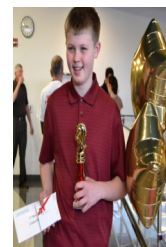


Third graders at Elm Street School and Pleasant Street School participated in the 4th Annual Fire and Life Safety Calendar Contest. There were over 425 participants.

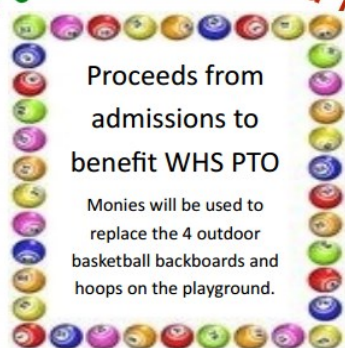

Quick and easy money-saving gardening tips are always appreciated by thrifty New Englanders. With the gardening season still ahead, here are a few fun and frugal ideas to make gardening a little easier with little or no cost involved.

Nutrient Boost for Garden Soil – There are a few ways to organically boost the nutrient content in your garden without waiting for a traditional compost pile to decompose and be added to the soil. One is to cut up a banana peel and bury the pieces in the soil several inches below the root of plants. Periodically working in crushed egg shells and used coffee grounds is also a great way to release nutrients. After you are done boiling vegetables let the water cool and use it to water your garden.

Make a Homemade Watering Can – In places where a hose can't reach, keep a homemade watering can or two available to perk up sun-stressed plants quickly and conveniently. To make a homemade watering can, clean a plastic gallon-sized milk jug and use a hammer and a nail to pierce several holes in the cap. Fill the jug with water, re-cap and voila!

Garden hand Tool Storage Made Easy – Make a handy garden tool container to store your small hand tools upright, neat and in one place. Choose a medium to large plant pot and block the drainage hole from the inside with duct tape. Fill the plant pot 3/4 full with fine, clean dry sand. Place small hand tools sharp side down into the sand.

Simple Birdbath – Large terracotta plant pot saucers (the deeper ones work best) are perfect for use as a simple bird bath. Place the saucer on a stump, wide post, or on top of an upside-down large terracotta pot and add water. It won't take long for the birds to begin to visit.

Plant Marking Options – The following household items make great plant identification markers: Venetian blind pieces cut to size with a triangle shape cut into one end for easy insertion in the soil, popsicle sticks and wooden paint stirring sticks.

Clean Hand Tip – Avoid dirty fingernails by scraping your nails across a bar of soap before working in the dirt and/or keep a separate toothbrush near the sink and rub it on a bar of soap and brush nails after gardening.

News From the Laconia Water Department

HOLMAN STREET WATER LINE REPLACEMENT STARTING MONDAY, APRIL 18TH



The Laconia Water Department will be relaying approximately 2,000 feet of water main on Holman Street, from Gale Avenue to just south of Downing Street over the next few weeks. The work is expected to be completed prior to Memorial Day when road reconstruction will begin.

During the initial part of this process, Holman Street will be closed to thru traffic between Gale Avenue and Shore Drive. Local traffic (properties between Gale Avenue and Shore Drive) will be allowed access from one end or the other, depending on the location of the work being performed. This is necessary to assure the safety of the traveling public as well as our workmen.

The Laconia Water Department would like to thank anyone inconvenienced by this traffic detour for their cooperation and understanding. Please stay tuned for further updates.

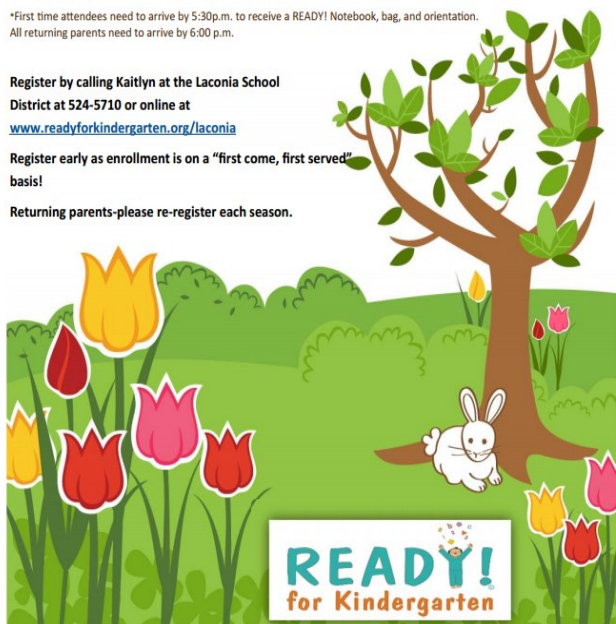
