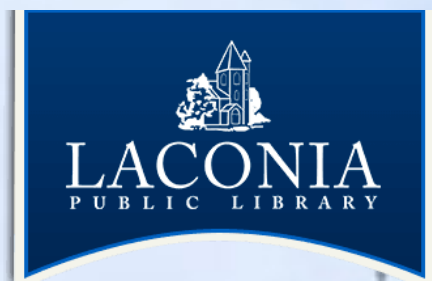

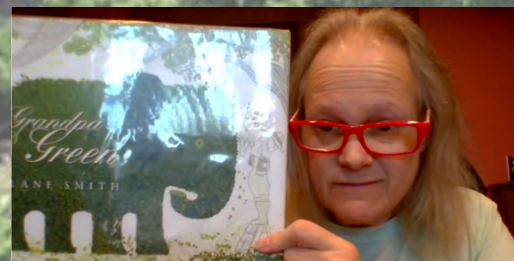

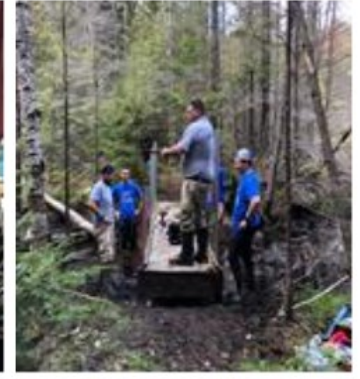

This testing is open to the public for observation in accordance with RSA 656:42.



CITY OF LACONIA Notice of Public Hearing

The City of Laconia will hold a public hearing on September 13, 2021, during the regular City Council meeting which will begin at 7:00 pm at City Hall, 45 Beacon Street East, in the Armand A. Bolduc City Council Chamber in order to receive public comment on whether the language printed below should be placed on the November Municipal Ballot relative to amending the City Charter:

Amending Article 1 by adding as Section 1:05, to read as follows:

"The six wards shall be constituted to have as equal population as is practicable. To achieve that goal, upon the issuance of the results of the 2020 census, and every 10 years thereafter upon receipt of the federal census results, the City Council shall promptly initiate review of the ward boundaries to determine if redistricting is necessary. Any necessary changes to the ward lines shall, as near as is practicable, ensure that the wards have equal population.

If the City Council determines that ward redistricting is necessary upon receipt of the federal census results, then the City Council shall promptly undertake and enact such redistricting of ward boundaries in the form of an ordinance, which shall be approved by a two-thirds majority vote of all elected members of the City Council after a duly advertised public hearing posted in two public places at least seven days in advance of such hearing.

Any changes so enacted shall thereafter appear as revisions to Charter Section 1:02."

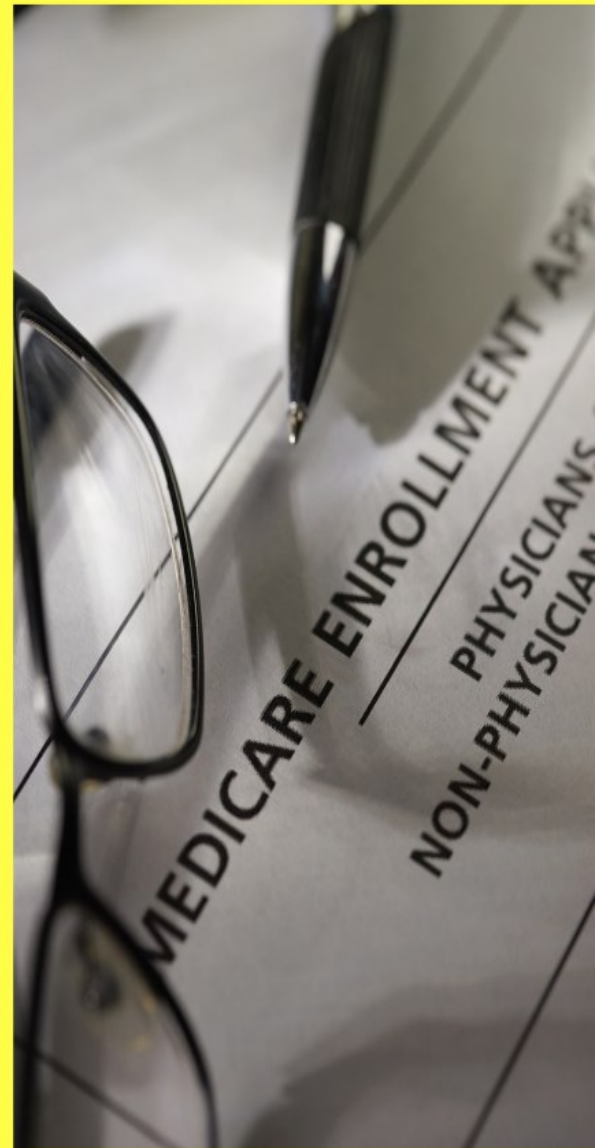

Report potential Medicare marketing violations and/or enrollment fraud, errors, or abuse if:

