsor, Meredith Village Savings Bank, the Mill is able to offer this workshop at a special price of \$120 per participant. The cost includes a kit with a pattern, all material required to complete the 16" x 16" piece, 12" quilting hoop, a rug hook, and small group virtual instruction for 5-weeks. (A small pair of scissors will also be required.)

CITY OF LACONIA - NOTICE SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT

Effective March 8, 2021 at 6:00 am, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited the use of all streets in the City except for State roads, the City's arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found [here](#).

Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City's Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations as shown below:

Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.

One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:


- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships





Think Twice Before Buying Easter Chicks

With Easter coming soon, you'll be seeing ads for Easter chicks. Aww...aren't they cute? However, the City considers chickens, even the cute little chicks, to be livestock and NOT pets. In most areas of the City, livestock including chickens, are not allowed to be kept on the property.

Chickens, ducks, guinea hens, pigs, goats, and other agricultural animals are not permitted in most districts in the urban/suburban districts in Laconia. Agriculture and agricultural animals are permitted in the RR1 (Residential Rural), RR2 (Residential Rural Corridor) and AI (Airport Industrial) districts. In the CR (Commercial Resort) district, agriculture and the animals typically associated with agriculture are only allowed by Special Exception granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment. If you're not sure what zoning district you live in, check your tax card on the City [website](#) or call the Planning office at 524-1264 to find out.

A good idea is to keep your chick purchases to the pink marshmallow kind!







Medicare's Coverage of Care at Home

Home health care includes a wide range of health and social services delivered in your home to treat illness or injury. Medicare covers these services if you qualify.

- Skilled nursing services provided up to seven days per week for generally more than eight hours per day and 28 hours per week.
- Skilled therapy services such as physical, speech, and occupation therapy.
- Home health aide services, so long as you require skilled care or are at risk of medical complications if you go untreated.
- Medical social services to help with social or emotional concerns related to your illness.
- Certain durable medical equipment (DME) such as a wheelchair or walker.
- Certain medical supplies, such as medical dressings and catheters.

Note: Medicare should pay for these services regardless of whether your condition is improving or not.

Medicare will cover your home health care if:

1. You are homebound, meaning it is extremely difficult for you to leave your home and you are not doing so.
2. Due to the coronavirus public health emergency, the homebound requirement can be met in three ways. You can be considered homebound if you are at risk of progression or certifies that you cannot leave your home if you are at risk of medical complications if you go untreated. Or if you have a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19.
3. You need skilled nursing services on an intermittent basis and/or skilled therapy services such as physical, speech, and occupational therapy.
4. You need skilled nursing services on an intermittent basis and/or skilled therapy services such as physical, speech, and occupational therapy. However, if you need skilled nursing services as well, you could also receive in-home meeting with your doctor within 90 days before you start receiving skilled nursing services.
5. You have a Medicare-allowed reason to receive care as video conferencing.
6. Your doctor signs a home health certification certifying that you are homebound and need intermittent skilled care for you and that the face-to-face meeting requirement has not been met. Appropriate care for you and, if needed, receive your home health plan every 60 days. Your doctor should review and, if needed, recertify your home health plan every 60 days.
7. You receive care from a Medicare-qualified home health agency (HHA) if you need help finding a Medicare-qualified HHA, call 1-800-MEDICARE.


New Hampshire Emergency Rental Assistance Program

Our yesterdays

THEN ...

St. Joseph Church, at the corner of Lyford and Messer streets is seen in its second incarnation (1877-1934) after the first edifice, dating from 1867, was struck by lightning in 1877. (The Diocese had announced plans in 1891 for a major expansion of the structure but, at the urging of French-speaking members of the parish, Bishop Bradley gave permission for organization of another parish and construction of another church, which became Sacred Heart.) In 1929, a new St. Joseph Church was erected of stone on Church Street and, in October and November 1934, the Messer Street building was dismantled, the lumber being given to the needy for construction or firewood. The lot, overgrown with trees and brush, remained vacant until recently. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)


