Notes from the Public Works Dept.

Why should you bring corrugated cardboard to the City's collection point at 257 Messer Street?



Since 2017 the City has paid to process and sell corrugated cardboard collected at the curb. This product is a commodity and for a period of time it had little to no value. It costs the City \$106/ton for the contractor to transport and process recycling collected at the curb. Per the contract, the actual cost of recycling is adjusted monthly based on the value of the recycled product. At one point the City paid \$134/ton to "sell" our recycled corrugated cardboard. At that point, a lot of recyclable materi-

als had no value, and the processor was paying firms to take the product. The market has now recovered and the value of the product in March lowered the City's cost to \$69.11/ton.

The value of some types of recycled products (including corrugated cardboard) have recovered much faster than others. Corrugated cardboard is the material that makes up those Amazon boxes you have been getting (not the material that makes up your cereal boxes). Corrugated cardboard is heavy, and its value has significantly increased compared to the other products. The firms that need recycled corrugated cardboard to make new corrugated cardboard are paying more for this product. In October 2020, the City sold cardboard for \$5 per ton towards the expense of transporting the cardboard to the recycler. In March, the City sold the cardboard for \$35 per ton. A big difference!

The City asks that all residents and businesses bring their corrugated cardboard to the corrugated cardboard collection point at 257 Messer Street (it is open 24/7) because it saves the City and taxpayers money. Recycled corrugated cardboard collected at the curb cost the City \$69.11 per ton in March. However, that same material brought to the cardboard collection center at 257 Messer Street cost the City only \$49/ton in March saving the City \$20/ton. Please help the City save money by bring your corrugated cardboard to the recycling point!

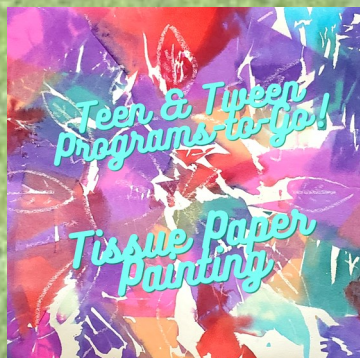
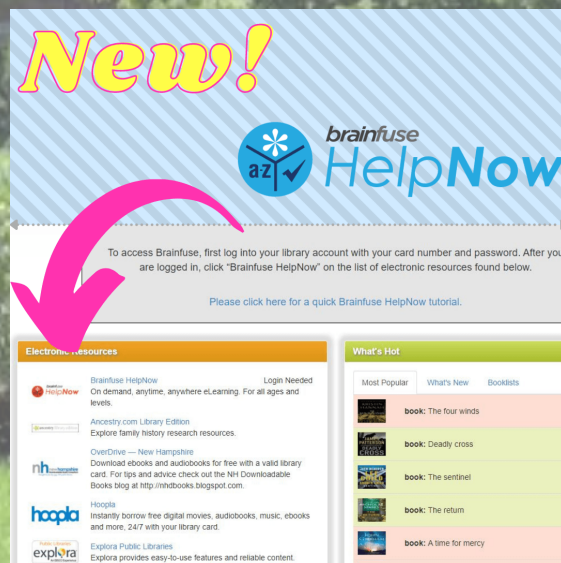
**Adult Takeaway Craft:

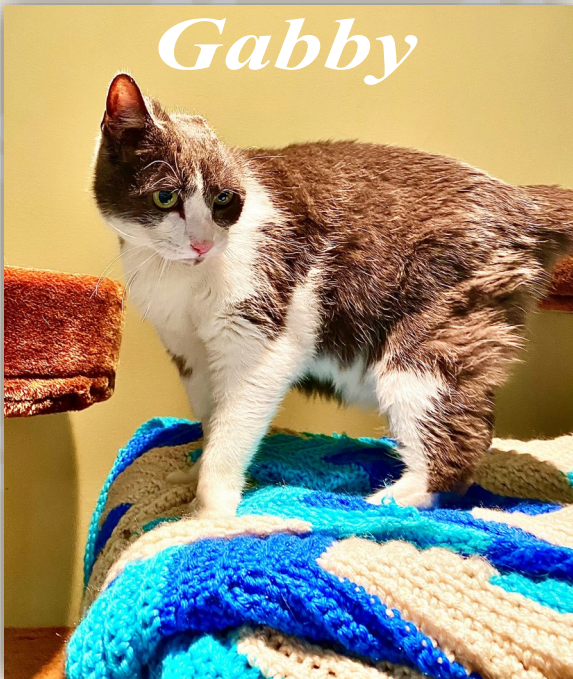


***Meet Gabby: A 7-year-old spayed

THEN ...

The Diamond Match (later Diamond National) building on Lower Court Street is seen in the late 1920s or early 1930s. At a later date, the structure was painted dark red. The company announced plans, 50 years ago this week in 1971, for constructing a new building materials center, next door. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

Diamond National had the earlier structure at 355 Court St. razed in 1971 and the building to the right, at 343 Court St., erected in its place. Site of the earlier building became its parking lot. After Diamond National went out of business in 1990, later occupants were Cheapo Depot until late 2009 and, today, Eased Edges, which won a Golden Trowel award in 2010 for its transformation of the building. Please Dial 911 for Fire or Medical Emergencies

The Laconia Fire Department has seen a significant increase in the number of emergency requests that are called directly to one of our fire stations through our business line. These may be for fires, or requests for an ambulance. Unfortunately, there is not always someone in the station to answer your call. Companies may be out on another incident, training, or not immediately able to answer the phone. This means a delay for you in receiving the help you need.

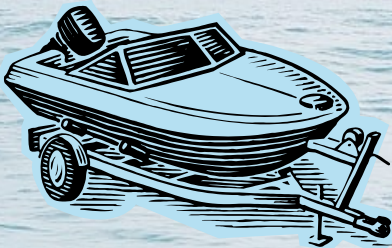
By dialing 911, the caller is guaranteed to talk to a trained emergency telecommunicator. This operator will gather vital information that our crews need, and forward that information to our dispatch center, all while staying on the line to assist you until help arrives. This is a quick process that saves a lot of valuable time.

All non-emergency calls, or questions for our staff can still go directly into our business line. However, we ask that all emergency requests are initiated by dialing 911.

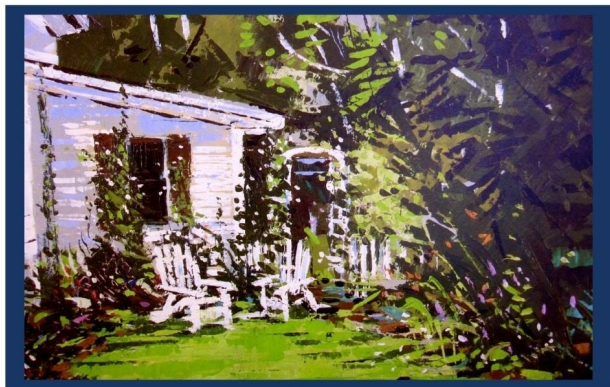
A huge "thank you" for coming by this past Saturday with all of your recyclable plastics!

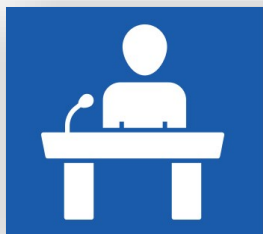
