Rights for someone (or an organization) to cross another person's property

This is a complicated topic as there are many different ways for someone or an organization to have a right to cross another's property.

This article will focus on two of the most common situations in the City.

Crossing over another's property:

A right for another person to cross your property is most commonly created by a private right of way, a right to pass and repass, or an easement. All three versions are fairly common in the City. Most of the time the right to cross another's property is in your or their deed.

Some common situations found in the City are:

- A property that is "landlocked" by other properties such that they do not have access to a public street will have some form of a right to cross a property to get to the public street.
- Two properties that share a driveway, enabling the property owners to get to garages behind the houses.
- A private road that enables property owners to gain access to their property.

Utility Easements:

Utility easements give a utility company the right for a utility, such as an electric line, to go through a person's land. The easement could be for any utility or just a specific utility.

Some common situations found in the City are:

- Utility easements for Eversource's regional electrical distribution system.
- Water, sewer and drainage easements with the City
- Water, sewer and drainage easements to enable a property owner to install underground utilities to the City's system or to a lake or stream in the case of a drainage system.

If you have a question about a City utility easement please call Public Works at (603) 528-6379. If you have questions on someone's right to cross over your property, you should talk with your attorney.

Winter Hints from the Department of Public Works

How to “clean up” your property after a snowstorm:

As a reminder to property owners:

- To protect vehicle occupants and pedestrians, please do not blow or shovel snow onto the street or sidewalk. Also, please do not plow snow from a driveway across the street or pile snow from the driveway onto the sidewalk or adjacent to the road. These practices create untreated areas on the road and sidewalk which could cause an accident.
- Please do not pile snow near the intersections of roads as this may block a driver’s view of oncoming traffic.

The City has an Ordinance prohibiting these practices and residents or property owners could be fined.

Best practice for clearing snow and preparing for the next storm:

- When you are clearing your driveway of snow, throw or blow your snow in the direction vehicles travel (or “downstream”) as this will keep the snow that you have just removed from your driveway from being plowed back into it. Remove the snow along the street “upstream” of your driveway and create a pocket in the wind row so that some of the snow on the snow plow can fall off from the plow in the pocket and not in your driveway.

For the first time, the Belknap County Conservation District (BCCD) is offering its annual Tree, Shrub, Flower and Trout Sale Fundraiser both on-line and by mail. Visit the [BCCD website](#) to see the 2022 selection and purchase on-line. Offered are plants to grow your own fresh fruits and vegetables such as blueberry bushes, fruit trees, strawberry plants, raspberry canes, asparagus, onions, and many others that bear fruit enjoyed by wildlife and people alike. We didn't leave out those that prefer shade trees, Christmas evergreens, flowers, or plants that provide interesting landscaping. Most of the plants are sold 'bareroot' (no soil) and in a dormant state, and others will be in pots.

BCCD recommends customers place their orders by February 25th; however, orders will be accepted after the deadline while supplies last. Laconia Residents!

Please help the City of Laconia keep the streets and sidewalks safe and passable during the winter!

The City normally does not cancel trash and recycling collection services unless the forecast is for blizzard conditions, but it can happen. If it does become necessary, the City will announce cancellation of those services due to weather.

During other winter storms when collections are not cancelled due to a storm, please do not place your trash or recycling containers on the sidewalk or at the curb. Your containers may be inadvertently damaged, knocked over by the plows or the snow coming off from the plows, or frozen and stuck in the snowbank and unable to be emptied (as was the case with several trash containers during the recent storm).

During storms Casella, the City's collection contractor, will empty containers that are left in areas behind sidewalks. Please consider putting them in your driveway. Thank you!

Getting Back to Basics Virtual Quilting Workshop


