Recycling ✓ Do's and ✗ Don'ts

The City of Laconia collects recycling from the curbside once every two weeks.

The City has a [Recycling Calendar](#) schedule on its website and paper copies are available at Public Works and City Hall. When residents and businesses place their recycling out for collection, they must use containers that are clearly labeled for recycling. Acceptable recycling containers include those that have:

- A City provided recycling “bumper sticker”;
- The triangular recycling logo;
- The word “Recycling” painted or stamped on the container; or
- “Laconia Recycles” stamped on the container.



If you use a recycling container for trash you will find that trash collectors may not empty your cans as they believe it contains recycling, and the recycling collectors will not empty the can as it contains trash. Please only use recycling containers for recycling!

Also, please do not place your recycling in plastic bags. All of the City's recycling products go to a central facility for sorting and the equipment that sorts the City's recycling cannot process flimsy plastic such as plastic bags. Plastic grocery bags can be recycled. Most grocery stores have containers near their entrance for their customers who want to recycle their grocery bags.

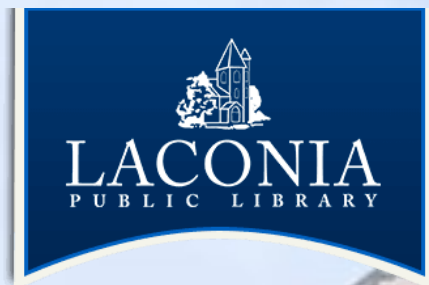

The Festival will be a day of Dragon Boat races, a flower ceremony for loved ones touched by cancer, and fun for anyone racing or watching!

Dragon Boating is easy to learn, extremely safe, and an activity where men and women compete side-by-side towards the same goal. Dragon boats are long, narrow (40 feet long) boats. The crew consists of 20 paddlers sitting two abreast, one steersperson at the rear, and one drummer who sits or stands at the head of the boat and beats out a paddling rhythm for the crew. Regardless of how young, old, big, or little: once a paddler is in stroke, they are contributing to their team! Add the outdoors, the water, the visual spectacle of dragon boating, and you get a perfect activity for friends and family!

Absolutely no experience is necessary to participate. We provide the boats, paddles, life jackets, a time to practice, and the racecourse! We recommend about 21-24 participants per team, with both men and women participating. The minimum age to paddle is 13 years old.

Participation is easy – 1) create your team, 2) designate a Captain, 3) have the Captain register your team at the Gilda's Club NH website, and 4) agree to raise a designated minimum amount in donations for Gilda's Club New Hampshire.

The Dragon Boat Festival benefits Gilda's Club New Hampshire's goal of opening a Clubhouse for men, women, teens, and children impacted by cancer.

The *Dinner Party* is one of Simon's last plays, and one in which he attempted to do something he hadn't done before - write a farce. But not

As guests arrive they see that the party will be an intimate affair as the table is set for only six guests. The production team also has extensive experience with both professional and community theatre credits throughout New Hampshire. Led by Powerhouse producers Bryan and Johanna Halperin, Gay Bean handles costumes, Jim Webber is the set designer, Chuck Fray provides sound effects and music, Lauren-Shelby Douglas assistant directs and handles props, and Tyler Soucy's team at TS Event Productions will build the set and provide light and sound designs. Katie Duncan serves as Stage Manager and as co-producer.

Says Bryan, "We've been waiting for so long to bring a show to the beautiful Colonial! *The Dinner Party* is a light and funny comedy perfect for dipping our toes back into the live performance arena and for testing out the new space before we dive into bigger productions this fall."

The production runs Friday and Saturday August 13 and 14 at 7:30 pm and Sunday August 15 at 2:00 pm. Social distancing will be in effect and masks will be required for patrons. The show runs one hour and 40 minutes with no intermission. Tickets can be purchased at www.coloniallaconia.com.

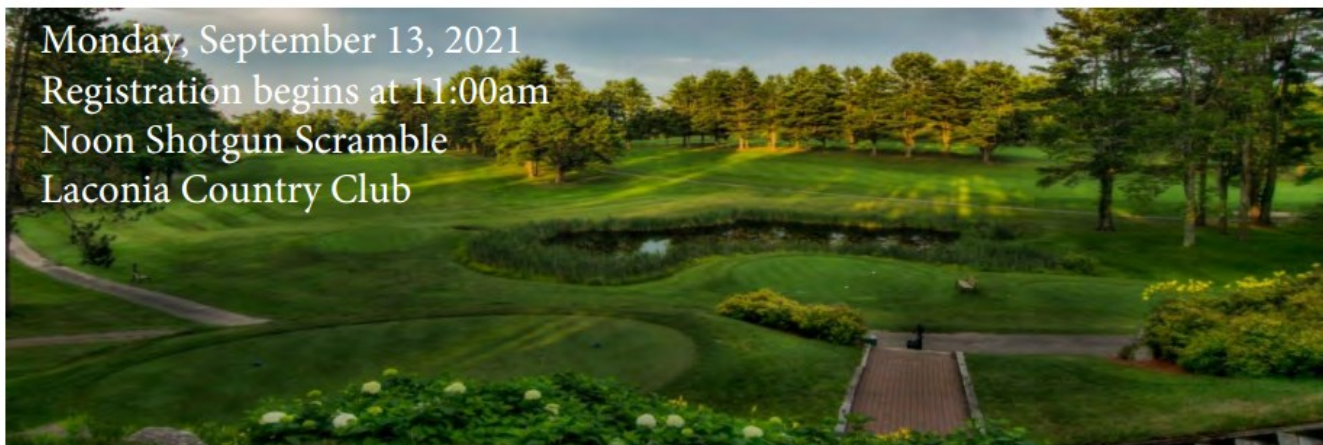
