*Beach season will be here before we know it!*



Winter is ending and Spring is upon us! The City's roads are experiencing that annual transition when the road becomes soft, potholes are plentiful and the roads heave due to the freeze thaw cycle.

The surface frost in the dirt roads is now melting during the day, however frost remains deeper in the road. This prevents water from seeping into the ground, making the road surface muddy.

Dirt roads that were solid when you left in the morning will be soft and slippery when you return. Drive carefully! As the frost continues to leave, dirt road ruts will form and the roads will become muddier as the dirt absorbs more water. Keeping your wheels out of the ruts will help ensure that you are safe. Public Works monitors dirt roads and adds gravel to the worst spots to ensure the roads remain passable.

The freeze thaw cycle during this time of year generates potholes daily. Most potholes are located on old roads that have cracks or joints in them from road or utility work. If you are on a road with these conditions and you see standing water, it is likely that there is a pothole in the water. If it is safe to do so, adjust your position in the lane to avoid the pothole. Public Works has crews out daily filling potholes, but during this period they can appear faster than we can fill them.

Heaves are caused when the water content in soil under the road increases and the soil expands as it is frozen, lifting the road surface. You will also find this condition on older roads that have cracks in the road. When driving on these roads slow down and exercise caution. Public Works posts frost heave signs on roads when the crews find them or when they are reported. There may be areas and times when roads or sections of roads do not have signs posted. As the ground thaws, these heaves will settle.

As we move from winter further into spring the challenges associated with muddy roads, potholes and frost heaves will lessen.

# Our yesterdays

## THEN . . .

**This is a 1920s view of Main Street, Laconia, with the Avery Block, just south of the bridge over the Winnepesaukee River. Fire, 100 years ago today (March 12, 1922) caused \$70,000 worth of damage to the structure, including to the dry goods store of Dinsmore & Parent (at right), Joseph Spero's dry goods and clothing store and to the M.J. Carroll Barber Shop on the ground floor as well as to the tenements on the upper floors. Across the river at left, the Folsom Opera House Block ('Lower Bank') is glimpsed. ## . . . AND NOW

**The Avery Block was repaired and was later known as the Camaan Block and, still later, as the Normandin Block. It was torn down during Urban Renewal and the site is now part of Stewart Park. The Municipal Parking Garage now occupies the site of the Folsom Opera House and several other buildings north of the river. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)**

## Think Twice Before Buying Easter Chicks

With Easter coming soon, you'll be seeing ads for Easter chicks. Aww...aren't they cute? However, the City considers chickens, even the cute little chicks, to be livestock and NOT pets. In most areas of the City, livestock including chickens are not allowed to be kept on the property.

Chickens, ducks, guinea hens, pigs, goats, and other agricultural animals are not permitted in most districts in the urban/suburban districts in Laconia. Agriculture and agricultural animals are permitted in the RR1 (Residential Rural), RR2 (Residential Rural Corridor) and AI (Airport Industrial) districts. In the CR (Commercial Resort) district, agriculture and the animals typically associated with agriculture are only allowed by Special Exception granted by the Zoning Board of Adjustment. If you're not sure what zoning district you live in, check your tax card on the City [website](http://www.robbiemills.org) or call the Planning office at (603) 524-1264 to find out.

A good idea is to keep your chick purchases to the pink marshmallow kind!
