Burning Permits Required!

**Effective May 1st all outside
burning requires a written permit.**

**Receiving a permit by phone will
no longer be allowed.**

Outside burning permits can be obtained at the Laconia Central Fire Station on North Main Street, or the Weirs Fire Station on Lucerne Avenue.

To receive a permit, you must be the property owner, or have a Non-Property Owner Authorization Form signed by the owner.

For a seasonal camp fire/cooking fire, you must have a 25 foot clearance from any structure or property line, and a 50 foot clearance is required for burning a brush pile. The permittee must also have a hose or other way to control and/or extinguish the fire.

A full list of rules are available when the permit is received.

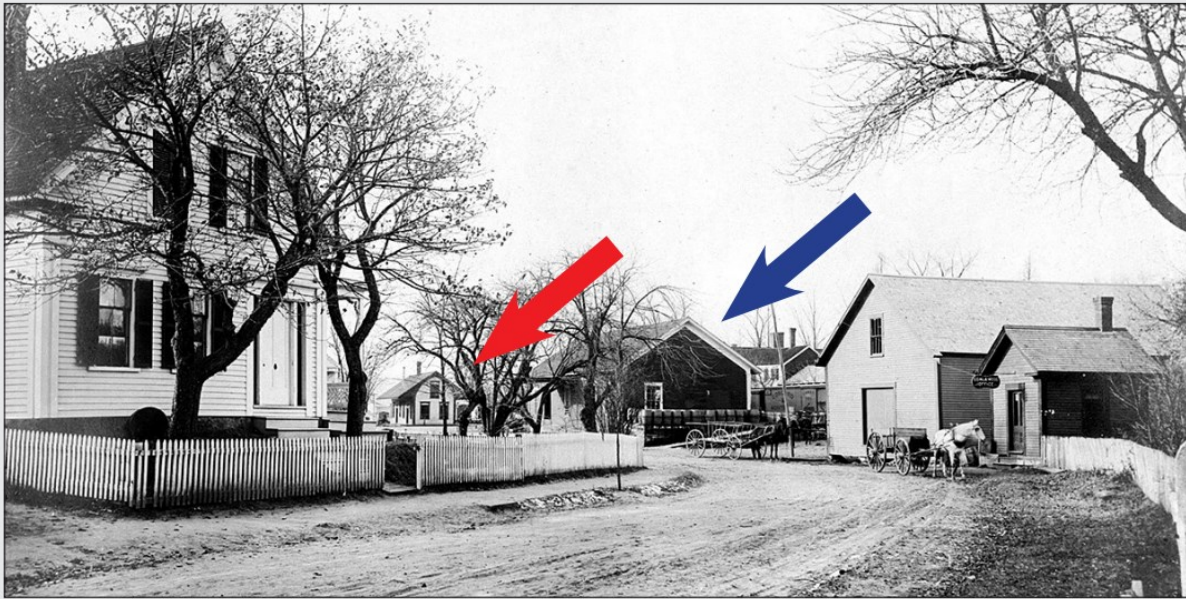
The Transfer Station will re-open on Monday, May 24th.

Our yesterdays

Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....



THEN ...

In this late 1880s or very early 1890s view of what became, in 1892, Depot Square, and ultimately Veterans Square, in Laconia, a dirt roadway several yards north (to the right) of today's street is seen. The house at left (along with several others) was removed to create the 'square' when a new, granite passenger station was erected near the site of the Freight Depot (blue arrow) on the near side of Pleasant Street, along with the other structures at right. In the distance, the original Passenger Station is seen (red arrow), at the entrance to today's Beacon Street West, near the Pleasant Street railroad crossing. (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

Today the east entrance to Veterans Square lines up with Church Street instead of several yards to the right, as previously. In addition to straightening the road through the 'square,' the 1892 construction of the new granite Passenger Station included creation of the Veterans Park, at right, necessitating the removal of two houses from that space directly opposite today's Laconia Public Library. In the distance, the entrance to Beacon Street West can be seen, at the site of the original Passenger Station, which was moved across and down the tracks to its current New Salem Street location as the Salvation Army Thrift Store — faintly glimpsed in the far distance. The New Hampshire Veterans' Association Annual Walking Tour



N. H. Veterans' Headquarters, The Weirs, N. H.

On Saturday, May 15, at 1 pm. The New Hampshire Veterans' Association, in partnership with the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, will host their annual tour of the buildings and grounds at Lakeside Avenue, Weirs Beach. This tour is free and open to the public.

Historian Fred Merrill will take you on a guided tour of this eight-acre complex and tell of many interesting stories of this meeting place that served as reprieve and a place for the men to gather and reunite with their fellow soldiers that they created bonds with during the Civil War.