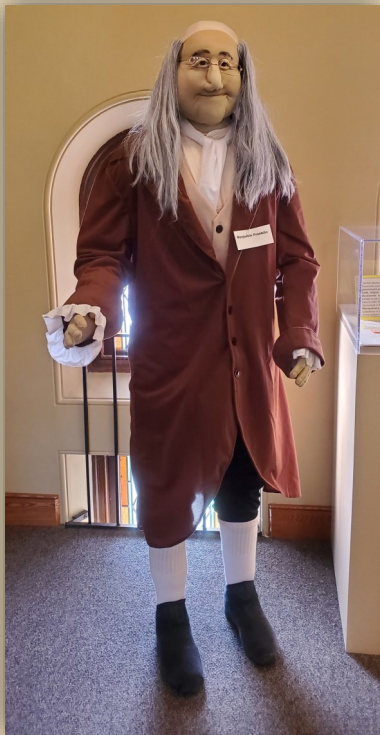
- You receive an unsolicited phone call from a company you have no prior relationship with
- A company represents itself as coming from or sent by Medicare, Social Security, or Medicaid
- You receive information such as leaflets, flyers, door hangers, etc., on your car or at your residence from a company you did not have an appointment with
- An agent returns uninvited to your residence after missing an appointment with them earlier
- You signed up for a plan after being told by a company that certain prescriptions or services were covered, but after reviewing your EOB, you found they were not covered by the plan and you received a bill instead

A new exhibit at the Laconia Public Library has opened in the upper floor gallery space and traces “The History of Public Libraries and Their Evolution and Importance in the United States.” Organized by the Laconia Historical and Museum Society at the request of the Library, the exhibit will remain on display through November 15.

With a nod to the importance of Benjamin Franklin, whose Junto Club in 1727 and Library Co. of Philadelphia in 1731 were the pioneer libraries in this country, the exhibit's “representation” of Franklin greets visitors, at the left, as they enter the gallery. Posters and display cases, clockwise around the room, present library facts, other early American libraries, the impact of Andrew Carnegie, library involvement in adult education and Americanization classes, films and discussion groups.

One library fact: “There are 17,000 libraries in the United States. That’s more than the number of McDonald’s.”

Banned books are noted and one display case features volumes from the Meredith Bridge Social Library of 1803. Another display focuses on the development of the Laconia Public Library since its founding in 1878.

The exhibit is free, open to the public and may be viewed during normal library hours.

THEN . . .

The Stephen S. Jewett House, 117 Church St., Laconia, was later home to Jewett's son, Theo. Both were lawyers. The father was instrumental in securing the city's charter in 1893. The son was a judge of the Police Court and a local historian of note. (Laconia Public Library)



. . . AND NOW

The property was considered but rejected as the site for a new Central Fire Station during the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s. The Jewett House was razed in 1973 and a brick office building was erected at 111 Church St. shortly thereafter. Metropolitan Life Insurance moved there in mid-October 1976. Other tenants over the years included the state Division of Welfare office, Drs. Spencer Brody, Lee Willett and Thomas Cullen, the Lakes Region Mental Health Center, Genesis Behavioral Health and the Genesis Counseling Group. After the Mental Health Center moved to 40 Beacon St. East, in January 2018, the building was eventually converted to residential housing in late 2020. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)

UNITARIAN UNIVERSALIST SOCIETY OF LACONIA

On Saturday, September 11th members of the Green Sanctuary Committee of the Unitarian Universalist Society of Laconia, in partnership with the Laconia-Gilford Lions Club, are collecting recyclable plastic from 11 AM until 1:30 PM in front of the little white church at 72 Pleasant Street.

We can all help this recycling activity now by starting to save soft plastics and not throw them into the trash.

We ARE collecting clean plastic bags and wrappers, plastic grocery bags, pet food bags, vegetable bags (potatoes, carrots, celery, rice, etc.), bubble-wrap, air packing bags, bread bags, wraps from around 6-pack cans of juice and dry-cleaning bags.

