Automated Curbside Solid Waste Collection is Coming May 1, 2023!

After the conversion to automated collection, the City's solid waste collection contractor will continue to collect bulky items at the curb if you place a bulky item sticker on the oversized item.

Bulky item pickup stickers are \$8 each and may be purchased at the Laconia City Clerk's office, or at the Department of Public Works. The types of bulky items the City will collect at the curb **does not change**.

However, when and how the items will be collected changes effective May 1st in conjunction with the conversion to automated collection.



BULKY ITEM COLLECTION

Bulky metal items will still be collected on the first Wednesday of the month by appointment only.

Bulky items such as furniture and mattress will no longer be collected on your scheduled curbside collection day. These items **will only be collected** on the 2nd and 3rd Wednesdays of the month and an **appointment is required**.

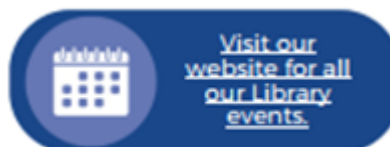

Materials accepted are as follows:

- Clean wood (not painted, stained or pressure treated)
- Branches of trees (no larger than 3" in diameter/3' in length)

Leaves are not accepted at the
Brush Dump.

Residents who want to use this facility
must have a Laconia dump sticker or day
pass. Dump stickers and day passes are
available at the City Clerk's Office, City
Hall, 45 Beacon St. East in Laconia from
8:30-4:30, Monday-Friday.

Free Dump Day for Laconia residents is scheduled for Saturday, May 13th from 7:00 am to 1:00 pm

(Please note that businesses cannot dispose of their solid waste for free on that day.) Public Works highly recommends businesses do not come to the Transfer Station on May 13th as it will be very busy.

Residents needing assistance with unloading will need to bring help with them. We expect a large turnout for this popular event, so be prepared to be patient as there is likely to be a longer wait time than normal.

To help minimize wait times, the City recommends that residents use the following schedule when coming to the Transfer Station on May 13th.

<u>Time</u>	<u>First letter of last name</u>
7 to 9 am	A through and including G
9 to 11 am	H through and including N
11 am to 1 pm	O through and including Z

Public Works will turn away any resident who arrives later than 1 pm, so please be sure to be at the Transfer Station before that time.

Residents who do not have dump stickers must have some form of documentation that shows they are a Laconia resident.

Items we will accept are appliances, water heaters, furniture, beds, plumbing fixtures, bagged leaves, demolition lumber, auto tires (limit 6 tires per customer). Items we will not accept are auto tail pipes, mufflers, radiators, engines, batteries or hazardous waste, paints or solvents.

Residents must still pay for disposing of electronics during free dump day.

Disposal of leaves and recycling for Laconia residents is free all year. Residents do not need a dump sticker or day pass to dispose of leaves or recycling, but must have documentation that shows they are a Laconia resident.

THEN ...

E.L. Cram's Block, 83-85 Gold St., Lakeport, was 'nearly burned to the ground,' March 27, 1898 — 125 years ago this week, and with it his stock of groceries, hardware and other general merchandise. 'Before the fire could be checked, it broke out in the next building, owned and occupied by William G. Cram, a dealer in grains, hay, etc., 'which caused considerable damage and probably the stock is a total loss.' (Laconia Public Library)



... AND NOW

Both buildings were rebuilt after the fire. For several decades after 1902, the E.L. Cram Building was home to the McDuff Machine Co., manufacturers of marine engines and other items. The two Cram buildings were demolished in February 2004 to make way for a boat storage facility, erected later that year, by Lakeport Landing Marina. From Fore Street in foreground, Gold Street runs left to right. House at left is said to be the first built on this side of the river, around 1800. (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)

