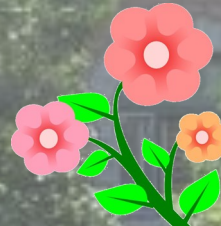

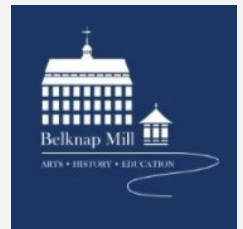

Our yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN ...

Stores, built by Benjamin Piscopo in 1922-23, on the south side of Canal Street are seen in 1923 when the Bean Brothers' clothing store occupied the Beacon Street corner. The Perley Canal runs directly under these stores, taking a 90-degree turn under the Colonial Theater stage, turning again to run under today's Laconia Antique Center and out under Bank Square and from there to the river. Piscopo also built all but one of the stores on the North side of Canal Street. His Colonial Theater, which opened in 1914, looms in the distance. (Laconia Public Library)



...AND NOW

Various businesses have been located here over the past 93 years since the Bean Brothers moved to the Keller-Bean Block on Main Street in 1928. Although Prohibition ended, Dec. 5, 1933, it took until Dec. 14, 1934, before the city's first State Liquor Store opened in this space. In the mid-1940s, Edward Lydiard's printing office (in the 1950s, Sidney Lerman's), later, the Lakes Travel Agency and, since the middle-1970s, Penny Pitou Travel have occupied the corner space. In the distance at far right, the Pemaco Block — built in 1926, three years after the earlier photo was taken — is glimpsed. Many buildings on Beacon Street, at left, were removed during Urban Renewal in the late 1960s-early 1970s. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)

What Does 116 Tons of Cardboard Look Like?

We don't know either, but that's how much our residents and businesses have brought to the "cardboard cage" on Messer St. over the past 2 ½ years. Thank you to everyone!



Why separate out your cardboard from other recycling and bring it to 257 Messer St.?

- Cardboard has much greater value now than other paper/plastic recyclables.
- Separating cardboard out keeps it clean of other contaminants and adds more value to our end product.
- We pay to get rid of trash/recycling by the ton. Cardboard is one of the heavier recyclables so there is much greater benefit because we are removing more tonnage.
- It's easy: Flatten the boxes and tuck them away. When you have enough or are headed towards Messer St, drop them off. No mess. No odor.
- The cardboard cage is available 24/7. Drive right up and slide the cardboard through the slot.
- Helps reduce the cost of the City's Solid Waste Program.
- Something so simple makes a difference and makes you feel good!