In June 1875, the New Hampshire Veterans' Association was organized in Concord. The first general reunion and encampment occurred in October of that year at the Riding Park in Manchester. In 1878, The NHVA held its second reunion and encampment – its first at "Weirs Landing" (Weirs Beach). The Encampment Headquarters building located on Lakeside Avenue was built in 1885.

The walking tour will begin promptly at 1 p.m. at the Encampment Headquarters (across from Mount Washington Cruises) in the Weirs. Please provide your own masks and hand sanitizer if needed, social distancing is recommended.

Braver Angels Virtual Town Hall
Topic: NH Voting Rights and
Responsibilities
June 7, 2021 at 7:00 pm

The Braver Angels of NH invites you to a unique opportunity for grassroots participation in state government on June 7, 2021 from 7:00 - 9:00 pm via Zoom. A Braver Angels Town Hall is a virtual event bringing together citizens from across the political spectrum - equal numbers of Reds and Blues - to explore common ground on policy issues and to discuss individual views with our political representatives. This Town Hall discussion will be on New Hampshire voting rights and responsibilities, with two New Hampshire State Senators - one Republican and one Democrat.

New Hampshire residents have participated in Town Meetings over the decades. The Braver Angels Town Hall process adds a new twist to this time-honored tradition. Once a resident registers for the event (deadline May 17,) they will receive a list of statements about voting in the state. This process is known as a Polis survey. Not only is the participant asked to vote on the statements in the survey, they are invited to edit statements or add additional statements that better reflect their views. The votes will be tallied electronically using the nonpartisan Polis technology, including any additions and revisions to the original statements. The dynamic Polis survey process will produce an analysis of which items are controversial, which are polarizing, and how groups of participants cluster around topics.

On the evening of the event, participants will come together over Zoom to discuss a set of statements garnered from the Polis survey analysis. During the first hour small groups that are equally balanced between Reds and Blues will discuss the statements. The goal of the small group discussions is to arrive at "common ground" policy ideas which participants will be invited to present to the two state Senators during the second half of the event.

This event offers a rare opportunity to participate in our state's legislative process on a grassroots level.

The event is free of charge and is open to all New Hampshire residents. Registration is required, and must be completed by May 17. Non-residents and those who prefer not to participate directly may register as observers. Please feel free to invite your friends, family, and neighbors to register as well, especially if they hold opposing views. 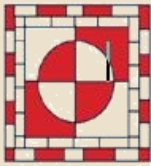



Winnisquam Watershed Based Plan (WBP) Public Workshop May 18th!

Join us for a virtual public workshop on Tuesday May 18th from 4:30-6:00 pm to discuss the development of the Winnisquam Watershed Based Management Plan and how it will benefit our watershed. This will be a virtual workshop held on Zoom, so everyone can participate from the comfort of their own home. Representatives of WWN and the consulting team engaged by EPA will present an overview of the watershed planning process and discuss some of the issues facing the watershed as well as some potential solutions. Lake Host Update



We're just about there! We want to extend our sincere thanks to the many of you who contributed to our Lake Host fund, as well as to the WWN member who so generously matched your donations. The money raised, together with a \$2,500 grant from NH Lakes, will enable us to expand our Lake Host staffing this year to provide at least one Lake Host to inspect boats launched at the public ramp in Laconia nearly every day during the summer. We are anticipating another very busy boating season this year so it is critically important that we take steps to prevent new aquatic invasive species from entering our lake. The hiring and training of our Lake Hosts is already underway. We still have a few gaps in coverage that we are hoping to fill with volunteers, so please [let us know](#) if you can help us out with a few hours of your time (all training provided). And for those of you who have not already contributed to our Lake Host staffing fund it's not too late - [click here](#) to make a donation.



Ice-Out Water Quality Monitoring

Speaking of water quality monitoring, you may have seen a team of scientists from NHDES out collecting samples on Lake Winnisquam shortly after ice-out in early April. Typically, we conduct sampling during the summer months when the lake is stratified, with colder water at the bottom and warmer water toward the surface. By sampling in the early spring when the lake temperature is uniform throughout the water column, NHDES is generating data on the fully mixed conditions in the lake which the consulting team will use to check and calibrate the water quality model to be used in the development of our Watershed Based Plan.

Calling All Volunteers!

Want to help do your part to protect Lake Winnisquam? The WWN is getting ready to start up our volunteer water quality monitoring and weed watching programs for the summer season but we are in need of a few more volunteers. Team up with our current monitoring crews to help with our once monthly water quality sampling out on the lake or at our nine tributary stream locations. Or sign up to be a Weed Watcher and help us keep an eye out for invasive aquatic species. Weed watching can be done on your own time, from the comfort of your own boat, kayak or float. We will provide training to all volunteers, and NHDES is also offering online training workshops. And none of these volunteer roles require more than a few hours a month.
