
## Curbside Container Placement Guide

HELP US TO PROVIDE YOU WITH THE BEST POSSIBLE SERVICE



This guide illustrates the proper and improper placement of your curbside containers and offers tips to help with curbside collection of materials.


### CARDBOARD HANDLING



Please breakdown all cardboard so it fits into the container with the lid closed. Cut oversized material into 2' x 2' squares.

### CONTAINER DO'S

- Keep containers on a hard, level surface clear of snow and other landscaping debris and no more than 6' from the edge of the curb.
- Please allow containers a 3' perimeter of clearance from obstructions such as parked cars, trees, mailboxes and utility poles. There must also be a 15' overhead clearance from any low hanging tree branches or power lines, etc.
- If you have more than one container placed at the curb, please set them side by side as indicated in the illustration with at least 3' of clearance between the containers. Do not block the sidewalk.
- Bulky items can still be collected at the curb with a Bulky Item Pickup Sticker. Stickers can be purchased for \$8 ea. at the City Clerk's office or Public Works. Bulky metal items are collected on the 1st Wednesday of the month by appointment only. Bulky items such as furniture, etc. will only be collected on the 2nd and 3rd Wednesdays of the month and an appointment is required. Please call Public Works at 603-528-6379 for an appointment.



### CONTAINER DON'TS



Containers must remain upright for pickup



Keep all materials inside The container



Do not place containers back to back



Keep container clear of all obstructions

## Medicare Coverage of Mental Health and Addiction Treatment

**What is mental health care?**



Mental health care refers to services and programs intended to help diagnose and treat mental health and illnesses. A mental illness or mental health condition affects your thinking, feeling, or mood. Some examples include depression, anxiety, and schizophrenia. Some also consider addiction, like opioid use disorder and alcoholism, to be mental health conditions. Mental health conditions are typically not the result of any single event or circumstance. Rather, they are complicated conditions involving multiple factors. More than 50% of people will be diagnosed with a mental health condition at some point in their life.

## Mark your calendar!

Free Dump Day for Laconia residents is scheduled for Saturday, May 13th from 7:00 am to 1:00 pm

(Please note that businesses cannot dispose of their solid waste for free on that day.) Public Works highly recommends businesses do not come to the Transfer Station on May 13th as it will be very busy.

Residents needing assistance with unloading will need to bring help with them. We expect a large turnout for this popular event, so be prepared to be patient as there is likely to be a longer wait time than normal.

To help minimize wait times, the City recommends that residents use the following schedule when coming to the Transfer Station on May 13th.

<u>Time</u>	<u>First letter of last name</u>
7 to 9 am	A through and including G
9 to 11 am	H through and including N
11 am to 1 pm	O through and including Z

Public Works will turn away any resident who arrives later than 1 pm, so please be sure to be at the Transfer Station before that time.

Residents who do not have dump stickers must have some form of documentation that shows they are a Laconia resident.

Items we will accept are appliances, water heaters, furniture, beds, plumbing fixtures, bagged leaves, demolition lumber, auto tires (limit 6 tires per customer). Items we will not accept are auto tail pipes, mufflers, radiators, engines, batteries or hazardous waste, paints or solvents.

**Residents must still pay for disposing of electronics during free dump day.**

Disposal of leaves and recycling for Laconia residents is free all year. Residents do not need a dump sticker or day pass to dispose of leaves or recycling, but must have documentation that shows they are a Laconia resident.



# Our yesterdays

*Our sincere thanks to Warren D. Huse, the Laconia Historical and Museum Society, and the Laconia Daily Sun for providing a glimpse into our community's past.....*

## THEN ...

First Methodist Church, at the corner of Union Avenue and Baldwin Street, is seen just before Urban Renewal in the late 1960s. Built in 1838 as a Unitarian-Universalist church, the structure was sold to the Methodists after the Unitarians relocated to Bank Square in 1868. Earlier, the edifice had resembled a 'traditional white New England church' with a square belfry surmounted by a slender steeple. Beginning April 8, 1922, a rebuilding program transformed the structure into an 'Old English Parish Church style of pressed brick and stucco with cast stone finish.' First service in the renovated building was held, Dec. 3, 1922, and the services of dedication were held between May 11-20, 1923 — beginning 100 years ago this week. House at right was that of Dr. Wells, an early physician here, later home to the Snierson Family and, in the years prior to Urban Renewal, to the Cormier Furniture Co. Further right, off-photo, were the Dearborn Diner and Harold T. 'Pappy' Whittum's Mobil gas station. (Wyatt Collection, Laconia Historical and Museum Society)



## ... AND NOW

The church was razed, Jan. 19, 1968, and construction of Sunrise Towers continued between groundbreaking, May 21, 1968, and May 18, 1970, when tenants started moving in — some 53 years ago, this month. Former Melcher & Prescott Insurance Building (now an annex to Sunrise Towers called Sunrise House), on South Main Street, is glimpsed at lower right corner (Jon Decker/The Laconia Daily Sun)
