

THEN . . .

A diesel locomotive of the Wolfeboro Railroad approaches the Union Avenue crossing at Black Brook in Lakeport, in the early spring of 1976 — some 45 years ago. Earlier on that run, it had been necessary to use a bucket loader to clear snow piled on the tracks behind the Laconia Water Dept., off-photo at right, to permit the train to pass. The photo was taken from inside the Burger King restaurant, which had opened, May 20, 1974 and which closed, April 20, 2008. The rails over Union Avenue (just off-photo at left) were removed in the fall of 1991 in conjunction with a major Union Avenue repaving project. (Photo courtesy of Bruce Davison)



. . . AND NOW

By the 1970s, the Lake Shore Railroad (which ran from Lakeport to Alton) had become a spur line, serving Grossman's Lumber on Blaisdell Avenue, about a quarter mile off-photo at left. The last rail traffic over this spur is believed to have occurred sometime in the 1970s, although sections of the rails were still there until a couple years ago when the portion running through the Irwin Marine property was taken up. Vestiges of the tracks are still to be seen behind T-Bones and adjacent to the Blaisdell Avenue Industrial Park. The Burger King sign was located just behind the utility pole (see arrow) but was removed for construction of the condominiums just to the left of the former Burger King building (now Watermark Marine Construction), which is glimpsed at extreme right. 

"Send a gift to our Earth": Earth Day is celebrated World-wide on April 22nd

On Saturday, April 17th members of the Green Sanctuary Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia, in partnership with the Laconia-Gilford Lions Club, are collecting recyclable plastic from 12 noon until 4:00 pm in front of the little white church at 172 Pleasant Street.

We can all help this recycling activity now by starting to save soft plastics and not throw them into the trash. We ARE collecting clean plastic bags and wrappers, plastic grocery bags, pet food bags, vegetable bags (potatoes, carrots, celery, rice, etc.), bubble-wrap, air packing bags, bread bags, wraps from around 6-pack cans of juice and dry-cleaning bags. We ARE NOT collecting hard plastic, for example rigid containers.

Why is this important? Plastic bags that are not recycled end up in landfills or in the sea contaminating our drinking water with microplastics and dangerous chemicals. Plastics also are burned releasing toxins into our atmosphere.

Thanks to you, our greater Laconia community, this past November we collected just shy of 200 lbs. of soft plastics which were sent to a manufacturer of composite decking and outdoor furniture in Maine to be repurposed. Every bit helps. Let's surpass our previous number of collected pounds of plastic!

Collection will follow COVID-Safe practices: Collectors will be wearing masks and socially distanced. Drop offs need to be done by "mask wearers."

We appreciate your help!


