The City's Curbside Solid Waste Collection Services

In addition to its trash and recycling container curbside collection program, the City has two additional programs to help residents dispose of their trash at the curb. They are:

Bulky Item Stickers:

Residents can dispose of select oversized items at the curb if they are able to be lifted by two people and if they have a bulky item sticker on them (bulky item stickers can be purchased at City Hall and at Public Works). The cost of a sticker is \$6 and a sticker must be placed on each item.

Non metal bulky items are collected on your normal day of collection. Metal bulky items are collected by appointment only on the first Wednesday of the month. Call Public Works at 528-6379 to arrange for pickup of metal items.

The City does not collect freon containing appliances and electronics at the curb. These items should be brought to the transfer station for disposal.

Residents will need a dump sticker or a day pass to use the transfer station and there is a fee to dispose of these items at the transfer station.

Excess Trash Stickers:

The City has created a program for those families living in single family homes or duplexes that need to place more trash out at the curb than the two cans they are allowed by City Ordinances.

A set of five of these stickers costs \$15 and you can purchase them at City Hall and at Public Works.


Businesses and residents living in apartment/condominium complexes with 3 units or greater cannot purchase these stickers.

The Festival will be a day of Dragon Boat races, a flower ceremony for loved ones touched by cancer, and fun for anyone racing or watching!

Dragon Boating is easy to learn, extremely safe, and an activity where men and women compete side-by-side towards the same goal. Dragon boats are long, narrow (40 feet long) boats. The crew consists of 20 paddlers sitting two abreast, one steersperson at the rear, and one drummer who sits or stands at the head of the boat and beats out a paddling rhythm for the crew. Regardless of how young, old, big, or little: once a paddler is in stroke, they are contributing to their team! Add the outdoors, the water, the visual spectacle of dragon boating, and you get a perfect activity for friends and family!

Absolutely no experience is necessary to participate. We provide the boats, paddles, life jackets, a time to practice, and the racecourse! We recommend about 21-24 participants per team, with both men and women participating. The minimum age to paddle is 13 years old.

Participation is easy – 1) create your team, 2) designate a Captain, 3) have the Captain register your team at the Gilda's Club NH website, and 4) agree to raise a designated minimum amount in donations for Gilda's Club New Hampshire.

The Dragon Boat Festival benefits Gilda's Club New Hampshire's goal of opening a Clubhouse for men, women, teens, and children impacted by cancer.




