



Fraud Surrounding COVID-19 is Increasing

As the number of people and communities affected by the COVID-19 pandemic grows, so do the scams associated with it. Scammers use public health emergencies as opportunities for new fraud schemes, and because older adults are at greater risk for serious illness from COVID-19, they may target older populations.

It's important to remember that although the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) and other public health officials may contact you if they believe you may have been exposed to the virus, they will not need to ask you for insurance or financial information.

Scammers rapidly alter their tactics and adapt their schemes to the changing landscape, and we anticipate that they will leverage the COVID-19 vaccine to prey on unsuspecting beneficiaries. Be vigilant and protect yourself from potential fraud concerning COVID-19 vaccines and treatments.

Here are things you need to know about the COVID-19 vaccine:

- You will not need to pay anything out-of-pocket to get the vaccine during this public health emergency.
- You cannot pay to put your name on a list to get the vaccine.
- You cannot pay to get early access to the vaccine.
- Be cautious of door-to-door visitors – especially those that are unsolicited or come without notice.
- No one from Medicare or the Health Department with contact you.
- No one from a vaccine distribution site or health care payer, like a private insurance company, will call you asking for your Medicare number, Social Security number, or your credit card or bank account information to sign you up to get the vaccine.
- Photos of COVID-19 vaccination cards should not be shared on social media. Posting content that includes your date of birth, health care details or other personally identifiable information can be used to steal your identity.

The Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) recommends that Medicare beneficiaries:

- Contact your own doctor if you are experiencing potential symptoms of COVID-19.
- Do not give out your Medicare number, Social Security number, or personal information in response to unsolicited calls, texts, emails, home visits, or booths at health fairs and other public venues. If your personal information is compromised, it may be used in other fraud schemes as well.
- Be suspicious of anyone going door-to-door to offer free coronavirus or COVID-19 testing, supplies, treatments, or vaccines.
- Carefully review your Medicare Summary Notice (MSN) or Explanation of Benefits (EOB), looking for errors or claims for products or services that weren't received.
- Follow the instructions of your state or local government for other actions you should be taking in response to COVID-19.
- Contact your local SMP for help. SMPs empower and assist Medicare beneficiaries, their families, and caregivers to prevent, detect, and report health care fraud, errors, and abuse.

The Senior Medicare Patrol (SMP) is ready to provide you with the information you need to PROTECT yourself from Medicare fraud, errors, and abuse; DETECT potential fraud, errors, and abuse; and REPORT your concerns. SMPs help educate and empower Medicare beneficiaries in the fight against health care fraud. Your SMP can help you with your questions, concerns, or complaints about potential fraud and abuse issues. A restaurant has occupied this space on Railroad avenue in Lakeport since the early 1960s, starting with Slim's in 1961, Schooner in late July 1971 and C.J.Avery's in April 1984. The brick building behind CJ's was built as a garage on the property at 15 Park St., sometime prior to 1923. Houses at 9 and 15 Park St. are seen in distance. (Google satellite photo)

Reminder to Property Owners

If your home is your primary residence and if you are over 65, you may qualify for an elderly exemption on your property value. Please note that income limits for elderly exemptions are \$25,000 single / \$35,000 married, and asset limits are \$75,000 not including the value of a home on up to 2 acres.

If you are a veteran and your home is your primary residence, you may qualify for a veteran's credit.

Important Notice from the Department of Public Works.....

Recycling containers should not be used for trash!

Please do not use recycling containers for disposing of your trash at any time.

During recycling week the trash collection crew will not check any container marked "Recycling". When the recycling crew finds trash in a recycling container they will not collect it. That means your trash will not be collected for that week as the crew will not go back in this situation to collect the trash that was in the recycling container.

During non-recycling weeks, the crews will skip over and not empty any recycling container as it is not a recycling collection week. Volunteers Needed for Local Conservation Projects

If you don't mind getting your hands dirty, Amelia Kaufhold, Volunteer Coordinator for Environmental Stewardship and Food Assistance in Belknap County, probably has a volunteer opportunity for you.

