With the start of the summer season very soon people will be using their "toys" that require trailers while enjoying all of the opportunities that the Lakes Region has to offer. While everyone is starting to enjoy the warmer weather, the City's Zoning Enforcement office would like to remind people there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten in the warmer weather.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which include trailers, campers, boats, any other recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the [City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles.](#))

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be. Don't forget that includes those items that are intended for the snow (like snowmobiles), as you transition from winter to summer.



The Mill has turned to its in-house performing arts company, Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative, to adapt the Mill program into a script and produce the movie that will allow kids to experience the program from their own classrooms. Says Powerhouse's producer Johanna Halperin, "Due to the pandemic, kids were unable to attend the Industrial Heritage program in 2020 or 2021, so the Mill team wanted to find ways we could bring the Mill to them. This movie will recreate the experience in a format that can be shared with schools across New England and around the world!"

But the first step is casting, and Powerhouse is seeking a boy and a girl who can believably pass for a 4th grader who will become the eyes through which the 4th graders in schools will "see" the program. Actors should be able to memorize lines, be comfortable rehearsing and acting with adults, and be available for the shoot in Laconia on July 17 and 18. Auditioners will fill out the audition form and send a video introducing themselves and performing the provided audition speech. Videos will be accepted through June 15.

Auditions for the Colonial productions will be August 29, in person, and auditions for the reading will be by video submission. The building at 148 Union Ave. was demolished in late 2019. The small, one-story structure remaining on Arch Street was once Martel's, then Wilfred's Market, still later the Arch Street Cash Market. 



Burning Permits Required!




Effective May 1st all outside burning will require a written permit. Receiving a permit by phone will no longer be allowed.

Outside burning permits can be obtained at the Laconia Central Fire Station on North Main Street, or the Weirs Fire Station on Lucerne Avenue.

To receive a permit, you must be the property owner, or have a Non-Property Owner Authorization Form signed by the owner.

For a seasonal camp fire/cooking fire, you must have a 25 foot clearance from any structure or property line, and a 50 foot clearance is required for burning a brush pile. The permittee must also have a hose or other way to control and/or extinguish the fire. A full list of rules are available when the permit is received.

Powerhouse announces auditions For A Christmas Carol!

Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative is pleased to announce the first open auditions for an opportunity to be in one of its productions on the Colonial Theatre stage! Beginning now through June 15, Powerhouse Theatre Collaborative is accepting video submissions from adults for Joel Mercier's *A Christmas Carol: The Musical Ghost Story*. Produced in conjunction with NCCA at Jean's Playhouse, we look forward to the 2021 production being an annual tradition of bringing the beloved Dickens' classic to the Lakes Region.

Directed by Mercier and featuring his original music and lyrics, there are roles for 20-25 adults and 10-15 children. Three of the adult roles are dancing phantoms and perfect for people who love to dance. Auditions for the children will take place at the end of August. Says Mercier, "This production is the true definition of an ensemble cast. Everyone has a lot to do and everyone plays a specific character in the ensemble, while also doubling as traditional characters in the story, such as Fezziwig, the School Master, Mrs. Dilber, Old Joe, etc."



According to Powerhouse Producer Bryan Halperin, "We can't wait to get auditions started for Powerhouse's 2021 Colonial Series. We are thrilled to partner with Joel and NCCA on this exciting production and hope it will become a mainstay of the Lakes Region's holiday festivities." Powerhouse's Colonial Series is sponsored by Taylor Community and RE/Max Bayside.

This adaptation has been seen previously in Concord and Lincoln, most recently in 2018. All roles are open with the exception of Ebenezer Scrooge who will once again be played by the venerable John Conlon. "What a lot of people don't realize is that before Dickens published *A Christmas Carol*, Christmas was not lavishly celebrated by the lower and middle classes. This story literally changed their view of the holiday, and that tradition stuck. I can't think of a better and more influential story to celebrate as an annual musical," says Mercier.

Rehearsals will begin in late October and performance dates are scheduled for December 17th—19th, 2021.

CITY OF LACONIA SUPERVISORS OF THE CHECKLIST NOTICE OF SESSION

New Hampshire law requires that the Supervisors of the Checklist verify the checklist every ten years. Any person on the checklist who has not voted in the past four (4) years must re-register to remain on the checklist.

The Supervisors are sending notice letters to these voters at the address provided when registering.
