

Transfer Station Info.....

A reminder to all property owners and property managers...

Recently there have been some issues with businesses and residents attempting to deliver material to the Transfer Station that the City does not or cannot accept. We hope the information below will help clarify what can be disposed of at this facility.

Fluorescent lights bulbs cannot be disposed of in the trash. Residents can turn in their fluorescent lights at the Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day each year, typically held in the summer months. The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) considers fluorescent lights from commercial property to include apartment complexes, if they are managed by the owner, as hazardous waste and all EPA hazardous waste disposal procedures must be followed.



Oil based paints and stains are hazardous waste and cannot be brought to the Transfer Station. Residents can turn in their oil based paints and stains at the Annual Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day. Oil based paints and stains from other sources must be disposed of in accordance with EPA regulations.


Construction and demolition debris that includes lead based paint is also not accepted at the Transfer Station. Contractors and/or DIYers need to coordinate with Waste Management or Casella to dispose of these materials at their landfill.





- You receive an unsolicited phone call from a company you have no prior relationship with
- A company represents itself as coming from or sent by Medicare, Social Security, or Medicaid
- You receive information such as leaflets, flyers, door hangers, etc., on your car or at your residence from a company you did not have an appointment with
- An agent returns uninvited to your residence after missing an appointment with them earlier
- You signed up for a plan after being told by a company that certain prescriptions or services were covered, but after reviewing your EOB, you found they were not covered by the plan and you received a bill instead



Laconia's Bulky Item Sticker Program

The City's Bulky Item Sticker Program is only available to those properties that are on the City's curbside collection route.

All bulky items left at the curb for pickup must be able to be lifted by two people.

BULKY ITEM COLLECTION

The City does not collect electronics or appliances that contain freon at the curb. All electronics and freon containing appliances must be brought to the Transfer Station for recycling. There is a fee charged to recycle electronics and freon containing appliances.

Metal items are only collected curbside on the first Wednesday of the month by appointment only. To schedule collection of a metal item you must make an appointment with Public Works by calling 603-528-6379 no later than the Monday before the first Wednesday of the month.

Other items, such as couches and chairs, will be collected on your normal day of trash collection. It is not necessary to make an appointment for pickup of these bulky items.

Bulky items for collection at the curb can only be placed at the curb after 7 pm the evening before the scheduled collection day.

Bulky item pickup stickers can be purchased at the City Clerk's office in City Hall (45 Beacon Street East) or at the Laconia Public Works Department (27 Bisson Avenue) at a cost of \$6 each. Each item left curbside for pickup requires a sticker.


Our yesterdays

THEN ...

For years, the Bridge Street Bridge, over the railroad tracks, gave access to Moulton Street from Union Avenue. Known as 'the island' to earlier residents, the Moulton Street area contained a number of dwellings as well as on Rowen Street, off-photo at far right. In the distance, across Lake Opechee, the large factory building is that of H.H. Wood, hosiery manufacturers and, later, 'Sweaterville.' (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The vehicular bridge was replaced in late 2003 by a steel footbridge after a new connection to Union Avenue had been made, at the west end of Moulton Street. Several houses at the north end of Moulton (and on Rowen) streets were razed in 1941 for erection of Building 80 (a World War II factory) of Scott & Williams (seen here at right) and others in 1966-1967 for Building 40 (built as S&W offices, seen here at left) which was later, for a time, home to the Winnipesaukee Expo Center, and still later the Conference Center at the Lake Opechee Inn and Spa.