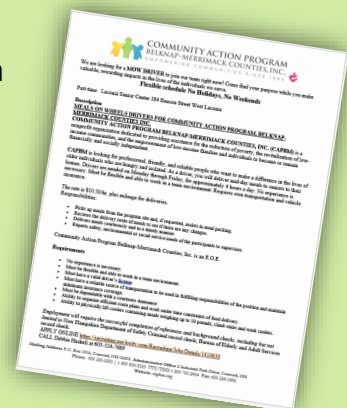

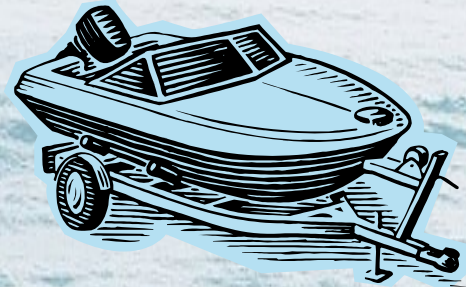

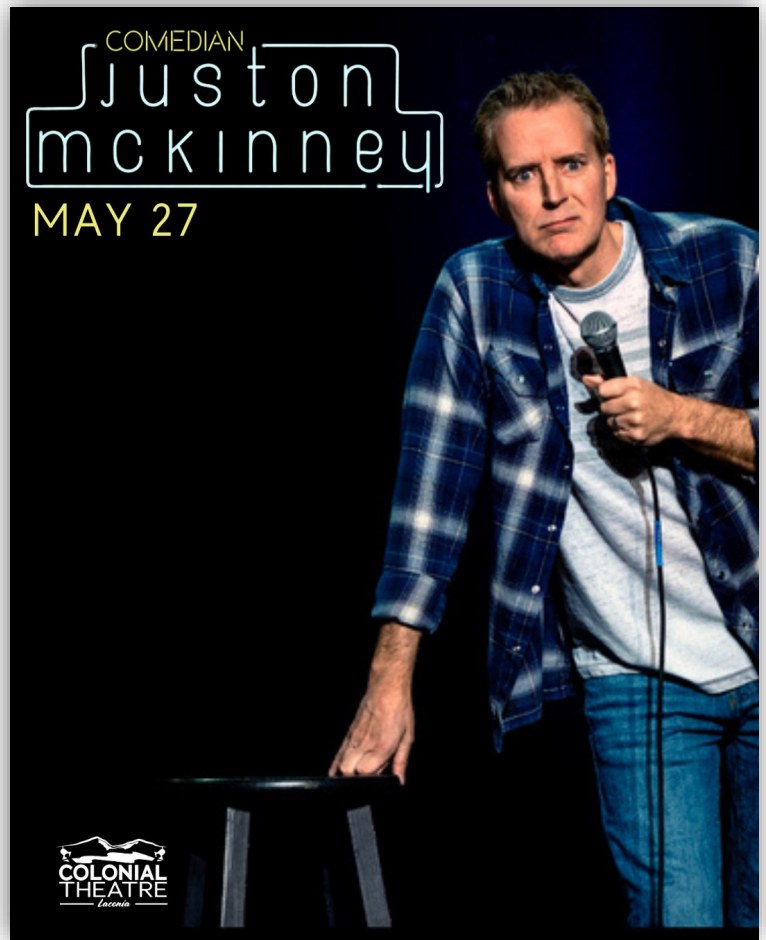

CITY OF LACONIA - NOTICE: SEASONAL 10 TON WEIGHT LIMIT

Effective at 6:00 am on Monday, March 13, 2023, trucks whose gross weight exceeds 10 tons are prohibited from using all streets in the City except for State roads, the City's arterial routes and routes to industrial parks. A map of posted City streets can be found [here](#).

Trucks over 10 tons may still use roads with seasonal weight limits when issued a permit by the City's Department of Public Works. Permits are granted in two types of situations as shown below:

Blanket authorizations for:

- Contractors providing City services such as solid waste and recycling collection
- Private emergency services such as cleaning sanitary sewer lines
- Heating fuel companies such as heating oil and propane

Blanket authorizations cannot be used for any other use except that authorized on the permit.

One-Time permits are typically used for deliveries and collections such as:

- Building supplies, construction equipment, household goods, furniture
- Roll-off solid waste containers
- Automobiles to dealerships

FULL-SCALE TRAINING EXERCISE COMMUNITY NOTIFICATION

The Laconia Police Department will be conducting a full-scale active shooter training exercise in conjunction with NH Homeland Security and Emergency Management on **Saturday, APRIL 15, 2023**. The training exercise will be located at the **PLEASANT STREET ELEMENTARY SCHOOL** located at 350 Pleasant Street and will run from 7:00 am through 2:00 pm.

Multiple law enforcement partners will be participating as well as members of the Laconia Fire Department EMS. Residents and visitors may see a significant increase in police presence during this time.

Northbound traffic on Pleasant will be detoured at the intersection of Oak Street. Southbound traffic on Pleasant will be re-routed at the intersection of Audrey Lane. Folsom Street will be closed at the intersection with Pleasant Street. Tremont Street will be closed at the intersection of North Main Street. Dartmouth Street will be closed at Tremont Street.

Electronic sign boards and traffic barricades will be used to clearly define this temporary traffic pattern.

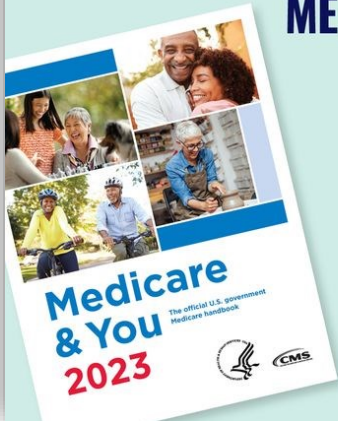

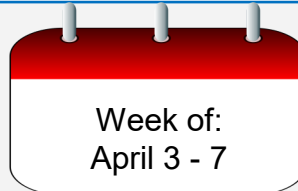
