





350 Years of New Hampshire Wildlife



Lake drawdowns are typically conducted each fall to reduce winter ice damage to shoreline properties and to reduce spring flooding. Drawdowns also give property owners an opportunity to conduct any necessary repairs to their waterfront property, provided they first secure a permit from the DES Wetlands Bureau at (603) 271-2147.

Generally, lake levels are allowed to return to the normal full pond level in the spring. However, the drawdowns of Lakes Opechee and Winnisquam, which occur on a two-year interval, last only approximately two weeks. This year, the lowering of Lake Opechee will begin on October 10, and it will likely take two days to pass the water from Lake Opechee downstream through Lake Winnisquam. Therefore, the level of Lake

Winnisquam is not expected to drop noticeably until October 15. On October 24 flows at Lakeport Dam will be increased to refill Lake Opechee, and the level of Lake Winnisquam should begin to rise late in the day on October 25.

Not included in this schedule is Lake Winnipesaukee. Unlike the other lakes in this schedule, Lake Winnipesaukee is not purposely drawn down in the fall. Instead, in the fall after Columbus Day, the releases from Lakeport Dam are reduced from a normal minimum of 250 cubic feet per second (cfs) to a flow between 30 and 50 cfs for a period of up to two weeks to allow for maintenance of the dams and hydropower facilities on the Winnipesaukee River. The flow of 30 to 50 cfs is the minimum flow needed to maintain the downstream aquatic life during this period. This year the reduction will be begun on October 10.

By the middle of the fall, Lake Winnipesaukee is, on average, 15 inches below its springtime full level due to evaporation and releases from the lake that have occurred over the course of the summer. Because of this summer's drought, the level of the lake is already 12 inches below its full level. When the amount of water released from the dam is reduced after Columbus Day, the lake level is not expected to drop significantly for the remainder of the month of October and, if drought conditions ease in the fall and winter, it is expected to remain relatively stable through the month of December absent any major rainfall events. Depending on the amount of snow on the ground in the winter, the lake level may be lowered further beginning in January to a depth of two feet below the normal full level.

A plot of the average lake levels throughout the year for Lake Winnipesaukee is provided on NHDES' [website](#). Also included are updated plots of this year's lake levels, releases from the dam, and precipitation.

The NH Fish and Game Department recommends that, if special drawdowns are to be conducted for the purposes of repairing property such as retaining walls or private boat ramps, they occur only once in every five years. If shoreland property owners wish to have a special drawdown conducted on their lake, please contact the NHDES Dam Bureau immediately after receiving all permits required for such work, so that the drawdown can be coordinated with any other work proposed on the same water body. In this way, the number of special drawdowns can be limited.

THEN ...

Bank Square, Laconia, is seen in the early 1900s, looking north up Main Street, with the Eagle Hotel at left and the Unitarian Church towering over the scene at right, next to the City Savings and Laconia National Bank Building. (The commercial postcard took liberties with the color of the wooden church — which was painted white.) Beyond the church is the Perley Block and the trees obscure the Dr. Harriman House beyond that. (Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



... AND NOW

The Eagle Hotel was torn down in 1937 to build a new F.W. Woolworth store (today home to a number of different tenants). The Perley Block was razed in 1950 to make way for a Landau store (later J.J. Newberry, Bloom's Variety and now the Laconia Antique Center). The church burned in 1938 and was replaced by a First National grocery store — now a Citizens Bank branch. The buildings between the City Savings-Laconia National bank building and Mill Street, at right, were torn down in 1957 to make way for expansions of the banks, completed in 1957 and 1959 and today occupied by the Lakes Region Mental Health Center.
