One item that our residents can help with is moving their portable basketball hoops that are on or near the roads and sidewalks so they will not be hit by plow trucks and tractors.

The hoops can damage the snow removal equipment, or the equipment can damage the hoops themselves. Please immediately move portable basketball hoops at least 5 feet back from the edge of roads or sidewalks as the weight of the snow coming off from the plows can knock portable basketball hoops over, damaging them and anything that may be in their path.

There's a Place for Everything: Even Your Trailers!

With the arrival of colder temperatures, people are needing to store their "toys" that require trailers.

The City's Zoning Enforcement office would like to remind people there are some rules about their trailers that are often forgotten from one season to the next.

Storage of Recreation Vehicles, which includes trailers, campers, boats, any other recreational vehicle, and storage box-type trailers (does not include motorcycles unless on a trailer) need to be stored in specific areas on your property. Places where these items may be stored are in a carport, enclosed building, or rear yard area and shall not be located within 10 feet of any lot line. (See the [City Zoning Ordinance § 235-41 \(L\) Storage of Recreational Vehicles](#).)

For those residents having properties located on the shore, the area between the road and your home is considered your front. We understand that you do not want to hinder or damage the view of the lake for anyone, but please remember trailers of any type and recreational vehicles are not allowed in the front yard or side yards.

There have been a number of complaints to the City about placement of trailers and recreational vehicles. Please be considerate of your neighbors and the public, and responsibly store trailers and recreational vehicles where they should be located.

With the winter holidays upon us, it is important we all remember to keep fire safety in mind. The holiday season is busy and can be very chaotic. Unfortunately, this hectic time can lead to forgetting some simple fire safety tips....

Christmas Tree Safety:

Choose a fresh tree whose needles are not easily falling off
Before putting the tree up, cut at least 2 inches off the trunk
Keep tree at least 3 feet away from all sources of heat
Add water daily
Do not allow tree to block exits
Do not use lights that are old, worn, or broken
Do not decorate tree with lit candles
Turn off Christmas tree lights before going to bed
Remove your Christmas tree right after Christmas or when it becomes dry

Holiday Decorating:

Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant
Keep candles away from anything that can burn
Do not use nails to hang strands of lights
Blow out lit candles before leaving the room or going to bed

Holiday Entertaining:

Keep children and pets away from lit candles
Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop
Tell guests about your fire evacuation plan
Test smoke detectors
Discard smoking material and fireplace ashes properly
Do not use candles if oxygen is used in the home

Please take the time to practice these fire safety tips, so everyone has a safe and enjoyable time this season.




Letters to Santa!

PROPERTY TAX BILLS WERE MAILED 11/23/21!

Property tax bills were mailed on Tuesday, November 23, 2021.

They are due on December 23, 2021.

Please note that there are many options for payment of your property taxes! It is not necessary to drop your property tax payment off in person. As shown on your tax bill, you can mail in your tax payment (or drop it off in the drop box slot on the Belknap Mill side of City Hall) and we will send you a stamped receipt. Please include a portion of your bill with your payment to ensure proper credit when paying by mail or dropping it off in the drop box. The drop box is checked every morning and you will be given credit on the morning your payment is retrieved.

You can also pay your bill online, or by calling (855) 906-0411. Convenience fees are added to all credit card and telephone payments.

Payments will continue to be accepted at the counter in City Hall during normal business hours which are Monday – Friday, 8:30 am - 4:30 pm.

THEN ...

Laconia's Central Fire Station from 1902-1971 is seen, just beyond excavation for new building (for Melnick's Shoe Store and the Miss Lynch Shop) at corner of Water and Pleasant streets. Ceremonial demolition of the Fire Station began, Dec. 8, 1971, with John O'Shea and Sam Melnick wielding sledgehammers and was completed by the end of the month. Part of the new O'Shea's Department Store is glimpsed at extreme left. (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

Melnick's half (off-p[oto at left) of the new building is now Bootlegger's, while Rent-A-Center and MC Cycle occupy the former Miss Lynch Shop. The new building extends out into the former Bank Square considerably further than had the old Moulton Opera House Block, home to O'Shea's since 1887. Today's Beacon Street West runs, right to left, just beyond the old Fire Station site — which is now part of the parking lot behind the 1970 structure. Former Allen-Rogers Corp. buildings are seen in distance. (Adam Drapcho/The Laconia Daily Sun)





LACONIA WATER DEPARTMENT METER MAINTENANCE PROGRAM



Meters are changed periodically to comply with the Public Utilities Commission's Rules and Regulations, the American Water Works

Association and in accordance with the Laconia Water Works' Tariff.

The Water Department has an annual program that replaces meters and **there is no cost to the property owner**. Our goal is to change out 600 meters over the winter months.

The Water Department will contact those property owners whose water meters are to be changed. We are in the process of sending letters and making phone calls to schedule appointments. This process takes approximately 20-30 minutes. For your convenience Saturday morning appointments may be available.




