### **Property owners:**

To protect vehicle occupants and pedestrians please do not blow or shovel snow onto the street or sidewalk. Also, do not plow snow from a driveway across the street or pile snow from the driveway onto the sidewalk or adjacent to the road. These practices create untreated areas on the road and sidewalk which could cause an accident. Also, please do not pile snow near the intersections of roads as this may block a driver's view of oncoming traffic.

Best practice for clearing snow and preparing for the next storm: When you are clearing your driveway of snow, throw or blow your snow in the direction plow trucks travel (or "downstream") as this will keep the snow that you have just removed from your driveway from being plowed back into it. Remove the snow along the street "upstream" of your driveway by creating a pocket in the snow bank so that some of the snow on a snow plow can fall off the plow in the pocket and not in your driveway. 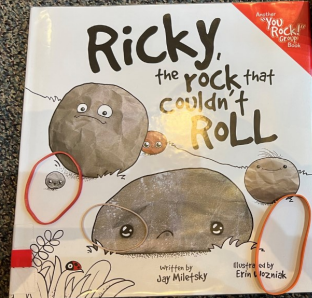

Your July 2022 tax bills reflect half of the 2021 tax rate of \$9.43. Tax bills are calculated as follows: The July installment is  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the previous year's rate total, multiplied by your previous year's assessed value. The December installment is the new rate (which is determined by the NH Department of Revenue), multiplied by your updated assessed value to get your total tax for the year. We then minus out the July installment and you pay the difference. The Assessing Office has until the December billing to finalize your assessments for the tax year.

Please note there is a fee of 2.79 % for all credit/debit card transactions and a \$0.95 fee for all ACH transactions online.

## Winter Information from the Department of Public Works

### DID YOU KNOW?

...That drivers cannot park their vehicles overnight in the City's downtown parking lots? Cars and trucks that park overnight interfere with Public Works' ability to clear snow from these parking lots.

Instead, please park in the parking garage overnight. The Police Department announces through Twitter whenever Public Works will be plowing or removing snow from these parking lots, and owners of vehicles parking in the City lots may be fined or have their vehicles towed at their expense to ensure that these parking lots can be plowed.

And did you know that it is unsafe to plow a driveway's snow across a street and leave it there? Traffic passing by your driveway during the plowing could have an accident as a result of hitting the plow truck or hitting the snow windrow left by the plow.

Also, please be aware that pushing or blowing snow onto a City sidewalk could prevent the City from clearing the sidewalk if the snow pile is too large for the sidewalk plows to clear. Please ensure that you or your plow contractor do not push driveway snow across a public street or blow snow into the sidewalk. This will help Public Works clear the streets and sidewalks after a storm to keep our community safe.

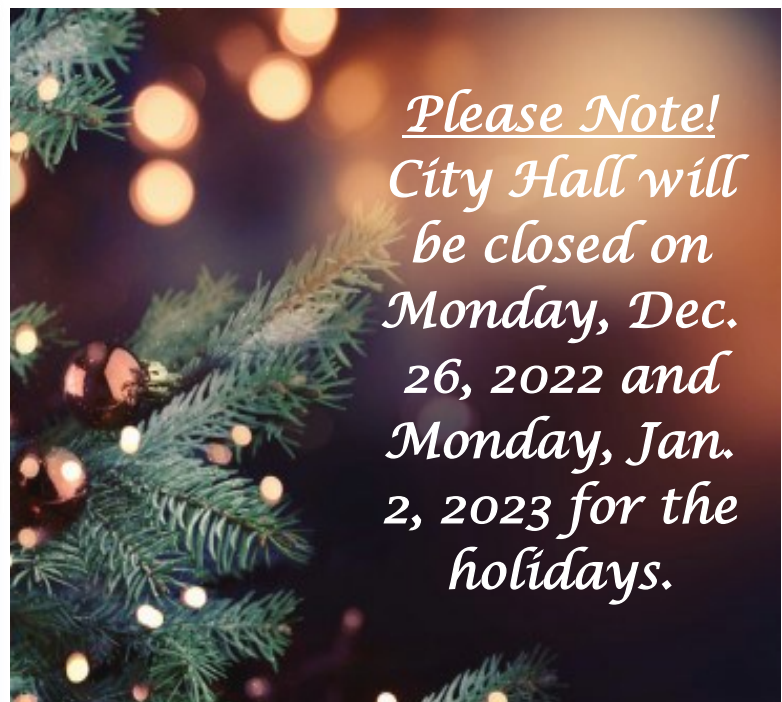

# When Seconds Count...



**We need your help!**

If you're able, please shovel out the fire hydrants close to your home or business. In a fire seconds count! Remember to clear a 3 foot perimeter round the hydrant, especially towards the street. Clear a wide enough perimeter around the hydrant for firefighters to work.

A common question that is asked is why do I need to clear the hydrant, won't the fire department clear the hydrant? The answer is yes, they will as soon as they can. However the fire department still has to respond to emergency calls. The City of Laconia has over 600 hydrants to clear and we could really use your help!

# Sand is available!



Laconia residents needing sand for their driveways or walkways during icy weather can get sand from our Department of Public Works.

There is a sand pile for residential use located at our DPW garage at 257 Messer Street.

Residents can get a maximum of two five-gallon pails (or the equivalent). Please do not take sand from our facility on Bisson Avenue; it is for City use only to maintain our streets and sidewalks.

# Our yesterdays

## THEN ...

The Community Christmas Tree is seen in Bank Square, Laconia, around 1967, just before the city's Urban Renewal Program of the late 1960s-early 1970s. The Moulton Opera House Block (O'Shea's Department Store) is at left and the McIntyre Block, at right. Woolworth's was still in operation, off-photo at right, but would eventually close, Dec. 31, 1970. Traffic on both Main and Pleasant streets was still two-way at the time of the photo. ## ... AND NOW

With Urban Renewal, Bank Square was reduced in size, so that the building today containing Bootlegger's, Rent-A-Center and MC Cycle (at left) now extends almost to the traffic island in the earlier photo. The Moulton Opera House Block was demolished in mid-April 1970 and the replacement Stelaur Corp. building completed in time for Melnick's Shoe Store (just off-photo, at left) to hold a grand opening, Aug. 19, 1970. The Woolworth Building became the Sundial Shop, then Benjamin's, and is now home to several tenants including 'The Studio.' (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)

## Laconia Water Department

### Prevention Is Better Than Reaction



***Temperatures have been moderately warm for this time of the year but do not let this warm spell fool you and make you believe that pipes are not capable of freezing. Temperatures are falling below freezing at nights which would allow for the pipes to freeze. As always be cautious and double check that all the pipes are properly protected.***

If the temperature inside a house gets below 32 degree Fahrenheit (0 degree Celsius) it's likely that the water supply pipes and the drain traps will freeze. When water freezes it expands 9 percent, and if there is no room for expansion it's possible that the pipe will develop a crack and eventually leak once the ice thaws out. Fixing a ruptured pipe can be expensive, but the damage from uncontrolled water leakage can easily reach into the thousands of dollars.



The majority of the calls received for frozen water pipes and water meters are a result of inadequate heating and cold air drafts where piping is located in the home. It is recommended that property owners check their property for these conditions and identify the location of their water meter and shutoff valve before an emergency.

The property owner is ultimately responsible for repairs to the piping within the home or building. The Water Department can replace frozen or damaged meters.

Customers will be charged for the cost of the replacement of the meter and service calls, as applicable. Your plumber can also replace a frozen meter.

If for any reason you cannot stop the flow of water from a frozen or broken pipe, call the Water Department's 24-hour emergency number at 603-524-0907.