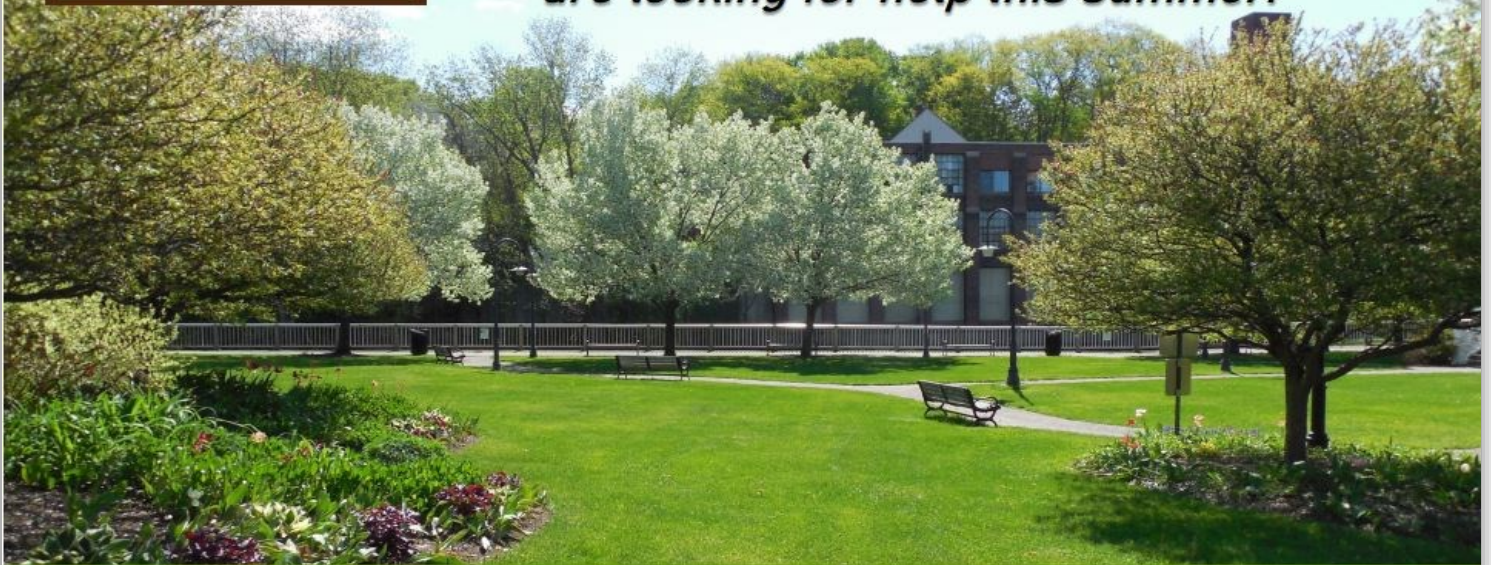

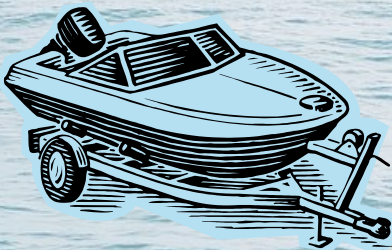

Burning Permits Required!



Effective May 1st
all outside burning
will require a
written permit.

Receiving a permit by
phone will no longer
be allowed.

Outside burning permits can be obtained at the
Laconia Central Fire Station on North Main
Street, or the Weirs Fire Station on Lucerne
Avenue.

To receive a permit, you must be the property
owner, or have a Non-Property Owner
Authorization Form signed by the owner.

For a seasonal camp fire/cooking fire, you must
have a 25 foot clearance from any structure or
property line, and a 50 foot clearance is
required for burning a brush pile. The permittee
must also have a hose or other way to control
and/or extinguish the fire.

A full list of rules are available when the permit
is received.

BRAETTWINE'S BALANCED BITES

Instead of "Spring-cleaning" your diet with the latest diet or cleanse (detoxify, juice, green powders, teas, pills, etc.) that can get expensive and potentially harm your health, try the following nutrition tips that support the body's natural detoxification pathways and generally leave you feeling better, not worse.
1. Stay hydrated: water helps the body eliminate waste products from cellular functions.
2. Consume 1-1.5 servings of vegetables & fruits daily.
One serving of vegetables is equal to 1 cup raw, 1/2 cup cooked, or 3 cups raw leafy greens.
3. Consume dietary fiber daily for regularity.
Women aim for 25g fiber.
Men aim for 38g fiber.
Some great fiber sources include beans (black, garbanzo, navy, etc.), lentils, berries, apples, leeks, oats, cruciferous vegetables, leafy greens, and avocados.
4. Include cruciferous vegetables & alliums (these foods provide fiber and sulfur, which aids secretion of heavy metals) (broccoli, Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower, onions, garlic, leeks, etc.).
5. Consume antioxidant-rich foods & beverages (antioxidants decrease free-radical damage and reduce risk of diseases that affect natural detoxification pathways). Berries, green tea, sweet potatoes, extra virgin olive oil, leafy greens, avocados, green apples, grapes, herbs and spices, and dark chocolate.
6. Consume adequate protein (needed to maintain adequate glutathione levels, the body's master detoxification enzyme). Rich (lean) great source of omega-3 fats: poultry, eggs, dairy, seed oils, fish, hemp, and avocados. Beans and lentils.
7. Consume naturally fermented foods for healthy gut function: kimchi, sauerkraut, kombucha, yogurt, and kefir.

BELL PEPPER EGGS (GREAT BREAKFAST IDEA FOR WOMEN'S DAY MAY 5TH)

Ingredients:

- 1 bell pepper sliced into 1/4 inch rings
- 4 eggs
- 2 tablespoons chopped chives
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley
- Salt and pepper to taste

INSTRUCTIONS:

- Heat a non-stick skillet over medium heat and grease lightly with cooking spray.
- Place a bell pepper ring in the skillet, then cook for 3 minutes. Flip the ring, then cook on egg in the middle. Season with salt and pepper, then cook until the egg is cooked to your liking, 3-4 minutes.
- Repeat with other eggs and garnish with chives and parsley.