Spring Plant Sale - Throughout the month of April, volunteers are needed starting April 7th to pack up this year's record number of plant orders for the Belknap County Conservation District (BCCD) Spring Tree, Shrub and Trout Sale. Volunteers will be packing plants at Picnic Rock Farm, 85 Daniel Webster Highway (Route #3), Meredith, NH. The BCCD Plant Sale is April 30-May 2nd. To volunteer, sign up online by visiting the www.belknapccd.org under the 'Get Involved' tab or enter into your internet search <https://signup.com/go/tYKqZnf>. The Conservation District received twice as many orders as last year, so more help is needed. With deliveries underway from suppliers, the District is no longer able to fill new orders, but will have some surplus items available during the Plant Sale weekend.



The updated Belknap County Conservation District website: www.belknapccd.org includes information about volunteering as well as good conservation information. Upcoming volunteer opportunities include spring clean ups on the Wetland Walk at Gunstock in Gilford and the BCCD community garden along Parade Road in Laconia. Sign up dates will be posted to help with raking and minor repairs at 1/4 mile boardwalk trail, pollinator garden planting and installing interpretive signs at Gunstock. The Laconia community garden needs volunteers for clean up and tilling in May.

Zoom Festival premiers this Friday!



Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative is kicking off its 2021 season with a new play Zoom Festival which premiers on Friday, April 16 on the Belknap Mill's YouTube channel and is available to watch anytime through April 25th. "Send a gift to our Earth": Earth Day is celebrated World-wide on April 22nd

On Saturday, April 17th members of the Green Sanctuary Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia, in partnership with the Laconia-Gilford Lions Club, are collecting recyclable plastic from 12 noon until 4:00 pm in front of the little white church at 172 Pleasant Street.

We can all help this recycling activity now by starting to save soft plastics and not throw them into the trash. We ARE collecting clean plastic bags and wrappers, plastic grocery bags, pet food bags, vegetable bags (potatoes, carrots, celery, rice, etc.), bubble-wrap, air packing bags, bread bags, wraps from around 6-pack cans of juice and dry-cleaning bags. We ARE NOT collecting hard plastic, for example rigid containers.

Why is this important? Plastic bags that are not recycled end up in landfills or in the sea contaminating our drinking water with microplastics and dangerous chemicals. Plastics also are burned releasing toxins into our atmosphere.

Thanks to you, our greater Laconia community, this past November we collected just shy of 200 lbs. of soft plastics which were sent to a manufacturer of composite decking and outdoor furniture in Maine to be repurposed. Every bit helps. Let's surpass our previous number of collected pounds of plastic!

Collection will follow COVID-Safe practices: Collectors will be wearing masks and socially distanced. Drop offs need to be done by "mask wearers."

Burning Permits Required!

Open burning permits are now required in Laconia for the 2021 season. This includes camp fires, cooking fires and brush piles. Permits can be obtained at either the Laconia Central Fire Station located at 848 North Main Street or the Weirs Beach Fire Station at 11 Lucerne Ave.

Only the property owner can obtain a burning permit, unless a Laconia Fire Department Non-Property Owner Authorization Form has been filled out and signed. These forms are available at both stations as well.

Answers to some other commonly asked questions are:

- * Open burning with a permit is allowed from 5pm to 9am
- * The fire must be attended
- * You must have sufficient water available to control/extinguish the fire
- * Only certain materials can be burned, including but not limited to untreated wood and brush 5" or less in diameter. **NO** burning of treated woods, trash, cardboard, or plastics is allowed (a complete list is available when permit is obtained)
- * Category I/II (campfire/cooking fire) must be at least 25 feet from structures, and Category III or greater fires must be 50 feet from structures.

For a full list of rules and regulations or if you have questions, please contact one of the fire stations listed above. For Central Station, the number is 524-6881 or the Weirs Station can be reached at 366-2229.

Until May 1st a property owner may obtain a burning permit by phone. **After May 1st all permits must be obtained in person.**