We ARE NOT collecting hard plastic or rigid containers.

Why is this important? Plastic bags that are not recycled end up in landfills or in the sea contaminating our drinking water and seafood with microplastics and dangerous chemicals. Plastics also are burned releasing toxins into our atmosphere.



Thanks to you, our greater Laconia community, in the past two events we have collected just shy of 700 (seven-hundred) lbs. of soft plastics which were sent to a manufacturer of composite decking and outdoor furniture in Maine to be repurposed. Every bit of plastic saved and collected helps protect all life and living on Earth.

Collection will follow COVID-Safe practices: Collectors will be wearing masks and socialy distanced. Drop offs need to be done by "mask wearers".

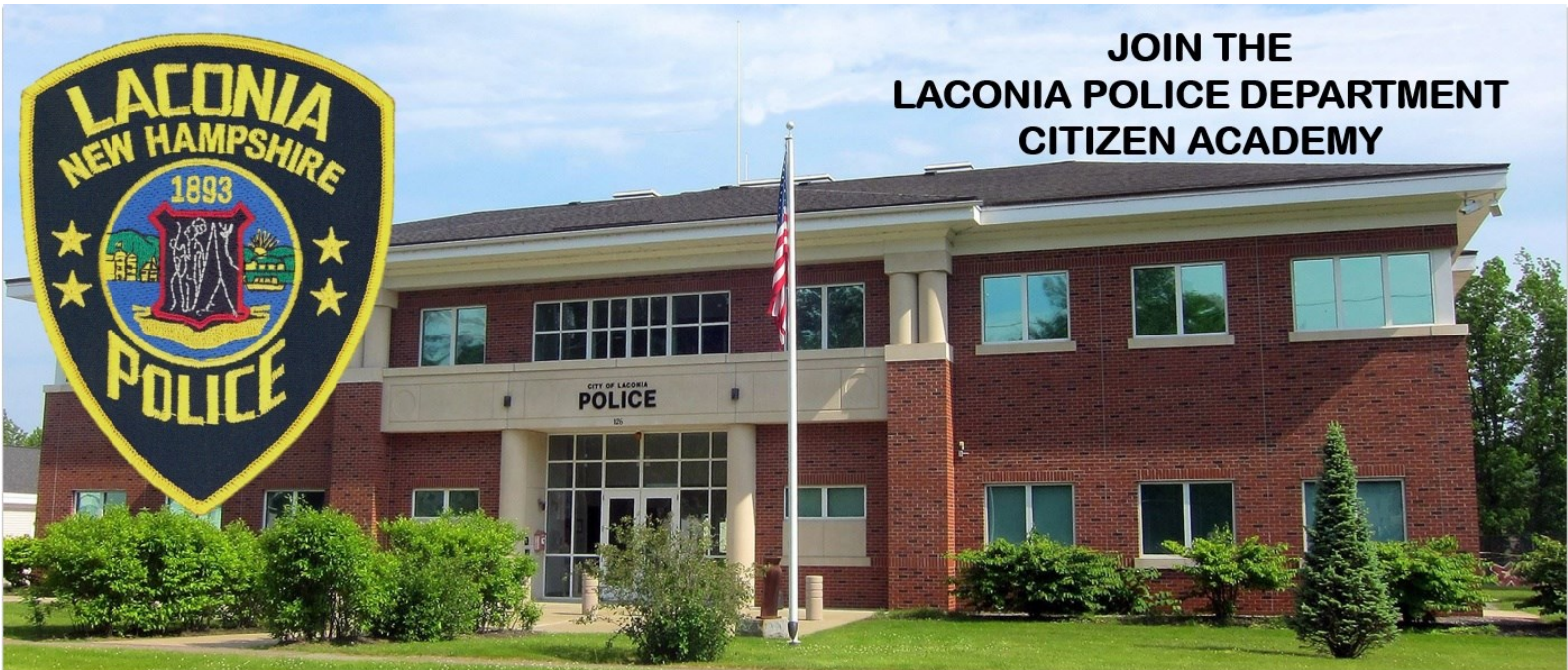

The purpose of the Academy is not to teach the public how to be police officers, but to teach them about what we do in our community.

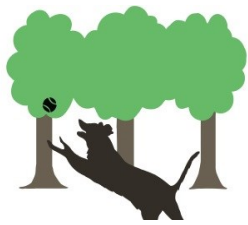
