





Enjoy A Lake Opechee 4th of July Boat Parade!

We celebrate the 4th of July again with a second annual boat parade around Lake Opechee for lake associations and shorefront owners! We follow the leader and parade around the lake at headway speed. Come on down to the shore of Opechee Park to watch the parade, enjoy 4th of July festivities, and cheer on the participants while showing your 4th of July spirit!

Come join us for this fun event prior to the fireworks and following the City of Laconia parade that ends in Opechee Park. In case of rain delay, the parade will be held on the next scheduled date of the fireworks.

The boat parade starts at **6:30 pm and will be finished before 7:30 pm**. It starts at the north end of the lake and proceeds in a counterclockwise circle route around the entire lake to finish where it begins.

This marks 250 years since the Declaration of Independence for our great nation was signed!



Per [State RSA, Title XLV, Chapter 466](#) all dogs residing in the City of Laconia must be registered with the City Clerk prior to April 30th. A late fee of \$1/month is assessed for those dogs not registered by that date.

Beginning July 1st, a civil fine of \$25 is due. If the fine is not paid within 15 calendar days of the notice of forfeiture, the case may be forwarded to the District Court as a violation with a fine not to exceed \$50.

THEN ...

Endicott Rock Monument at Weirs Beach is seen as it looked prior to filling in about half of Weirs Channel along with extending the 'dry land' out into the lake. The rock, inscribed with the initials of the explorers who visited the site in 1652, was rediscovered in 1833 and was encased in the granite structure in 1892, accessed by a wooden footbridge until this one of steel was installed in 1901 along with the statue of 'Capt. Jack' atop the monument. Mail boat, the Steamer Uncle Sam is approaching the channel, headed for Lakeport. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

In 1833, the eastern (behind the monument) half of the channel was dredged to permit passage of the Steamer Belknap, with the dredgings dumped in the center of the channel. Around 1908 a breakwater was constructed along the line of dredgings and, in 1938, the Civilian Conservation Corps constructed a retaining wall, containing 1,000 tons of stone, creating approximately an acre of filled land around the granite monument. Later efforts, in the 1950s, created the bathing beach, at left. All the land in this photo was once part of the Channel or rocks and open water where the beach is now. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)

As we approach the 4th of July holiday, and the heart of the summer season, it is time to pause to remember that safety has to be a priority when using consumer fireworks. Injury and unintended fires are a real possibility. It is everyone's responsibility to make sure these do not happen.

According to the Consumer Product Safety Commission, in 2018 there were 9,100 fireworks related injuries nationwide, and 62% of them occurred in the month surrounding the Fourth of July. Almost half of the reported injuries occurred in persons under 20 years old.

The National Fire Protection Association reported that in 2018 19,500 fires were caused by fireworks. Almost 10% of these were building fires.

With those statistics, it is important we remember some key points to keep everyone safe...

Only permissible fireworks are allowed in NH. Permissible means they have been made legal for sale, possession and use. These can be purchased in licensed NH retail stores. Other devices are illegal!

When using permissible fireworks, it is important to follow some very important rules to keep everyone safe.

- Display only on your own property
- Read all safety warnings
- Have a fire extinguisher and/or water hose nearby
- You must be 21 or older to buy or display permissible fireworks
- Always wear eye and hearing protection
- Light only one device at a time and move away quickly
- Keep all spectators a safe distance away
- Only display fireworks away from anything that can burn
- Discard used fireworks in a bucket of water; **do not throw away in regular garbage**
- Keep children away from where fireworks are being lit
- Do not allow young children to hold sparklers

Laconia Fire Department wants everyone to enjoy this holiday weekend, and we also want everyone to be safe.

No waiting for your registration to be mailed back to you! Get it done easily and conveniently at the City Clerk's Office. We are open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

Burning Permits Required!

All outside burning requires a written permit!

**LACONIA
FIRE DEPARTMENT
NEW HAMPSHIRE**

Outside burning permits can be obtained at the Laconia Central Fire Station on North Main Street, or the Weirs Fire Station on Lucerne Avenue. To receive a permit, you must be the property owner, or have a Non-Property Owner Authorization Form signed by the owner.

For a seasonal camp fire/cooking fire, you must have a 25 foot clearance from any structure or property line, and a 50 foot clearance is required for burning a brush pile. The permittee must also have a hose or other way to control and/or extinguish the fire. A full list of rules are available when the permit is received.
